Obsolete words – those which have completely gone out of use at least for a century

Archaisms – words which are partly or fully out of circulation

Historisms – words denoting objects and phenomena which no longer exist

Terminology – the sum total of terms for a specific branch of science, technology, etc., forming a special layer in the word-stock of the language.

Term – a word or a word-combination which is created or borrowed to express the definite concepts specific for a particular science.
