



- John doesn't drink alcohol.




# General question(Yes/No)

- O No, I didn't.


# Special question (Wh)



- O What is your name?
- My name is Kate.

- - Where did you buy this beautiful dress?
- O I bought it Gloria Jeans.

## Alternative question



- O Do you prefer to eat apples or melons?
- I prefer to eat melons.

- Is he 17 or 18?
- He is 18.

#### Disjunctive question (Tag) Subject Subject Auxiliary Predicate -Yes/No,→ Subject Auxiliary

- o You're pianist, aren't you?
- - Yes, I'm.

- You don't like animals, do you?
- O No, Hove them!
