### 1. Structure

We use the **Past Simple** to talk about actions that happened at a specific time in the past. The actions can be short or long. There can be a few actions happening one ofter another.

Basic form
Subject + Verb (past form)



### 1.1.Positive sentences

The structure for **positive** sentences in the simple past tense is:

Subject + main verb (past form), e.g.

I worked



### 1.2. Negative sentences

The structure for **negative** sentences in the simple past tense is:

Subject + auxiliary verb (did) + not + verb (base form), e.g.

I didn't work



### 1.3. Question sentences

The structure for **question** sentences in the simple past tense is:

Auxiliary verb (did) + subject + main verb (base form), e.g.

Did you work...?



### 2.1.Form: regular verbs

The simple past is formed by adding -ed to the end of an infinitive and removing the to, for example try becomes tried



## 2.2.Form: irregular verbs

All the irregular verbs have different forms: to go becomes went, to buy becomes bought, to cut becomes cut, etc.





### 3. Use

#### Use 1: Past actions that are now finished

The first use of the Past Simple to express actions that happened at a specific time in the past. The actions can be short or long.

John <u>cut</u> his finger last week.

I went to college 3 years ago.

He ate the dinner 1 hour ago.

I <u>slept</u> well last night.

### 3. Use

#### **Use 2: Situation in the past**

- Another use of this tense is talk about situations in the past.
- I <u>lived</u> in New York for 10 years (I don't live there anymore).

### 3. Use

#### Use 3: A series of actions in the past

The Past Simple can also be used with a few actions in the past happening one after another.

He entered a room, <u>lit a cigarette</u> and <u>smiled</u> at the guests.
