## Fiction and Nonfiction



## FICTION

$\checkmark$ A made up story
$\checkmark$ Can tell about things that could happen
$\checkmark$ Is read for fun
$\checkmark$ Characters may be like real people or imaginary

## NONFICTION

$\checkmark$ Has facts that can be checked and proven
$\checkmark$ The author is an expert on this information
$\checkmark$ Is read to gain information on a subject
$\checkmark$ It is TRUE

## Fiction Genres

## Now let's play... NAME THAT GENRE!

## GENRE \#1

Stories that are passed down from one group to another in history. This genre includes folktales, legends, fables, fairy tales, tall tales, and myths from different cultures.

## GENRE \#2

A story including elements that are impossible such as talking animals or magical powers. "Make-believe" is what this genre is all about.

## GENRE \#3

A type of fantasy that uses science and technology, such as robots, time machines, etc.

## GENRE \#4

A story using made-up characters and events that could happen in real life.

## GENRE \#5

A fictional story that takes place in a particular time period in the past. Often the setting is real, but the characters are made up from the author's imagination.

## GENRE \#6

A suspenseful story about a puzzling event that is not solved until the end of the story.

## GENRE \#T

Texts that provide facts about a variety of topics, such as sports, animals, science, history, careers, travel, geography, space, weather, etc.

## GENRE \#8

The story of a real person's life written by another person.

## GENRE \#9

The story of a real person's life that is written by that person.

## GENRE \#10

This genre includes verse written to create a response of thought and feeling from the reader. It often uses rhythm and rhyme to help convey its meaning.
