- **International Airport Paris Charles de Gaulle** - the main international airport in France, the sixth busiest in the world and the second - in Europe, one of the major air units in the world, located near Paris.



- Opening of France's main international airport was held in March 8th, 1974. The airport is divided into three main terminals, each of which serves a specific type of flights.



The first terminal

- The first terminal (Charles de Gaulle-1) for intercontinental flights is a ten-level round building, from which rays runs in the direction of the blocks, which are located directly to the aircraft. The first terminal is fully open for review. Instead of deaf transitions transparent tunnels equipped with escalators located here.



The second terminal

- The second terminal (Charles de Gaulle-2), originally serves national company Air France, consists of six terminals connected by underground passages and intended for different airlines. Also, from the second terminal of the large windows offer views of runways and aircraft.



The third terminal

- Third, the last terminal (T9) is used exclusively for charter flights and is the most democratic of all three terminals.



- International Airport Charles de Gaulle serves more than 100 flights daily and transports over 140 million passengers.



How to get there

- To get from the airport to the center of Paris is less than an hour and ten minutes - before Europe's largest theme park Walt Disney World.

- The airport is the main site of action of the Franco-British film Love Story (Décalage horaire).
- Also, types of airport used to design the cover of the disc «I Robot» musical group The Alan Parsons Project.
