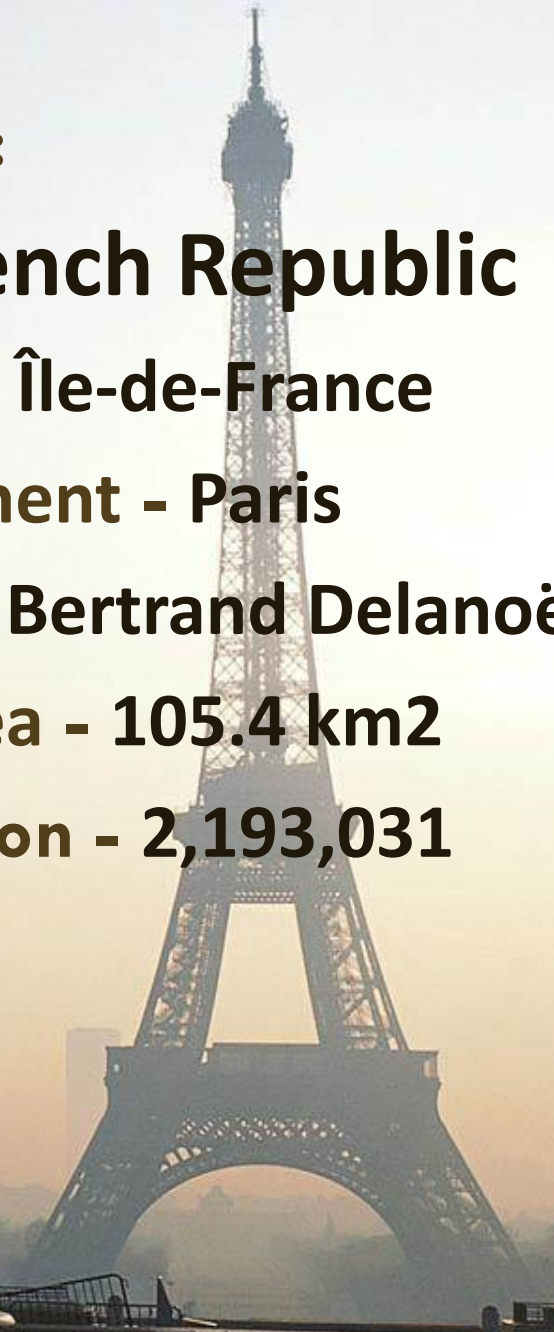

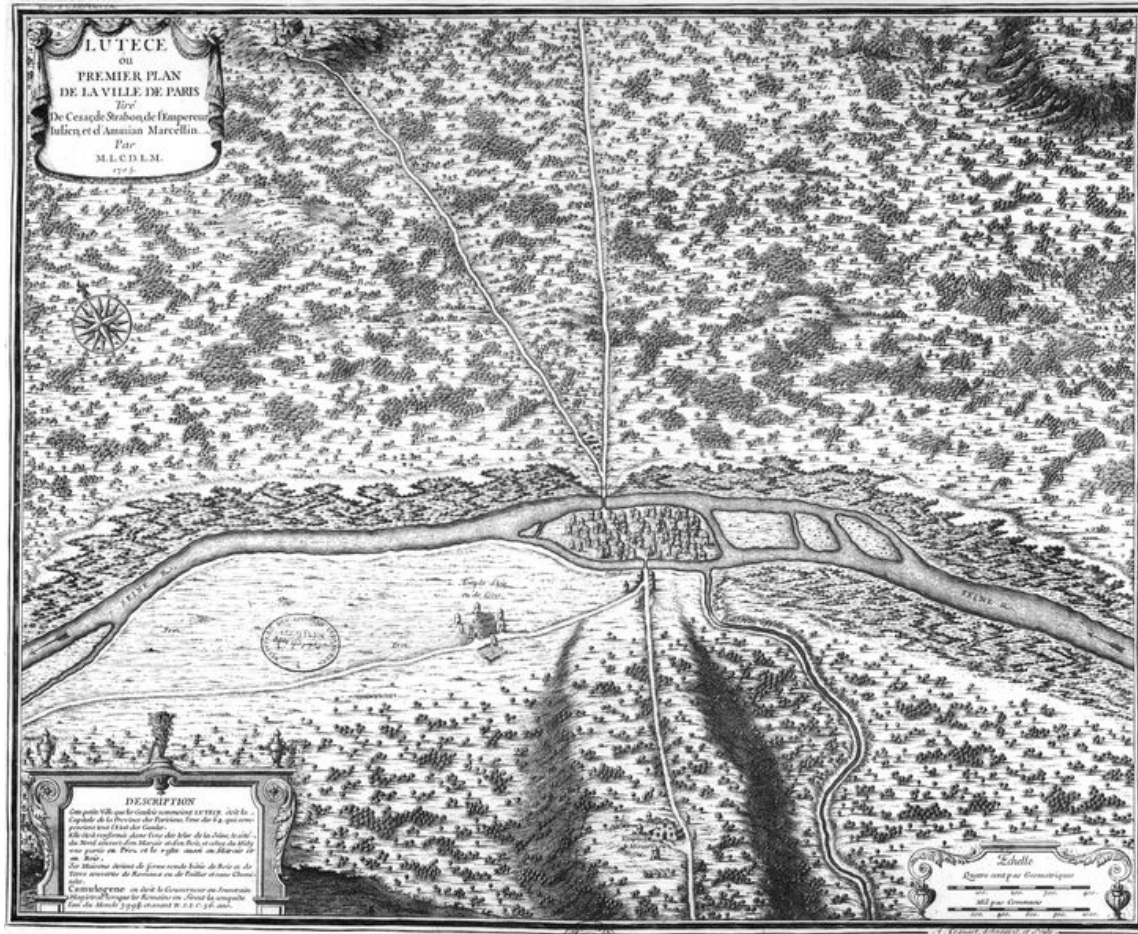

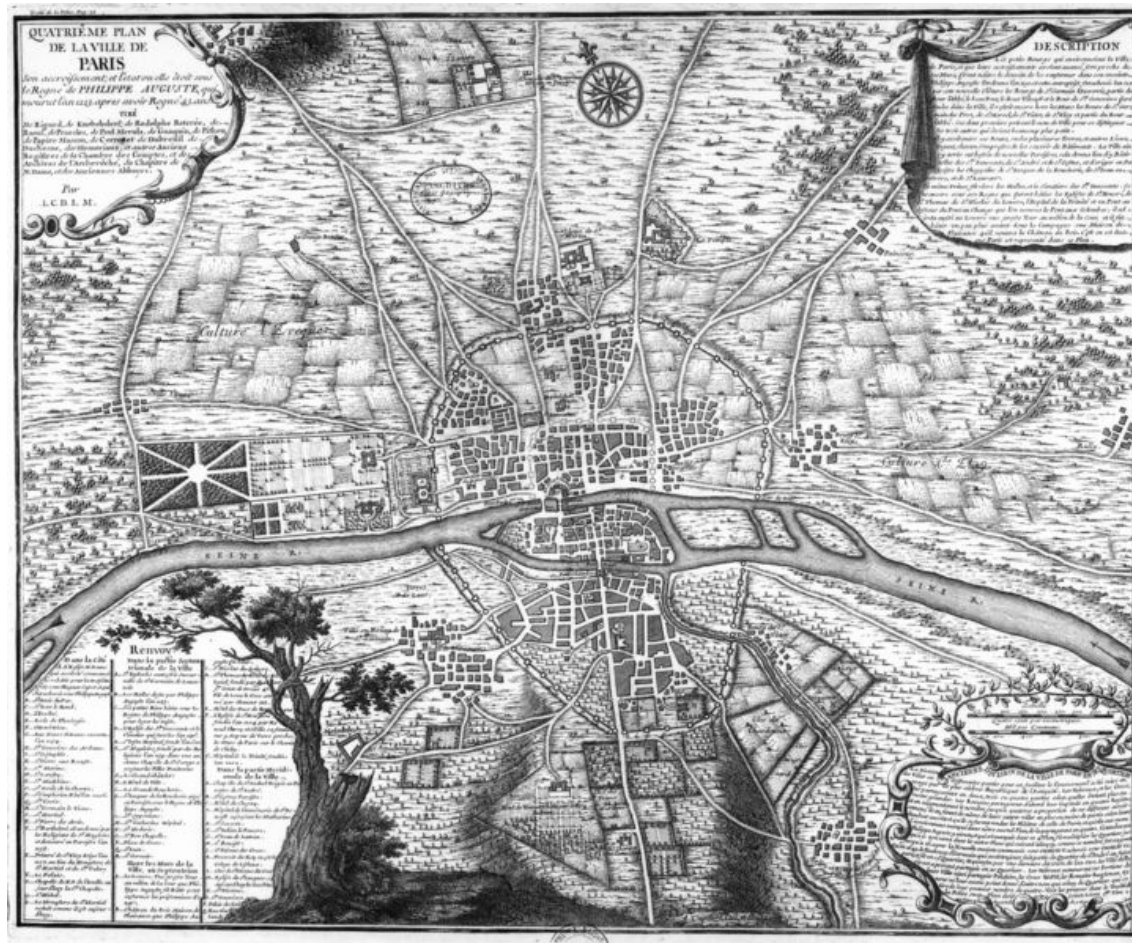
Historical events

- The original name of Paris was **Lutetia**
- The city reclaimed its original appellation of "Paris" towards the end of the Roman occupation
- The Frankish king Clovis the Frank, the first king of the Merovingian dynasty made the city his capital from 508.
- Paris's population was around 200,000 when the **Black Death** arrived in 1348, killing as many as 800 people a day, and 40,000 died from the plague, in 1466

Historical events

- ❑ **Late 15th century: The Renaissance begins in Paris, turning the city into a flourishing center of art, science, and architecture. Technological advances lead to the city's sprawl**
- ❑ **Late 16th century: Bloody religious conflicts between Protestants and Catholics lead to the St. Bartholomew's Day massacre. Over 3000 Protestant Huguenots perish in the massacre.**
- ❑ **1792: Fall of the monarchy and declaration of the first French republic.**

Historical events

- **Mid-19th century: The Paris that still largely remains today is constructed by Baron Haussmann, under the direction of Napoleon III. Wide boulevards and a sewer system replace most of the narrow, cramped medieval and Renaissance-era streets of the city.**
- **1920's and 1930's: Paris is one of the world's most important hotbeds of experimentation in art and literature.**
- **On 14 June 1940 Paris fell to German occupation forces**
- **German forces remained in Paris until the city was liberated in August 1944**
