Green Cross International is an environmental organisationfounded by former <u>Soviet</u> leader <u>Mikhail</u> Gorbachev in 1993In January 1990 during an address to the Global Forum on Environment and Development for Survival, President Mikhail Gorbachev brought up the idea for an organisation that would apply the medical emergency response model of the International Committee of the Red Crossto ecological issues and expedite solutions to environmental problems

Mission

 The mission of Green Cross International is to help ensure a just, sustainable and secure future for all by fostering a value shift and cultivating a new sense of global interdependence and shared responsibility in humanity's relationship with nature.



Green Cross International works in the following areas:

- Prevention and resolution of conflicts arising from environmental degradation;
- Provision of assistance to people affected by the environmental consequences of wars and conflicts;
- Promotion of legal, ethical and behavioural norms that ensure basic changes in the values, actions and attitudes of government, the private sector and civil society, necessary to build a sustainable global community.

World Wide Fund for Nature (WWF)



The World Wide Fund for Nature is aninternational non-governmen tal organization working on issues regarding the conservation, research and restoration of the environment, formerly named the World Wildlife Fund, which remains its official name in Canada and the United States. It is the world's largest independent conservation organization with over 5 million supporters worldwide

Mission



The group says its mission is "to halt and reverse the destruction of our environment". Currently, much of its work focuses on the conservation of three biomes that contain most of the world's biodiversity: forests, **freshwater** ecosystems, oceans and coasts. Among other issues, it is also concerned with endangered species, pollution and climate <u>change</u>.

Bellona Foundation

- The *Bellona Foundation* is a multi-disciplinary international environmental <u>NGO</u> based in Oslo, Norway. Founded in 1986 by <u>Frederic Hauge</u> and Rune Haaland as a direct action protest group, it has since blossomed into a recognized technology and solution-oriented environmental champion with offices on two continents.
- The Bellona Foundation was sponsored between 2005 and 2008 by the Norwegian oil company <u>Statoil</u>
