THE SCIENCE OF NATURAL DISASTERS

Choose a natural disaster and explain in your own words how it works. You can choose from this list: how volcanoes work, how tornadoes work, how earthquakes happen, why bees are dying out.

How do you this? Follow these steps!

1. **Work in pairs**
2. **Choose a topic**
3. **Search for information**
4. **Identify, select, adapt, and summarize information in your own words. DO NOT COPY PASTE!!!!**
5. **Make the presentation persuasive, attractive and interesting to the audience.**
6. **Explain and justify your point of view.**

How do you this? Follow these steps!

- 7. Draft, edit for mistakes, proofread your presentation.**
- 8. Share the responsibilities.**
- 9. Introduce key vocabulary before the presentation.**
- 10. Rehearse your presentation. Check for timing, voice, pronunciation, and capturing the class' attention.**

How do you this? Follow these steps

11. Give the final presentation of 7-8 min. long (not longer!)
12. Ask and respond with appropriate syntax and vocabulary to 3 open-ended higher-order thinking questions.
13. Evaluate and comment on presentations of others.
