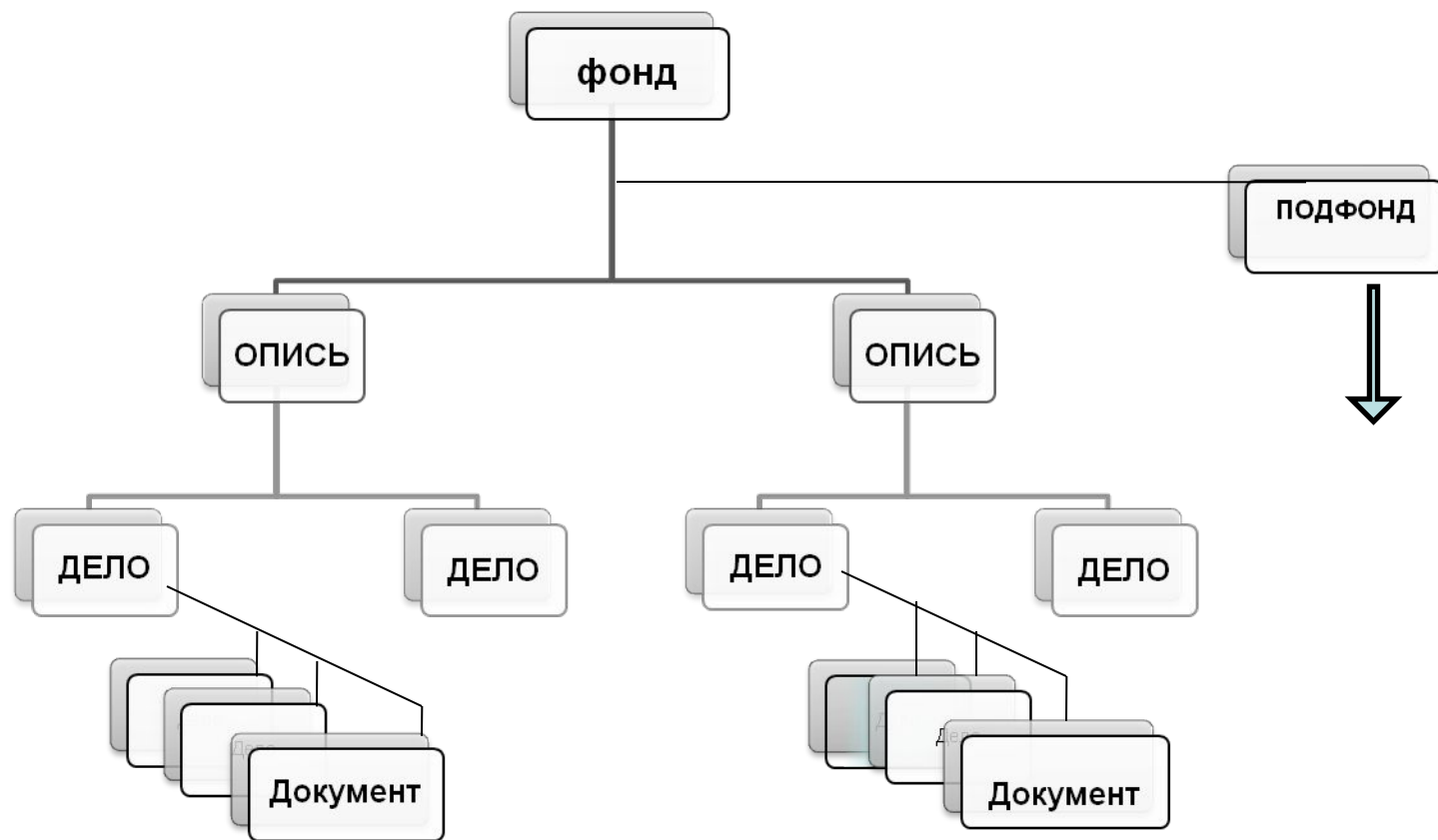

Summary: Copies of correspondence, memoranda, articles, texts of speeches, interviews, personal testimonies, investigative and other reports, official protocols, directives, resolutions, schedules, logs, inventories of archival material, printed material, film scenarios, and photographs reproduced from records in thirteen Russian archives as well as the originals of some of Volkogonov's personal papers. Reflects Volkogonov's study of significant events and individuals of modern Russian history beginning in the 1870s and 1880s with the births of those participating in events leading to the Russian Revolution and continuing through World War II, the Cold War, and perestroika into the mid-1990s. Documents major internal historical events in the development of the Soviet Union and its empire as well as foreign relations and external events of the period.

Subjects include communism, psychology and effects of absolute power, and the communist party and the armed forces in modern Russia. Other topics include the assassination of Nicholas II and members of the imperial family in 1918, post-Revolution emigration and activities of monarchists and social revolutionaries abroad, counterrevolutionary activities in the Soviet armed forces, development of concentration camps, foreign relations on the eve of World War II, the Doctor's Plot and persecution of Jews under Stalin, the arms race, the Cuban Missile Crisis of 1962, the work of a joint American and Soviet commission on prisoners of wars and missing in action, and modern Russian archival policies.

Individuals represented in the collection include Inessa F. Armand, Lavrentii P. Beria, Nikolai Ivanovich Bukharin, John F. Kennedy, Aleksandr Fyodorovich Kerensky, Nikita Sergeevich Khrushchev, Vladimir Il'ich Lenin, Joseph Stalin, Leon Trotsky, and Boris Nikolayevich Yeltsin.

finding aid

- **A finding aid** is a document containing detailed information about a specific collection of papers or records within an archive. The finding aid for a collection is usually compiled by an archivist or librarian during archival processing. Finding aids are a concept dating back to ancient [Sumer](#)'s clay tablet culture. In more recent times, finding aids were usually written or, later, printed on paper. Finding aids today can be created in various electronic and print formats, including word processor document, spreadsheet, database, paper list, index cards, etc. The standard machine-readable format for manuscript collection finding aids, widely used in the United States, England, Canada, and Australia, is Encoded Archival Description

Scope and Content Note

The papers of DmitriĀ Antonovich Volkogonov (1928-1995) were supplied by thirteen Russian archives as well as originals of so-called inventories of archival material, texts of speeches, personal telegrams, etc.

The collection is divided into sixteen series. Thirteen of the series have copies were collected, and the parenthetical qualifier is the acronym in addition. The series are arranged alphabetically by name of archive.

Volkogonov used the records as primary source material for his book and was a Communist Party member for over forty years, he resigned in 1986, however, eventually allowed Volkogonov wider access to the records.

Volkogonov's principal interest was the Soviet period and the collection, according to Volkogonov, began in the 1870s and 1880s with the papers of Volkogonov, and his works include biographies of Leon Trotsky and Vladimir Lenin.

Almost all major internal historical events in the development of the Soviet Union are well documented in the collection. Because much of the material was used for biographical purposes, the collection is particularly rich in personal papers.

Records from the [Archive of the President of the Russian Federation](#) are included. The development of the Soviet Empire is documented in great detail, including the development of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union (Kop) and its internal affairs. Of particular interest is the discussion of the relationship between the Regional File and the Central File.

Because each series of the collection includes copies of records housed in a different Russian archives, there is considerable chronological overlap and numerous cross references have been included in the container list. The majority of the documents are photocopies made for Volkogonov, and there is a wide range of print quality. Although the most recent materials are in quite readable form, certain examples from earlier periods are not as legible.

In formulating personal names and corporate body headings for subseries and folders, the Library of Congress Name Authority File was used with certain slight modifications. The years of birth and death were not included, and parenthetical qualifiers were added to certain names when necessary. Many of the leaders from the Revolutionary period used pseudonyms to protect their families. In the Name Authority File, the pseudonym was chosen as the primary identifying name, with cross references made to the actual family name. For example, the name authority for Vladimir Lenin appears as "Lenn, Vladimir Il'ich, 1870-1924," with a cross reference to "Ul'ianov, Vladimir Il'ich." The heading used in the subseries and folder headings is "Lenin, Vladimir Il'ich (Ul'ianov)." The name authority for Leon Trotsky includes a cross reference for "Trotskii, Lev Davidovich." The heading used in this finding aid is "Trotsky, Leon (Lev Davidovich)."

Material in the [Addition](#) is unfiled and contains copies of documents from both the [Center for the Preservation of Contemporary Documentation](#) and the [Central Archive of the Federal Security Service of the Russian Federation](#). Topics include the Hungarian revolution in 1956 and the uprising in the Czech Republic in 1968 as well as some materials on the dissolution of the Soviet Union.

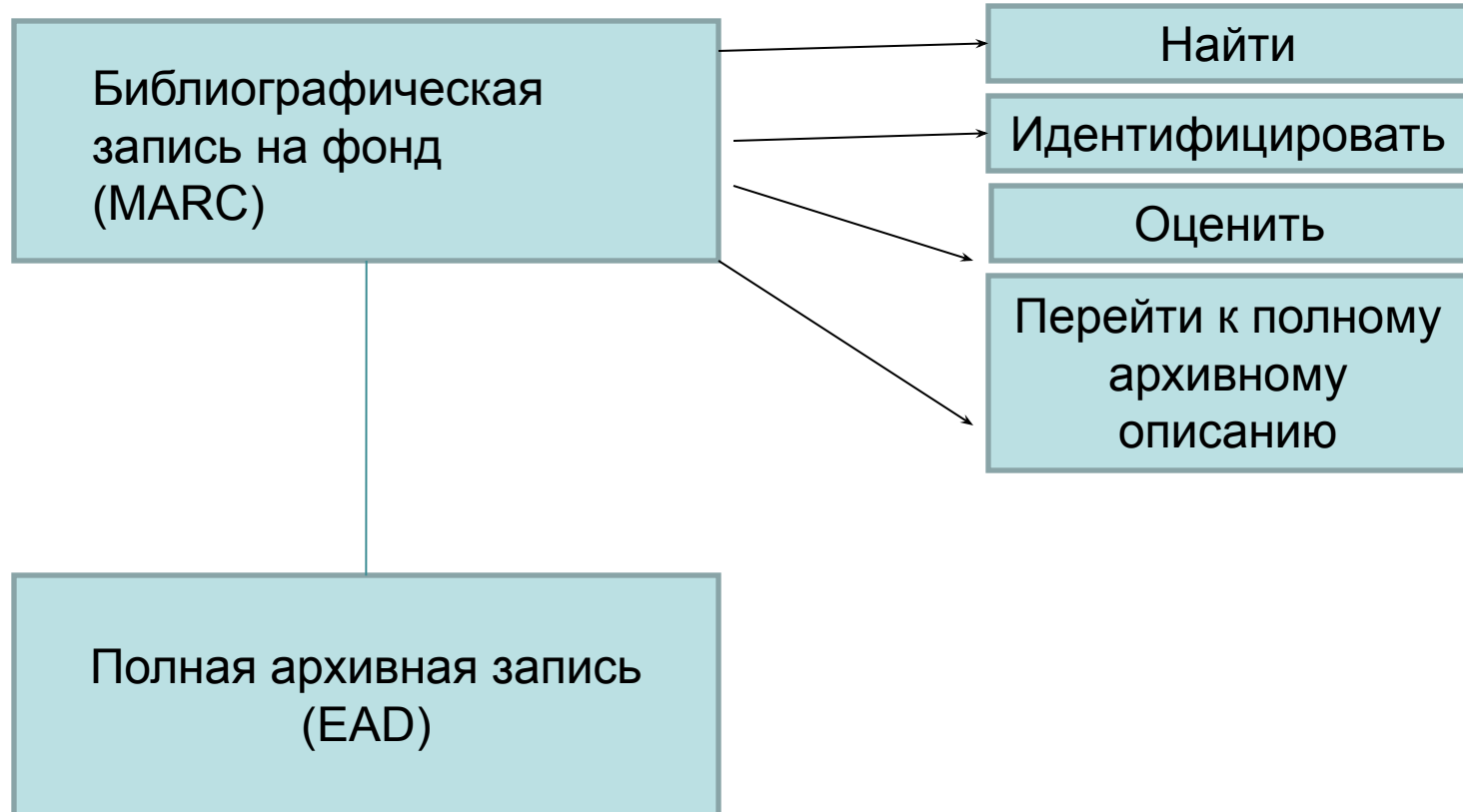
