Oxford University Press is spearheading the drive towards paid-for content with its excellent Oxford Reference Online site. Although the site isn't visually riveting, it gives its tens of thousands of users accurate and concise information from more than 100 quality reference sources – fast. And that's why it's been crowned *Internet Magazine's* Site of the Year for 2002.

The site took more than two years to develop at a cost of more than £1 million. At its launch, there were 1.5 million entries listed – around 30 million words. That's a lot of knowledge.

"It's never been so easy to be a know it all," one member of the *Internet Magazine* team said. "I hate libraries, but I love this."

The site has been very successful since its launch. Thousands of institutions are now paying for online access to its collection, and Oxford has easily exceeded first year sales targets, says Susanna Lob, sales and marketing director for online products. "We have subscribers all over the world – from the Faroe Islands to Mozambique!"

But, we hear you say, why can't I log on and see it? Thankfully, Oxford Reference Online has extended its reach so that more people can have the opportunity to use the site for free. It's signed a global licence deal with the British Council, and it's also negotiated a special licence deal for

But that doesn't include the majority

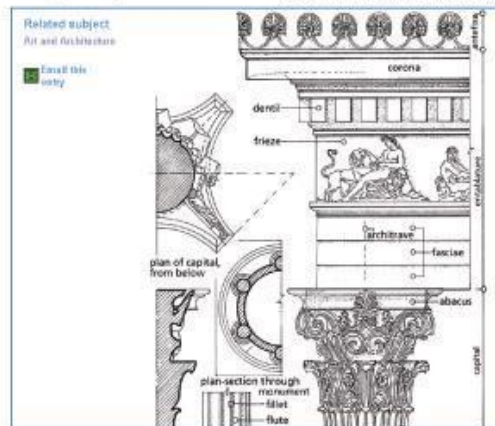
Oxford Reference Online provides a clear and concise layout married to a huge volume of information and a flexible search

of *Internet Magazine* readers. In theory, though, you should be able to visit your local library and apply for remote access to the site, or at least visit the site while you're there. "We also offer authentication by library membership card, making the service perfect for public libraries wanting to provide remote access to their patrons," Lob says.

All this added accessibility boosted Oxford Reference Online's standing in the eyes of *Internet Magazine* staff. We liked the site's speed, simplicity, accuracy and scope most of all. It also seems to work well across multiple browsers. Kudos go to Semantic, the site's designers, for doing such an expert job of translating such a vast amount of reference material to the Web.

Lob says much more is in store. By the time you read this, Oxford Reference Online should include *The World Encyclopedia*, *The Concise Oxford Dictionary of Archaeology* and *The Dictionary of the Social Sciences*. New editions of *The Concise Medical Dictionary*, *The Dictionary of Business* and *The Dictionary of Law* will also be added, with new and revised titles being added every three months.

It may be hard to convince people to pay for content, but when it's of excellent quality and from a highly reliable source, this site proves that companies and educational institutions will be willing to invest money into an

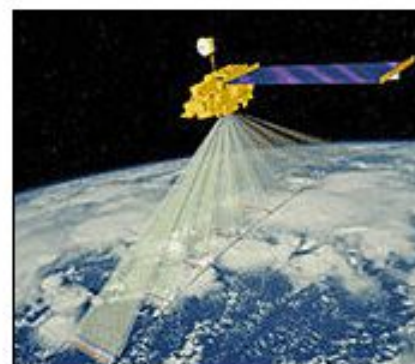
