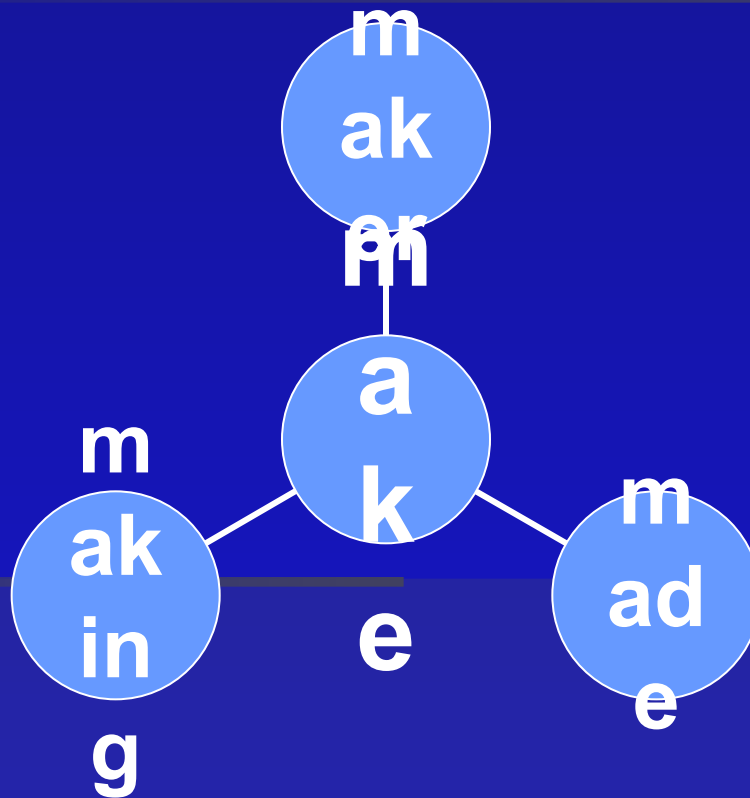
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What is a lexeme?

“A lexeme is a fundamental unit of the vocabulary of a language”

[Mid-20th century. Coined from lexicon + -eme .]

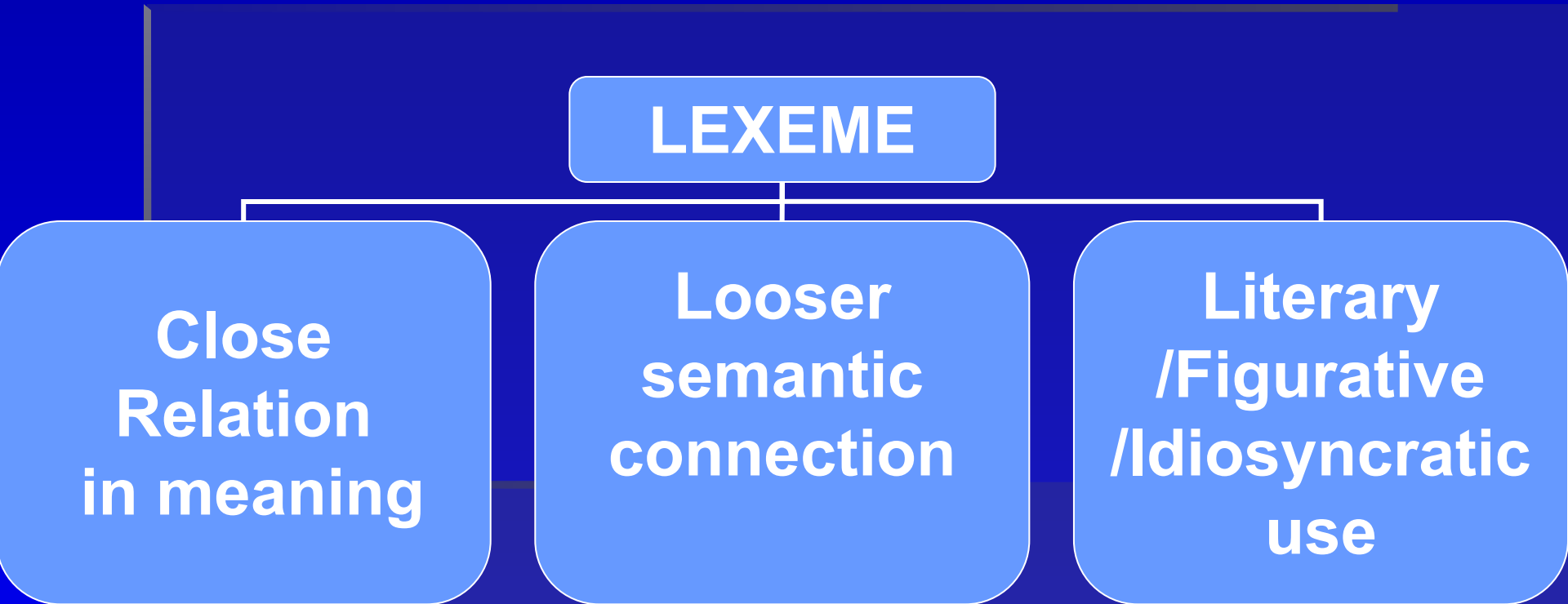
Different forms of a lexeme



What is a semantic structure?

It is a network of meaning relationships which bind lexemes together

Lexicon structure



3 types of lexemes (uncle)

- Aunt, cousin, nephew, niece
- Relatives, family, reunion (*when the family gathers together*)
- Uncle Tom's Cabin, Uncle Sam (USA)
- Idiosyncratic use: my looney uncle = my crazy uncle)

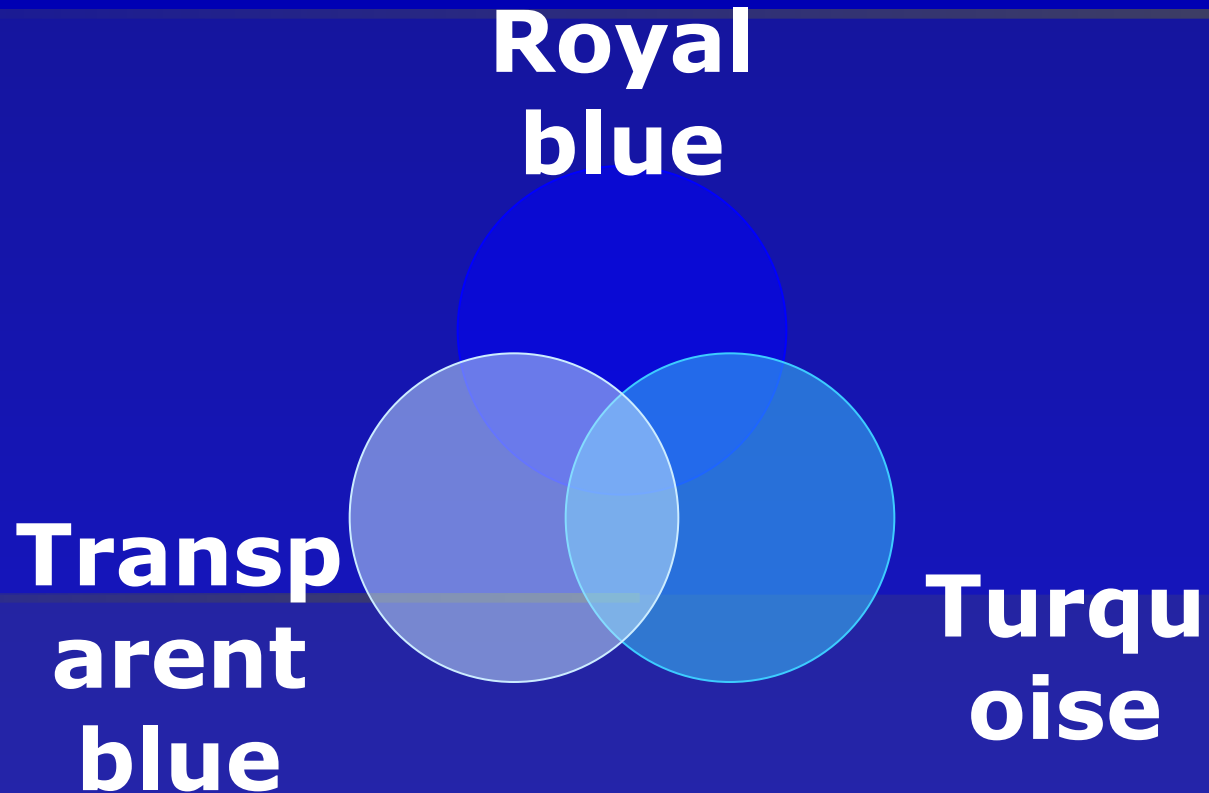
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What is a semantic field?

It is a named area of meaning in which lexemes interrelate and define each other in specific ways

Colour: blue



Tropical Fruit



Grapefruit

**Citrus
plants**



Orange

Lemon

Neatness vs fuzziness

NOISE:

- murmur , din , blare , clamour
- clatter, hubbub , racket
- sound , uproar
- talk and rumours
- atmospheric noise
- big noise

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What is wrong with a stylistic factor, or what is so special in the vocabulary of wine?

- **Figurative lexeme application**
- **Numerous associations**
- **Subjectivity of topic**

Wine can taste . . .

- **Bland** (implies lack of character, too mild)
- **Dry** (not sweet, sugar fully fermented out)
- **Finesse** (elegant and refined)



Wine can taste ...

- **Heavy**
(over-endowed with alcohol, lacking *finesse*)
- **Meaty** (thick, almost chewable flavour)
- **Tart** (tongue curling)
