NOTIONAL PARTS OF SPEECH

Meaning	+ (lexical meaning)
Form	+ word-building models OPEN CLASS + paradigms (variable) optional combinability
Function	+ S, P, O, Attr, Adv m

FUNCTIONAL PARTS OF SPEECH

Meaning

+/- peculiar lexical meaning,
if any

Form

- no word-building models
CLOSED CLASS
- no paradigms (invariable)

VERB

Meaning

action/ state

**which can be represented
as a process**

Run, walk, live, stand

VERB

Form **-ize, -en, -ify**

Dramatize, fasten, gratify

dis-, mis-

Dislike, misunderstand

VERB

Form

Extensive paradigm;

a lot of categories:

mood, tense, aspect, perfect,

voice, person, number

*Do, did, have done, be done,
does, be doing*

VERB

Function

V+Adv: *She is beautiful.*

N+V: *Students study.*

V+N: *I am a student*

Predicate:

Birds fly.

The baby is crying.

ADJECTIVE

Meaning

Property of a thing

*blue sky, a gold ring, a
clever man, a nice house,
a logical argument*

ADJECTIVE

Form

-able, -ful, etc.

readable, beautiful

category of comparison

big – bigger – the biggest

ADJECTIVE

Function

AV: *An interesting book.*

vA: *He is famous.*

Attr.: *A funny story.*

Predicative: *The puppy is
funny.*

ADVERB

Meaning

Property of action

She sings amazingly.

or of property

An amazingly beautiful girl.

ADVERB

Form

-ly

*nicely, beautifully, strictly,
brightly*

category of comparison

(limited)

easily-more easily-most easily

ADVERB

Function

V + Adv: *She sings amazingly.*

Adv + Adj: *A amazingly beautiful girl.*

Adverbial modifier

She sings amazingly.

NUMERAL

Meaning

calculation

number *one, two, three,
four, five.....*

order

*the first, the second, the
third, the fourth, the fifth*

NUMERALS

Form

-th (order)

CLOSED CLASS

the fourth, the fifth

no categories

no paradigm

Substitutes

of nouns or adjectives

One of them was clever.

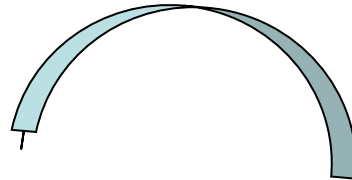

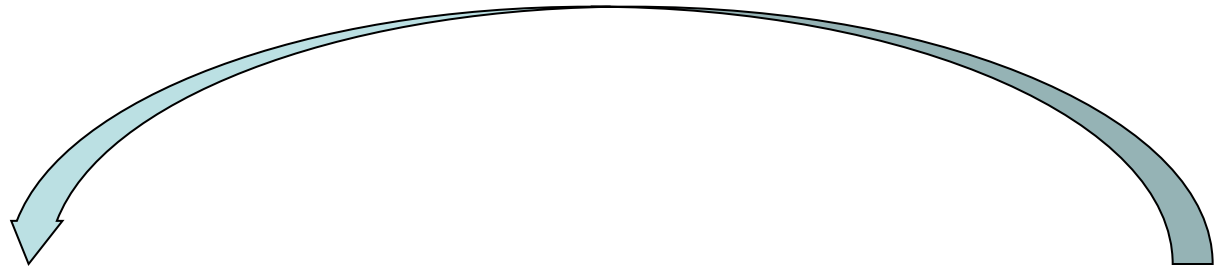
Pronouns
