To happen or move just in, landing or only there once.

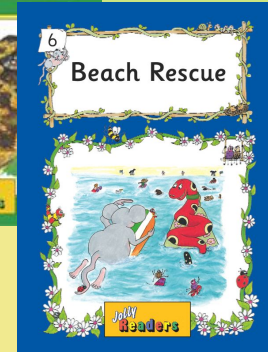
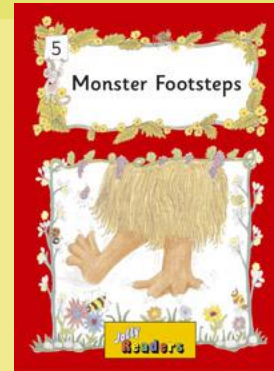
