

RULES

- The tournaments follow the rules used by the IIHF. The current IIHF rules differ slightly from the rules used in the NHL. One difference between NHL and IIHF rules is standard rink dimensions: the NHL rink is narrower, measuring 61 m × 26 m (200 ft × 85 ft), instead of the international size of 61 m × 30 m (200 ft × 98.5 ft).



Teams

- At the same time on the part of one team must be six players - five of the field and one goalkeeper. Goalkeeper may be replaced with the sixth field player. Players can change how the pauses during a stop of play, as well as directly in the game.

NHL vs IIHF



- Players from the NHL can take part in the tournament just after the NHL tournament finished. But with the 2014 Winter Olympics being held in Russia, a number of Russian NHL players, including Alexander Ovechkin, have stated that they will play in the tournament with or without the NHL's approval.

Interesting facts

- The largest score in the history of the Olympic hockey was recorded in the match between Canada and Switzerland in 1924, 33:0



Equipment

- Hockey stick - must be made of wood or other material approved by the IIHF, such as aluminum and plastic. They should not have any irregularities and all corners shall be rounded.
- Dimensions Stick:
 - Maximum length - 163 cm from the heel to the end of the stick
 - maximum width - 3 cm
 - maximum thickness - 2.5 cm
 - stick should be straight



Hockey skates



- Players must play in skates designed for hockey, with safety blades

Equipment

Protective equipment consists of:

- helmet;
- visor;
- Eye protection
- Shields (knee and elbow pads);
- Gloves (Cragie) - have to close his hand and wrist;
- Mouth guard;
- Hockey pants (shorts);
- Shell;
- Hockey sweater;
- Most junior hockey players under 18 in place of the visor must be fixed to the helmet like a hockey goalie mask.

Hockey puck

- The puck shall be made of vulcanized rubber or other material approved by the IIHF and be mostly black.
- Size washers:
 - Diameter: 7.62 cm
 - Thickness: 2.54 cm
 - Weight: 200 g
