This jacket costs \$85.00.






Actions that happen again and again.

Pedro watches TV every night.






•Add **S** to most verbs.

- once a day / week / month / year
- twice a day / week / month / year

We use Present Progressive / Continuous Tense to:

Talk about an action that is happening now.

(at the moment of speaking)

present continuous















Frank is watching TV at the moment.

Affirmative	Negative	Interrogative
I am playing	I'm not playing	Am I playing?
He is playing	He isn't playing	Is he playing?
She is playing	She isn't playing	Is she playing?
It is playing	It isn't playing	Is it playing?
We are playing	We aren't playing	Are you playing?
You are playing	You aren't playing	Are we playing?
They are playing	They aren't playing	Are they playing?

•Verbs that end in **E**, drop **e** and add **ING**.




