

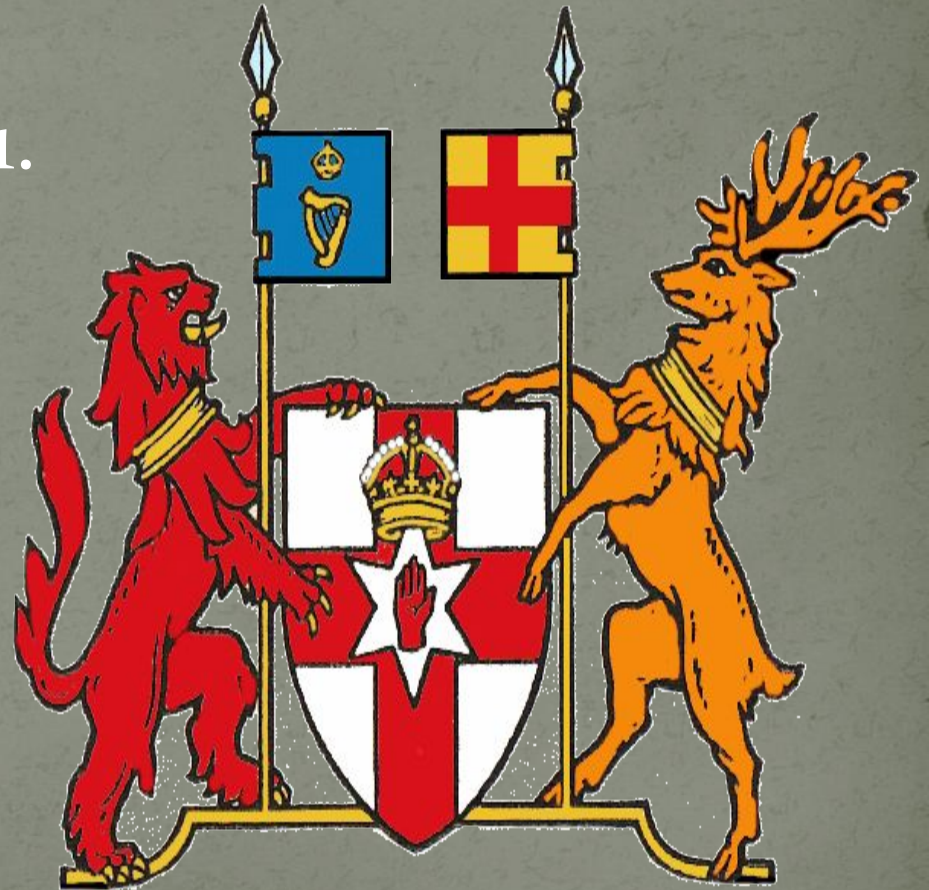
# Nothern Ireland

Oh, music...



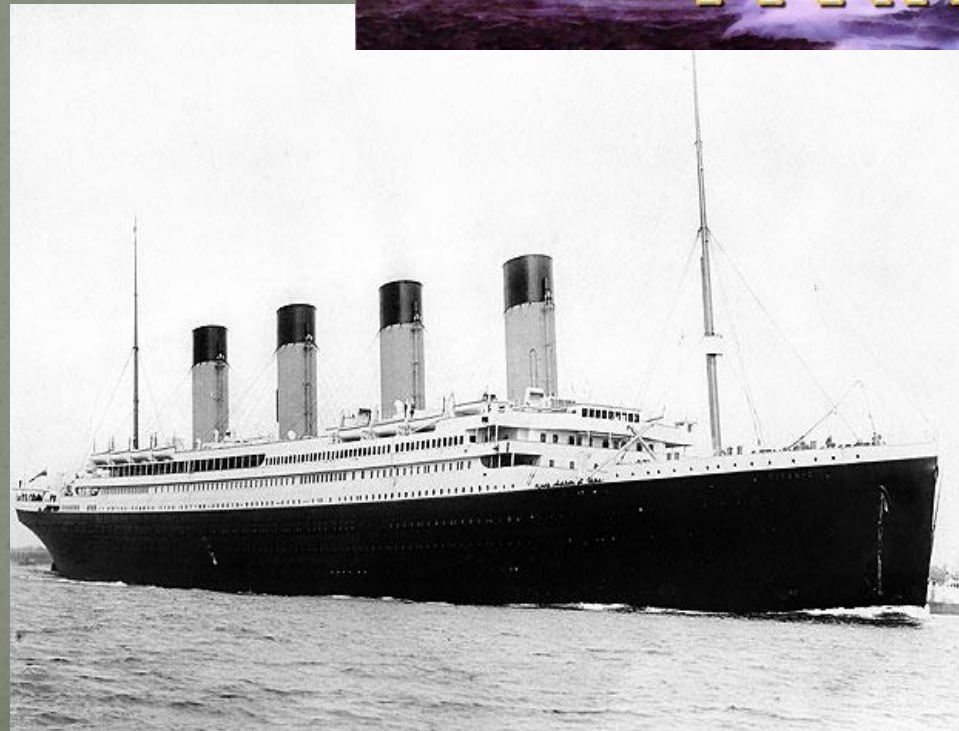
All national holidays are still accompanied by bagpipes.
