Embedded questions are questions within another statement or question. They function as noun clauses and as such should generally follow statement, not question, order.



Wh- questions may be embedded within a statement.

I don't know what time

I've forgotten where
I don't/can't remember what
I am not sure why
main statement embedded WH-Question
(SUBJECT + VERB)



Wh- questions may be embedded within a statement.

Where is the classroom?

I don't know where the classroom is.

What did you say?
I didn't hear what you said.

What is the definition?
I can't remember what the definition is.



- WH-Questions with BE (is, are, was, were)
- Asking for information:
 - •Where is the bank?
 - Do you know where the bank is? (embedded question)
 - I don't know where the bank is.



Continue:

- •What is he doing?
- •Do you know what he's doing?

I don't know what he's doing.

- •Why were they crying?
- •Do you know why they were crying?

I don't know why they were crying.



Continue:

- •Where is the bank?
- •I don't know where the bank is.
- •What is he doing?
- •I don't know what he's doing.
- •When can he visit us?
- •I don't know when he can visit us.



WH-Questions with DO/DOES/DID

Where does he live?
Do you know where he lives?
I don't know where he lives.

How often do they come here?

Do you know how often they come here?

I don't know how often they come here.



Continue:

How did she break her leg?
Do you know how she broke her leg?
I don't know how she broke her leg.

I don't know whether

I've forgotten if

I don't/can't remember

Main statement embedded question
