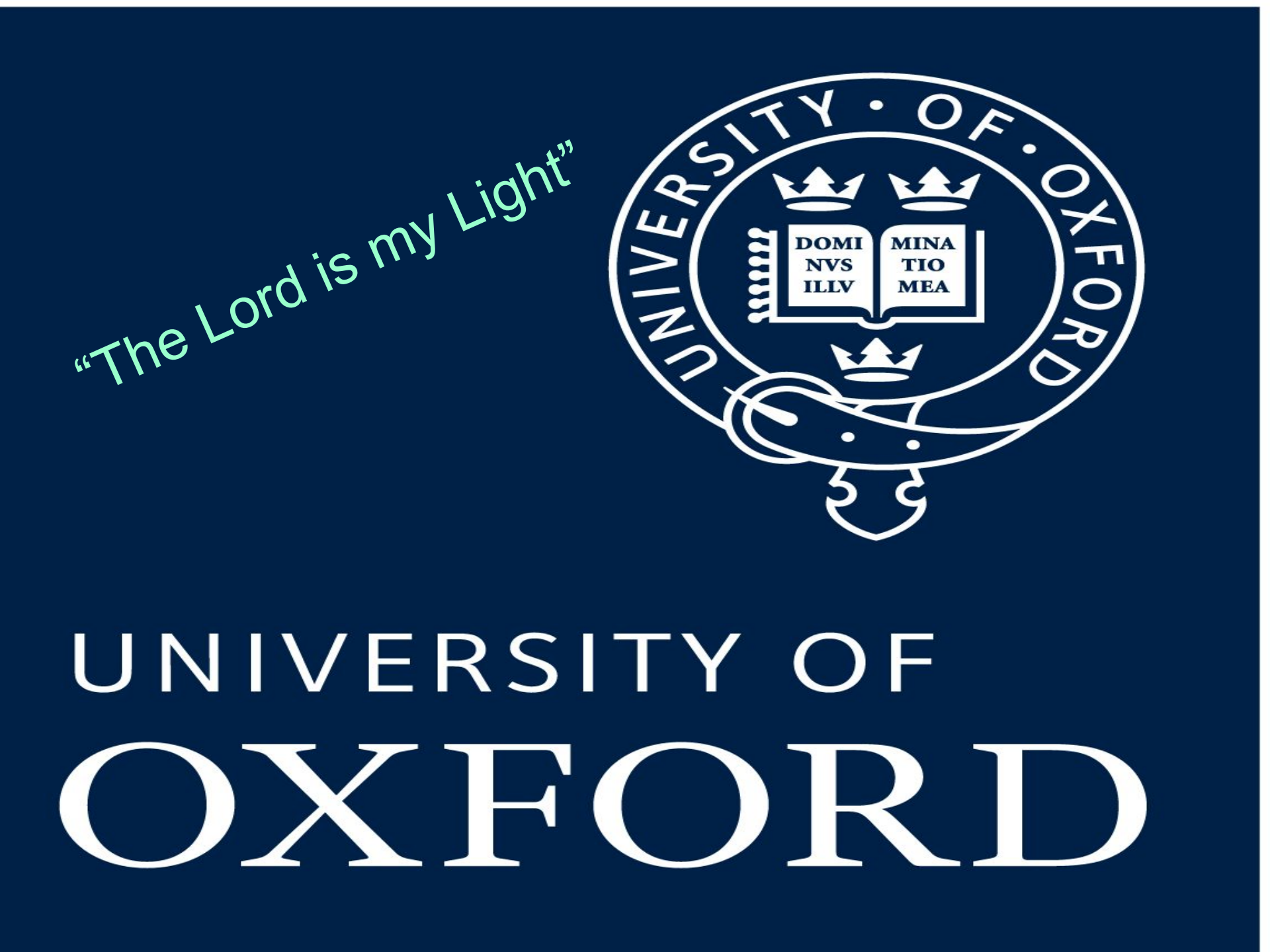

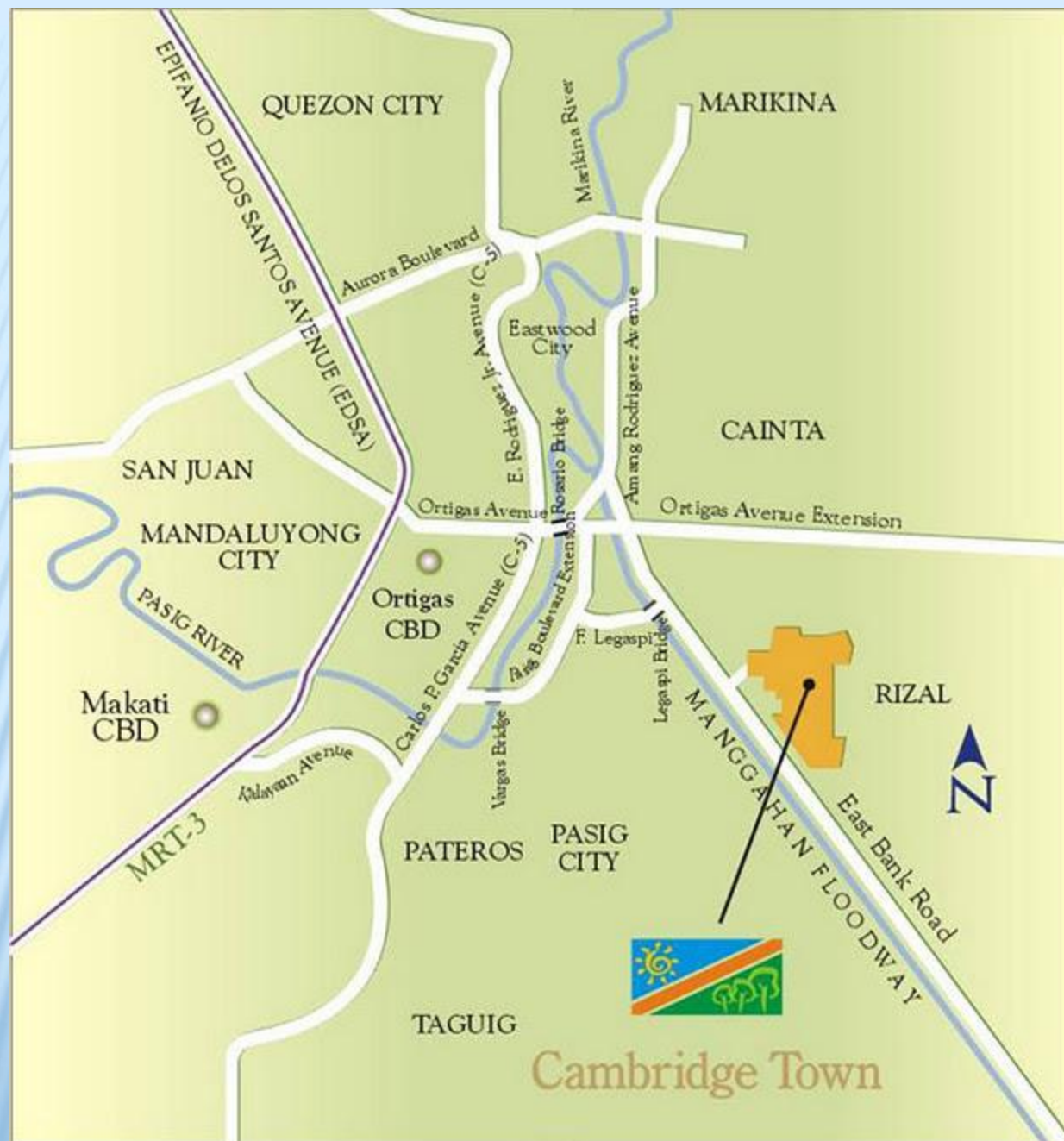
- There are 38 colleges of the University of Oxford.

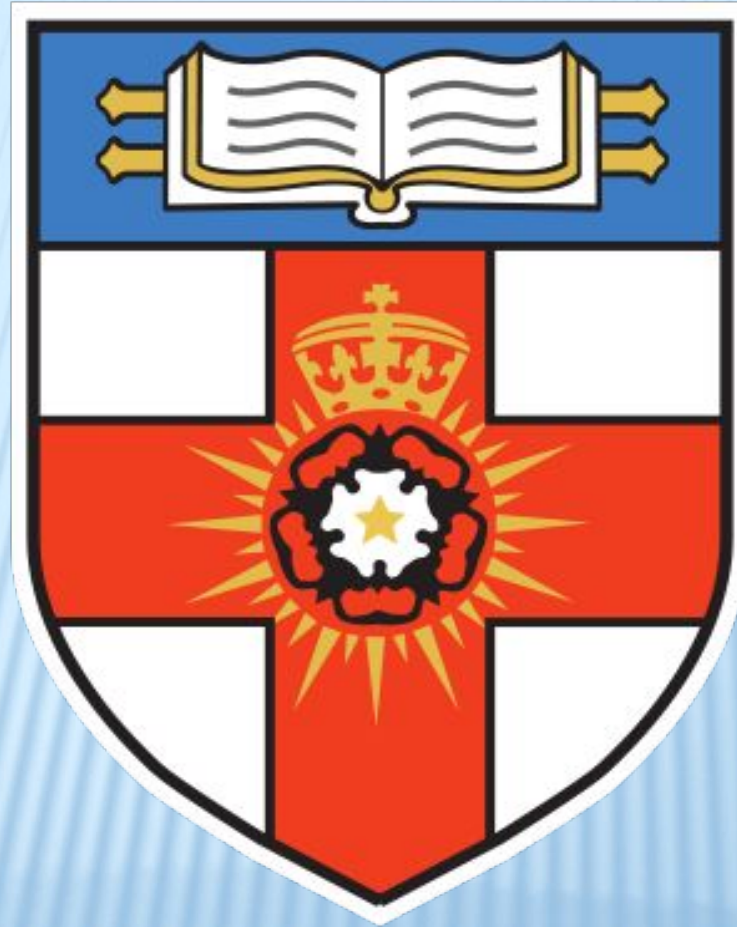


University of Cambridge

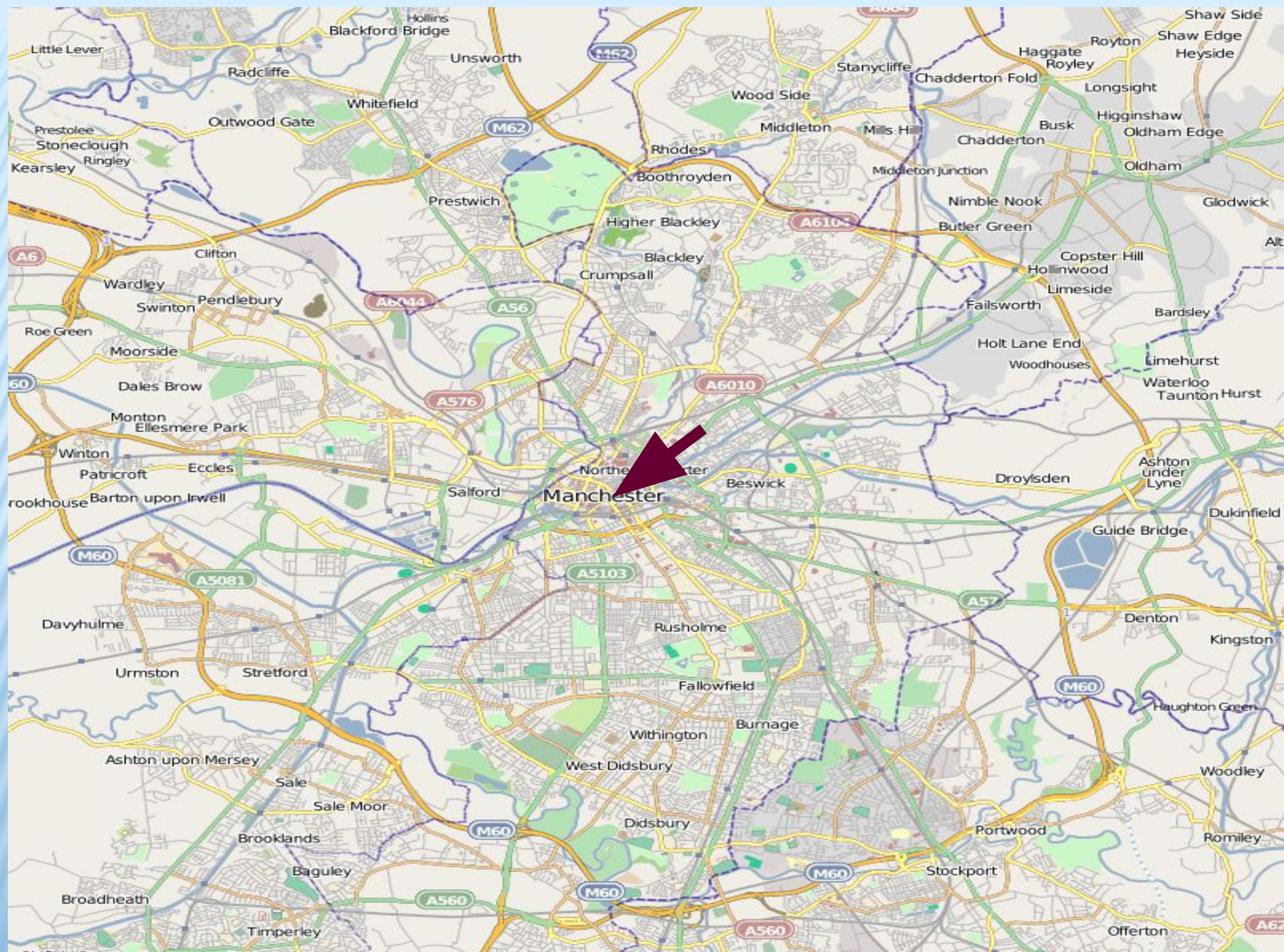
