Reported Speech

Reported speech (sometimes also referred to as "indirect speech") refers to a sentence reporting what someone has said.

Several changes occurr when we do this.

→ verb tenses;

→ pronouns;

time expressions;

→ place expressions.

Changing verb tenses:

Direct speech		Reported speech
Present Simple	→	Past Simple
Present Continuous	->	Past Continuous
Present Perfect Simple	→	Past Perfect Simple
Present Perfect Continuous	→	Past Perfect Continuous
Past Simple	→	Past Perfect Simple
Future	-	Conditional
Imperative	->	Infinitive

Note that the Past Perfect Simple and the Past Perfect Continuous do not change.

• Changing pronouns, personal and possessive:

Direct speech

• Time expressions:

Look at the girl on the right. We would turn the statement into the reported speech by changing:

- → the verb from the <u>present simple</u> to the <u>past</u> <u>simple</u>
- → the personal pronoun <u>I</u> to <u>she</u>
- → the possessive pronoun my to her

The sentence would then be:

The girl said she loved her new dress.



There are several reporting verbs we can use:

- → The most commonly used one is <u>to say</u>.

 She <u>said</u> she was studying.
- → When the person who we are talking to is referred, we can use to tell.

 You told me you liked your new dress.
- → We may report something that was said without keeping to the original words, the reporting verb itself may contain that idea or intention. The verbs here can be: to admit, to advise, to agree, to remind, to suggest, to encourage, to insist, to persuade, to warn, to refuse, to urge, among others.

- I admit it, I did it!

She admitted she did it.








The woman said <u>her</u> book <u>was being</u> very interesting.
