The Houses of Parliament



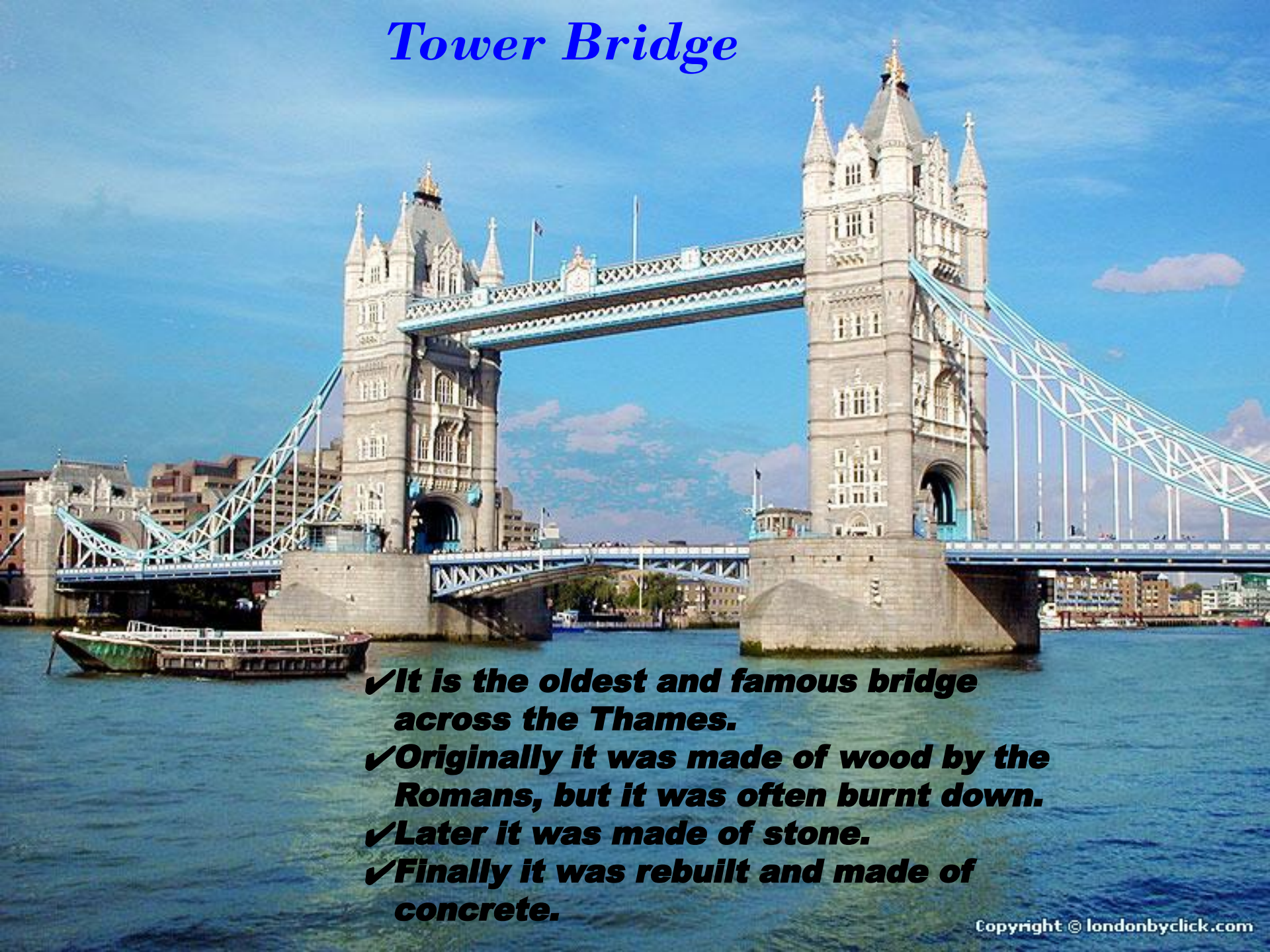
- ✓ *This big palace is the most famous building in the world – the British Parliament.*

- ✓Finally it was rebuilt and made of concrete.**

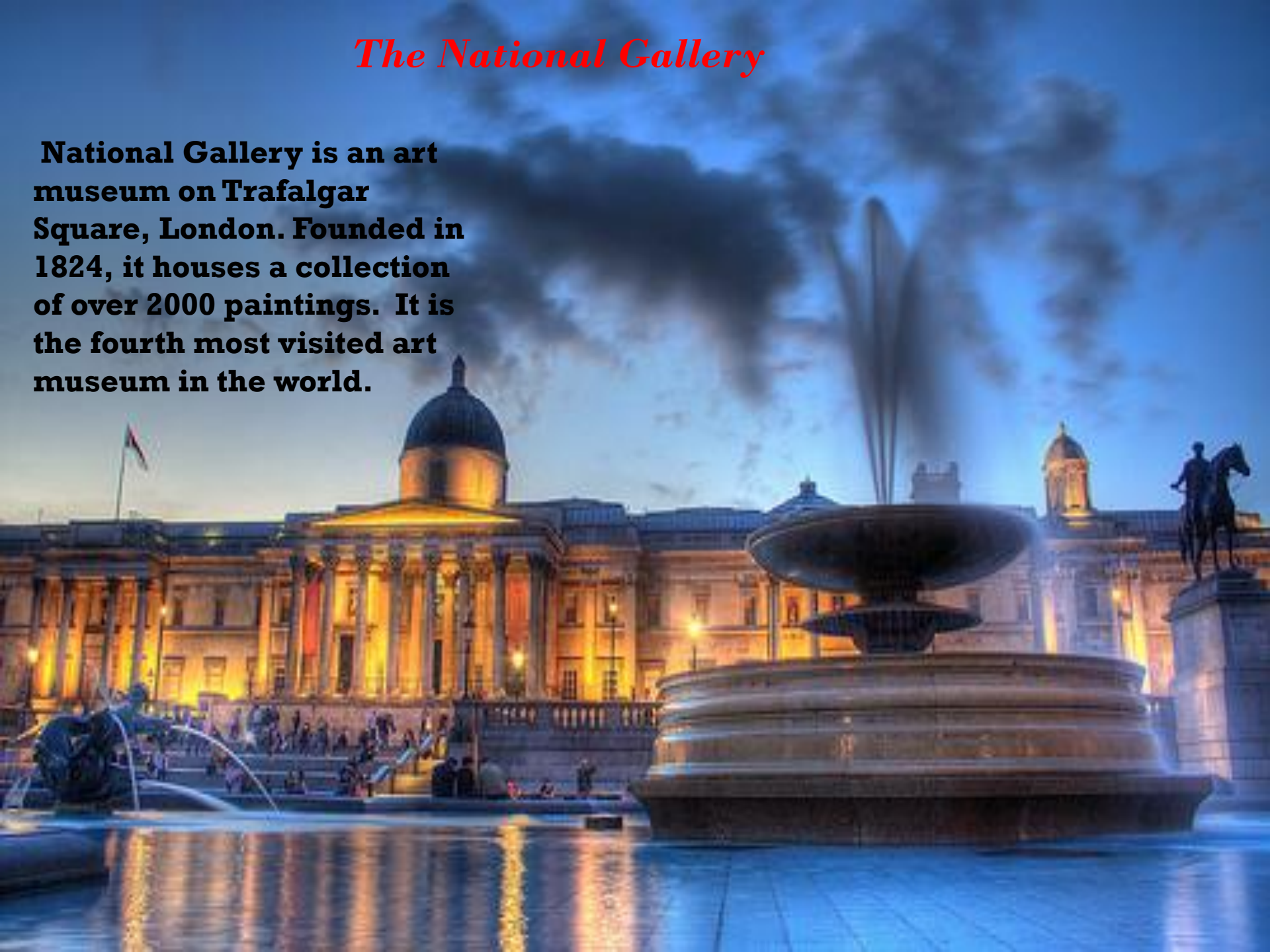
The British Museum

The National Gallery

National Gallery is an art museum on Trafalgar Square, London. Founded in 1824, it houses a collection of over 2000 paintings. It is the fourth most visited art museum in the world.
