BSc admission

Agenda:

- The interview: before, during, and after
- Preparing yourself: body language, dress code, what to bring
- Dealing with tough questions

Before you go, 4 things to know:

- **Know yourself**: Examine your application from your interviewer's point of view. What might need clarification?
- Know the BSc programme: Show that you understand what is needed to succeed in SSE Riga's BSc in Business and Economics.
- Know SSE Riga: Find out as much as you can – including courses, student life (Peak Time, Debate society, JeJoe etc.), projects (BICEPS etc.), faculty.
- Know the details: Time, date, location, documents to take with you.

The day has come...

Their questions:

- Can you become a good student of SSE Riga? (Skills, qualifications, knowledge, experience)
- Will you do make a good student of SSE Riga? (Motivation, enthusiasm, dedication, drive)
- Will you fit in? (teamwork, tension, personality) Your questions:
- Ask questions that will further your understanding of how you can do all of the above. Show you are thinking, curious, genuinely interested.

After the Interview

- Evaluate your performance. Are you satisfied? Consider areas of improvement.
- Send a thank you letter for their time. Send a separate letter to each person you met with. Include any additional information on a point you discussed to make letter personal. Check details – spelling of names and titles (*** I hope to find out who is going to conduct interviews in Kyiv=).
- Follow up in a timely manner, as agreed in the interview.

Preparation

- Body language
- Clothing

What to bring and what to leave behind

What language is your body speaking?

- 'Open' vs. 'Closed'
- What are you afraid of? (nervous gestures)
- I am not your best friend, and this is not your living room. Don't be too relaxed!
- How is your handshake? And look me in the eyes, please.

Interview Fashion 101

Do:

- Wear a suit
- Polish your shoes
- Check your hair
- Arrive with groomed fingernails
- Lean towards conservative
- Turn off your phone

Don't:

- Have anything in your mouth
- Wear heavy fragrance
- Carry more than one small professional bag
- Wear overly loud colors or jewelry

Fashion 101: Part II

Ladies:

- Avoid excessively feminine dress. (heels, stockings, accessories)
- Wear a suit (can be a dress/skirt – but wear a jacket)

Gentlemen:

- Arrive in a clean and pressed suit and tie
- Pay careful attention to details (buttons, stains, wrinkles)

Bring/Leave at home:

- Anything not related to the interview
- Leave your phone, or TURN IT OFF
- All documents required (originals)

Dealing with tough questionsGeneral strategies

Advice for specific questions

What to do if you make a mistake

General Strategies:

- Take a quiet, deep breath
- Recognize that handling stress is part of proving yourself
- Restate the question
- Ask if you can come back to the question after you have had a moment to think

- Remember that a good, thoughtful answer – not a fast answer – is the goal.
- If you feel you haven't understand the question (possibly due to the language issue), ask to repeat it (e.g. I am sorry, would you be so kind as to repeat your question ?
 I am not sure I got the main idea.)

Some questions they asked me last year...

- Why Business and Economics?
- Why do you want to go abroad for studies rather than stay in Ukraine?
- Your interests?
- Do you think your parents could pay for your studies or you only consider the possibility to get the

- Can you provide an example of your great achievement so far?
- Do you have any questions to us?
- How would your friends describe you?

The Tough Question – Money!

- Be prepared for the question about tuition fee!!! – Do you think your parents can afford it (6000 EUR)?
- Connect your answer to the Swedish government grant

- Don't say "I'd like to study at SSE Riga – just because Sweds gonna pay for me"
- Rather..." I greatly appreciate the opportunity to compete for a full scholarship offered by the Swedish government"

Did you make a mistake?

- If it was obvious (calling someone by the wrong name, going to the wrong room for the interview) acknowledge it, apologize briefly, and move on. Don't let it frazzle you!
- If you said something you shouldn't have, ask for the opportunity to clarify.
- Remember that the "interviewer" may not notice your discomfort - important to remain calm and professional about your mistake.
