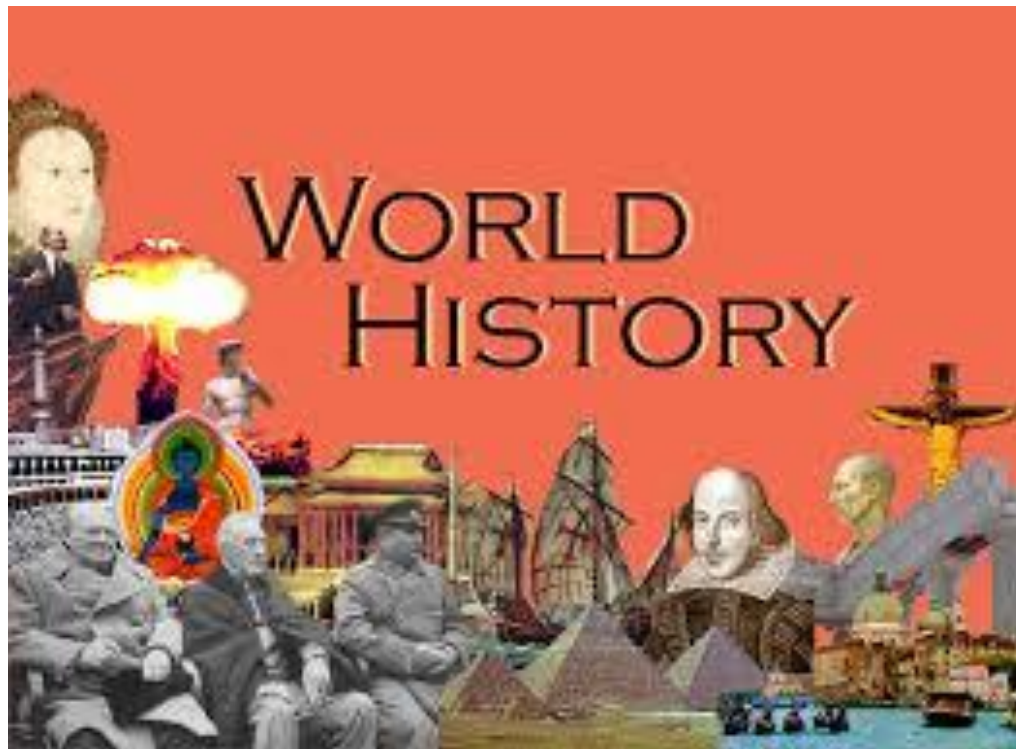
Aim: To know more about Philosophy of History.

To justify actions in the present.



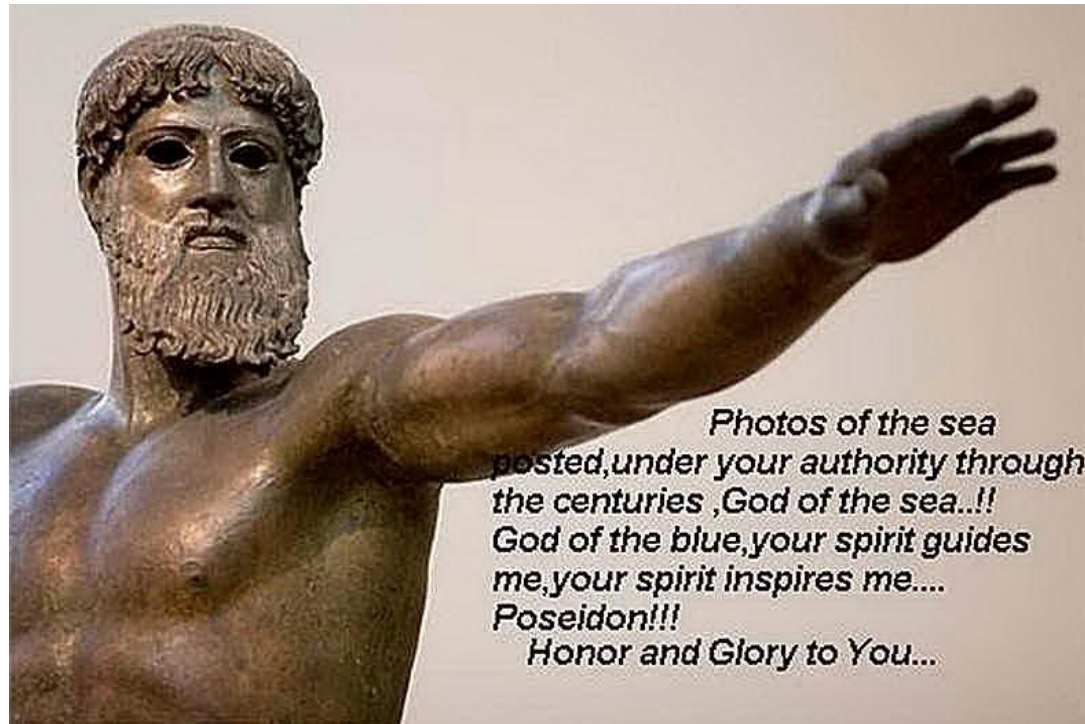
What is the Philosophy of History?

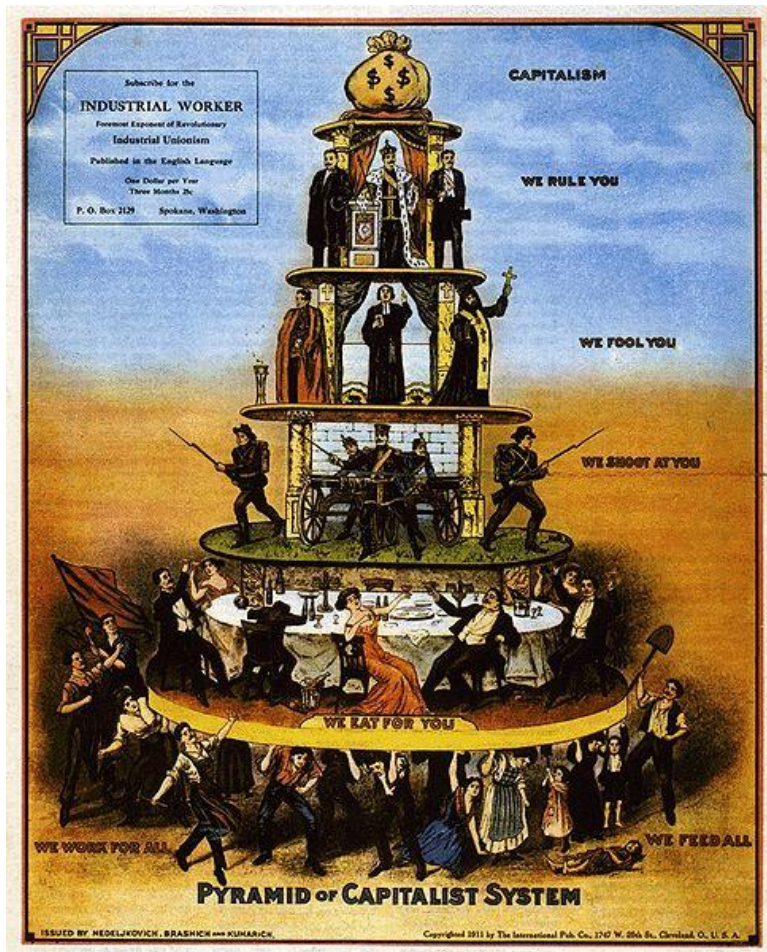
Historical Realism

Historical Anti-representationalism



- The constructs of historians understood as fictions

Linear Theories

- Hegel have proposed that history proceeds in a line—hence linear—and so is directional, or "going somewhere".



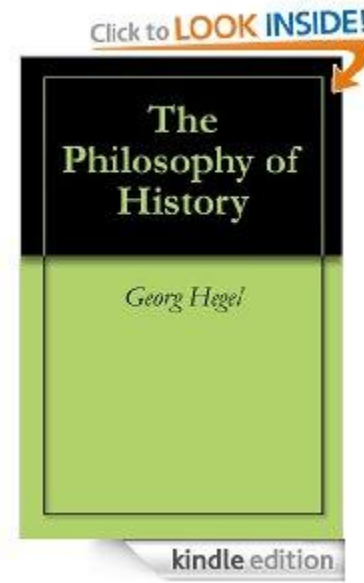
Cyclical Theories



- All civilisations showed a similar pattern of growth, dominance and decay
