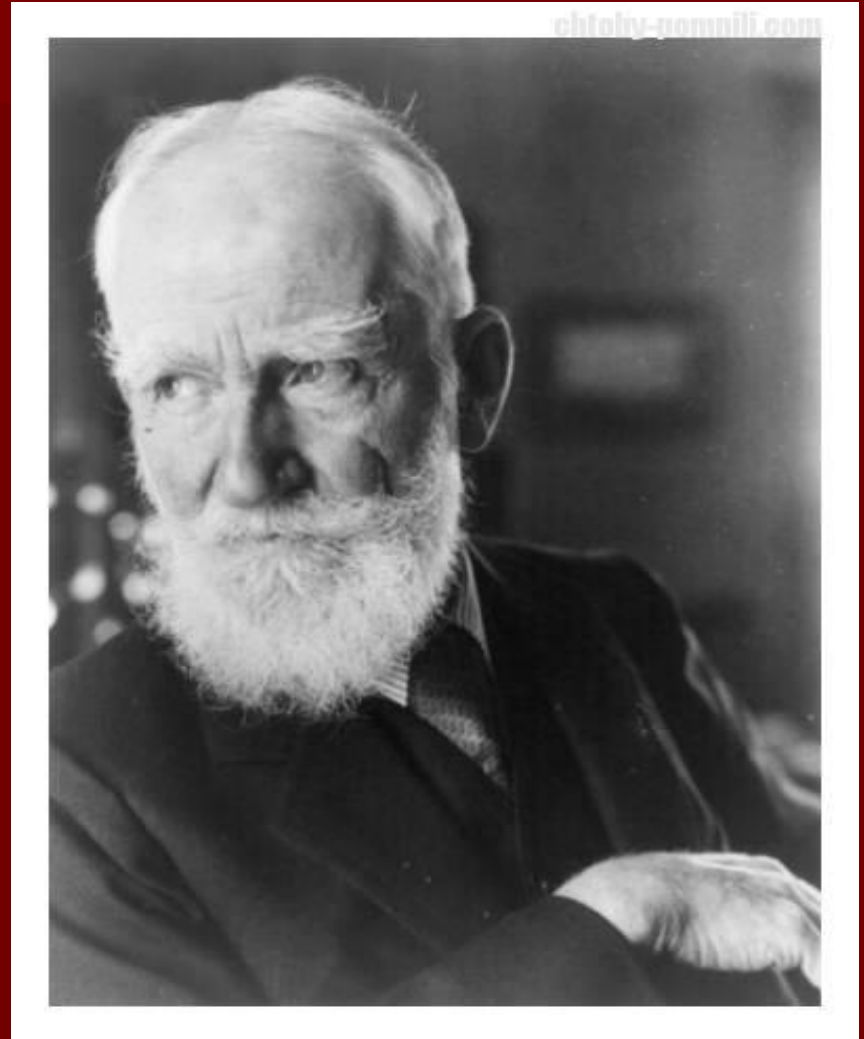


Irish famous writers



George Bernard Shaw

- Was born in Dublin, Ireland in 26 July 1856
- In 1871 he graduated from the school in Dublin.
- He served as a clerk. In 1876 he moved to London, where he took up journalism and literature.
- In 1925 he received the Nobel Prize.
- In 1931 visited the USSR
- Died in 2 November 1950 Ayot St Lawrence, Hertfordshire, England

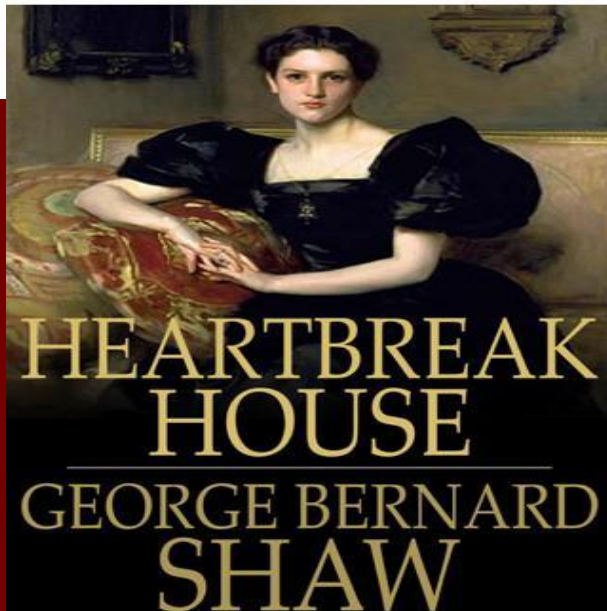

(1919)

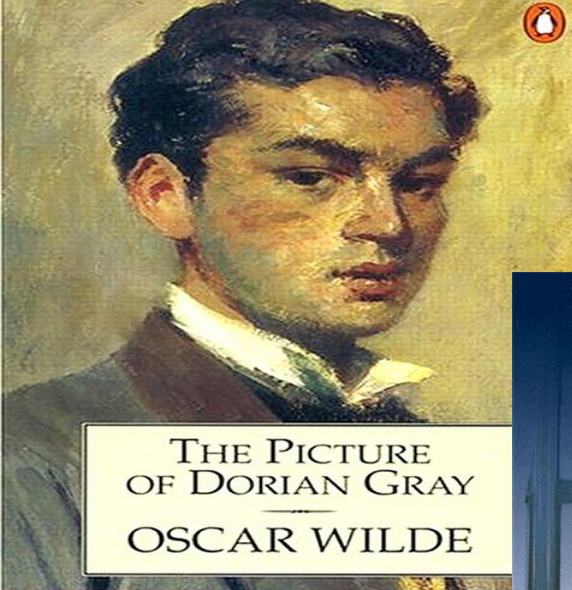

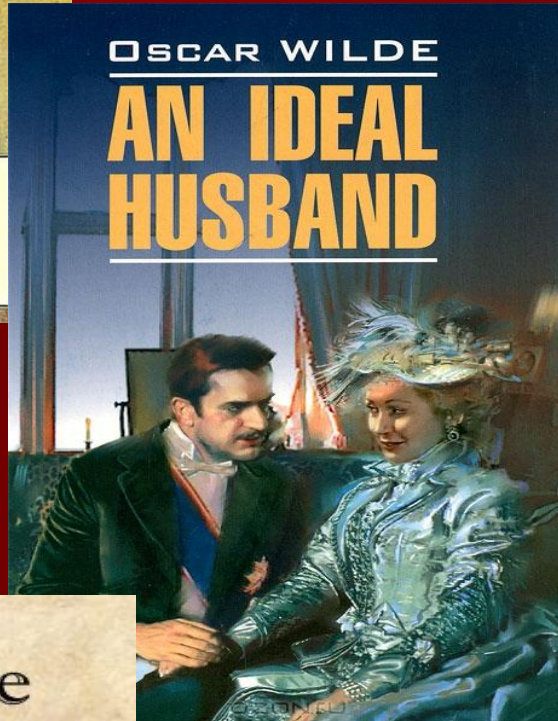
Oscar Fingal O'Flahertie Wills Wilde



- Was born in 16 October 1854 in Dublin, Ireland
- He graduated from the University of Oxford (1879)
- Collection "Poems", released in the 1881. It was a success.
- In 1882 toured in US with lecturing
- Was in prison for 2 years on charges of immorality (1895-1897). After he settled in Paris.
- Died 30 November 1900 in Paris, France

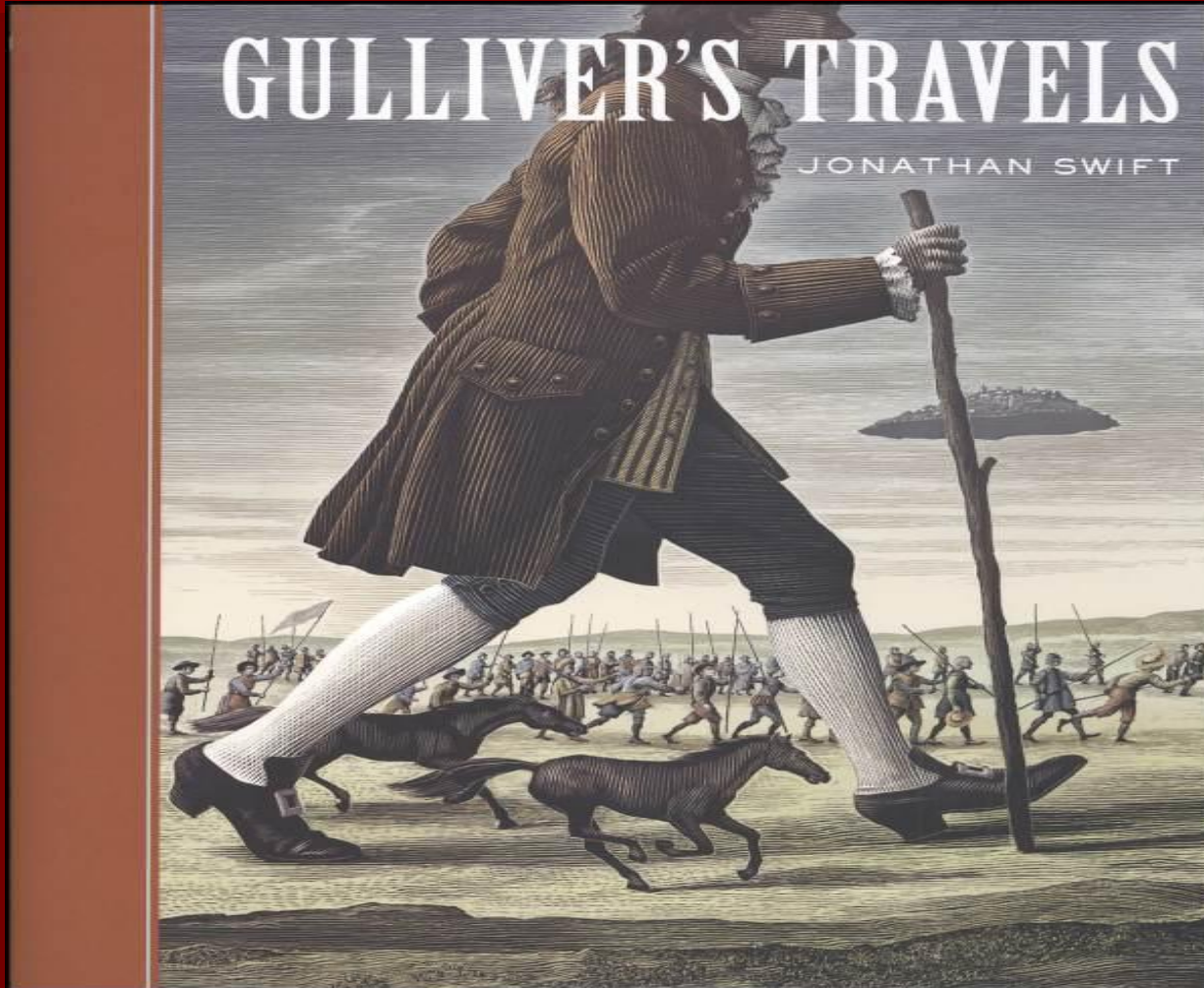


Jonathan Swift

- Was born in 30 November 1667
Dublin, Ireland
- Swift was the best available in
Ireland at that time in school
education -first County Kilkenny,
then Trinity College Dublin, where
he was awarded the degree of
Bachelor of Arts in 1686
- By the end of that year, Swift
became secretary to Sir William
Temple
- In 1710 the Tories came to power,
and Swift joined their camp
- Died in 19 October 1745 Dublin,
Ireland

Bram Stoker

- Was born in 8 November 1847 Clontarf Dublin, Ireland
- 7 years was ill a lot
- In 1874 wrote the first novel "The Crystal Cup"
- Died in London on April 20, 1912, are considered by progressive paralysis.
