

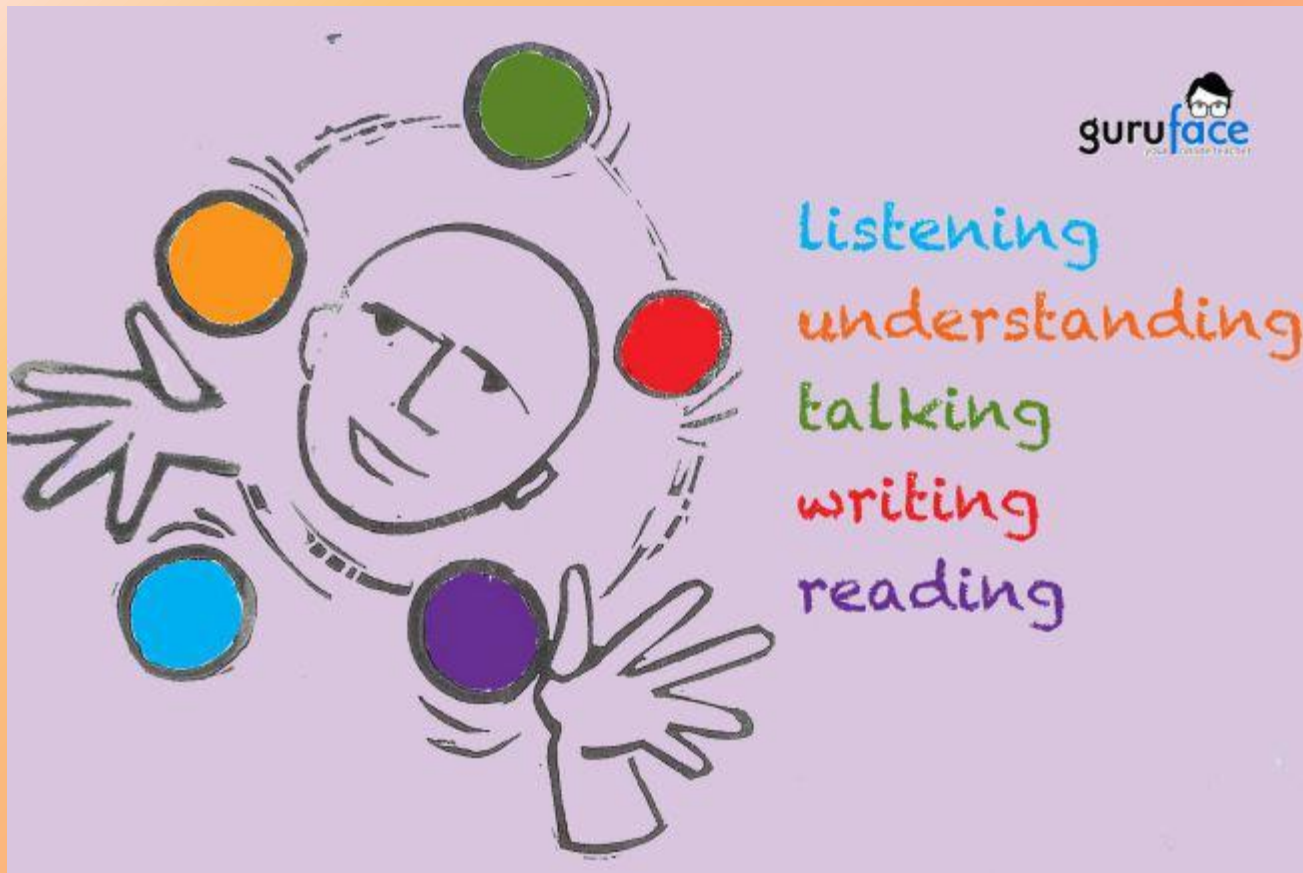

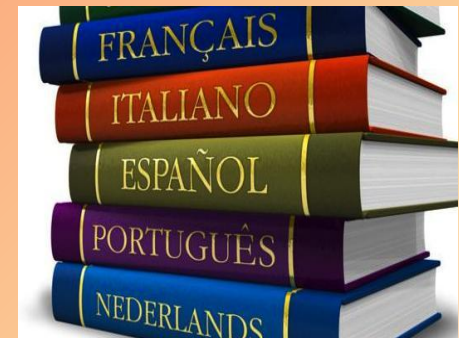
How many languages do you speak?

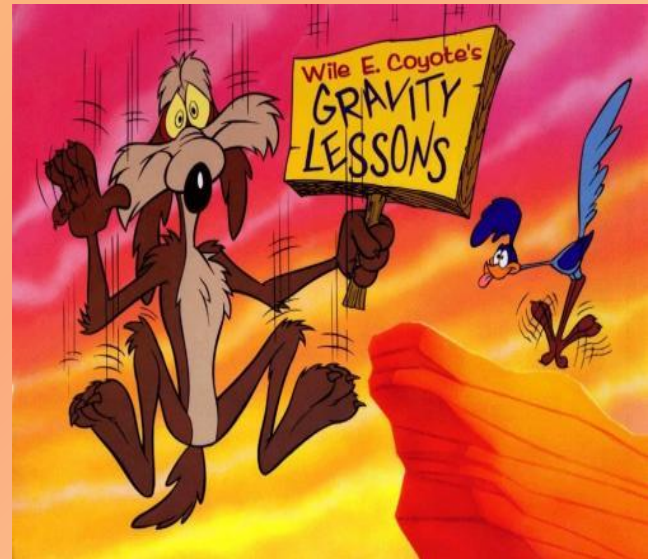

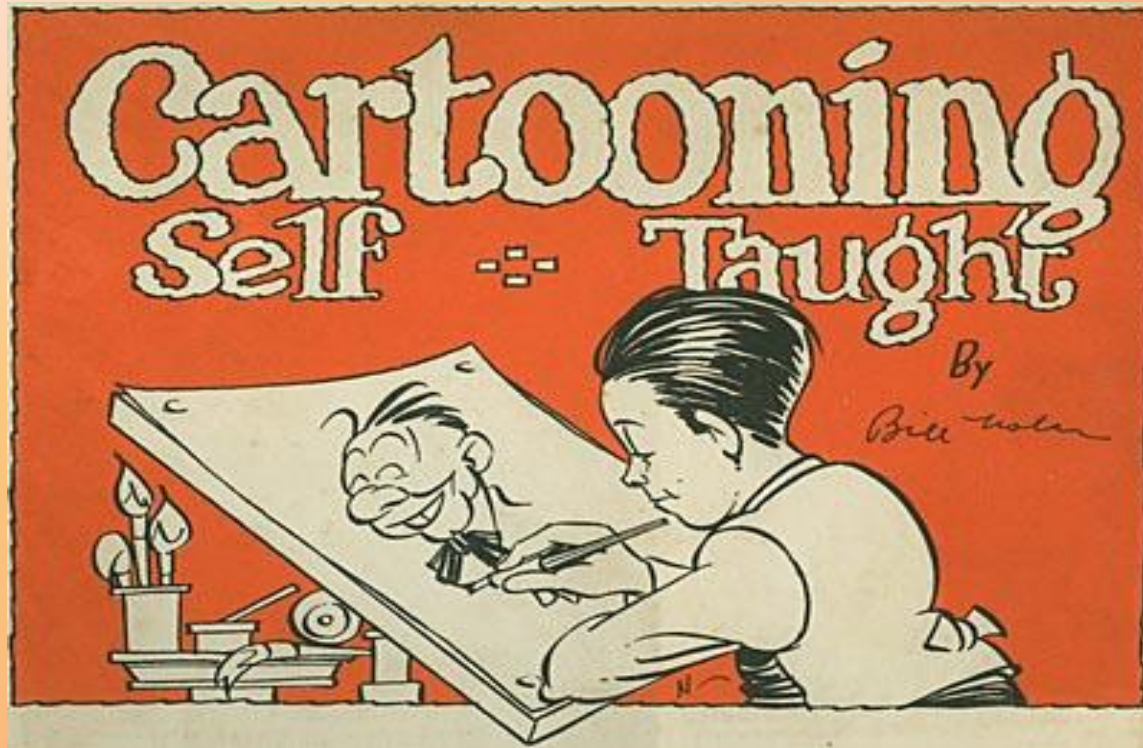

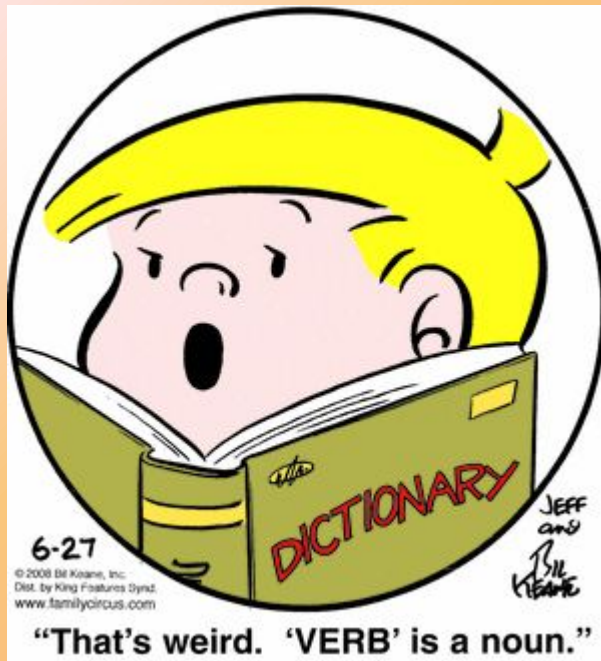

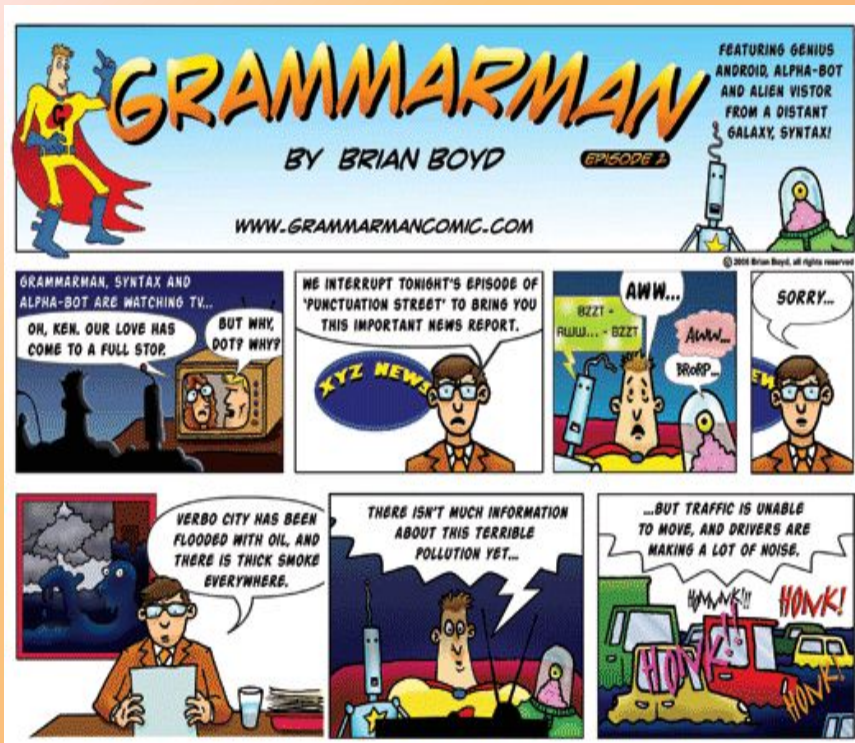


What personal qualities do you need to be an effective language learner?

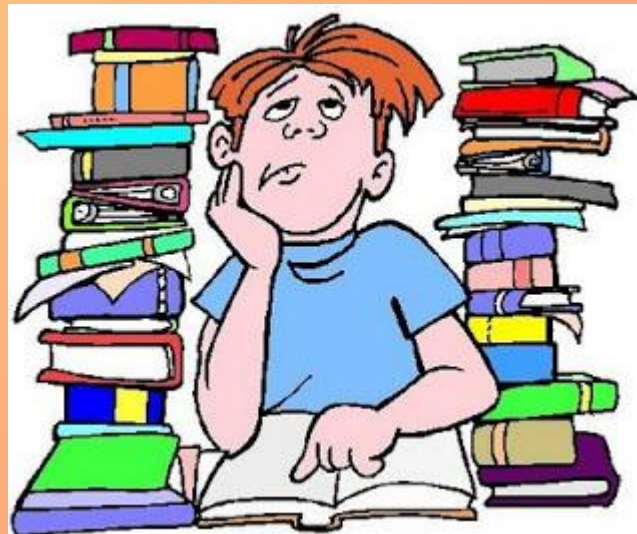
Is knowing grammar more important than knowing vocabulary?
