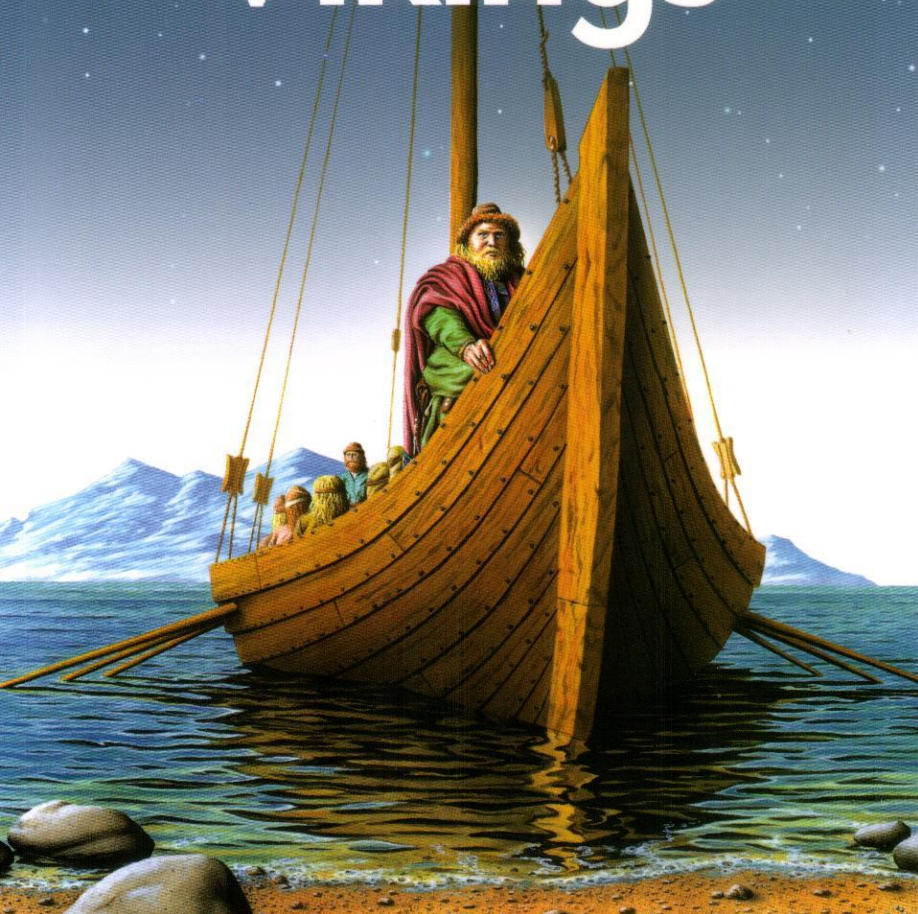

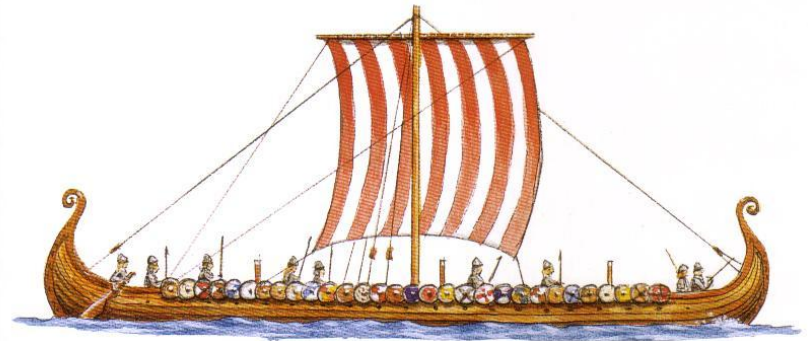

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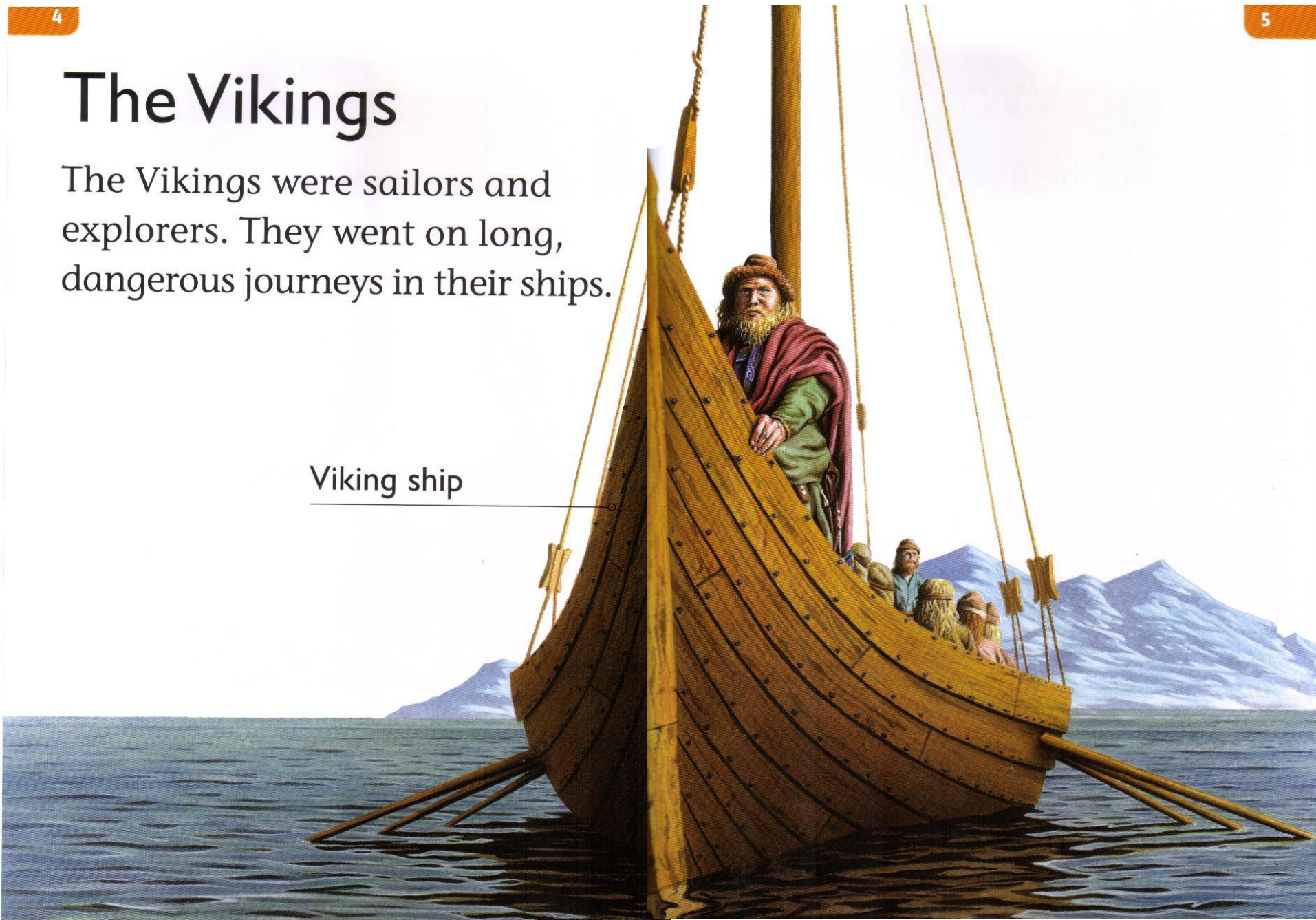

The Vikings were sailors and explorers. They went on long, dangerous journeys in their ships.

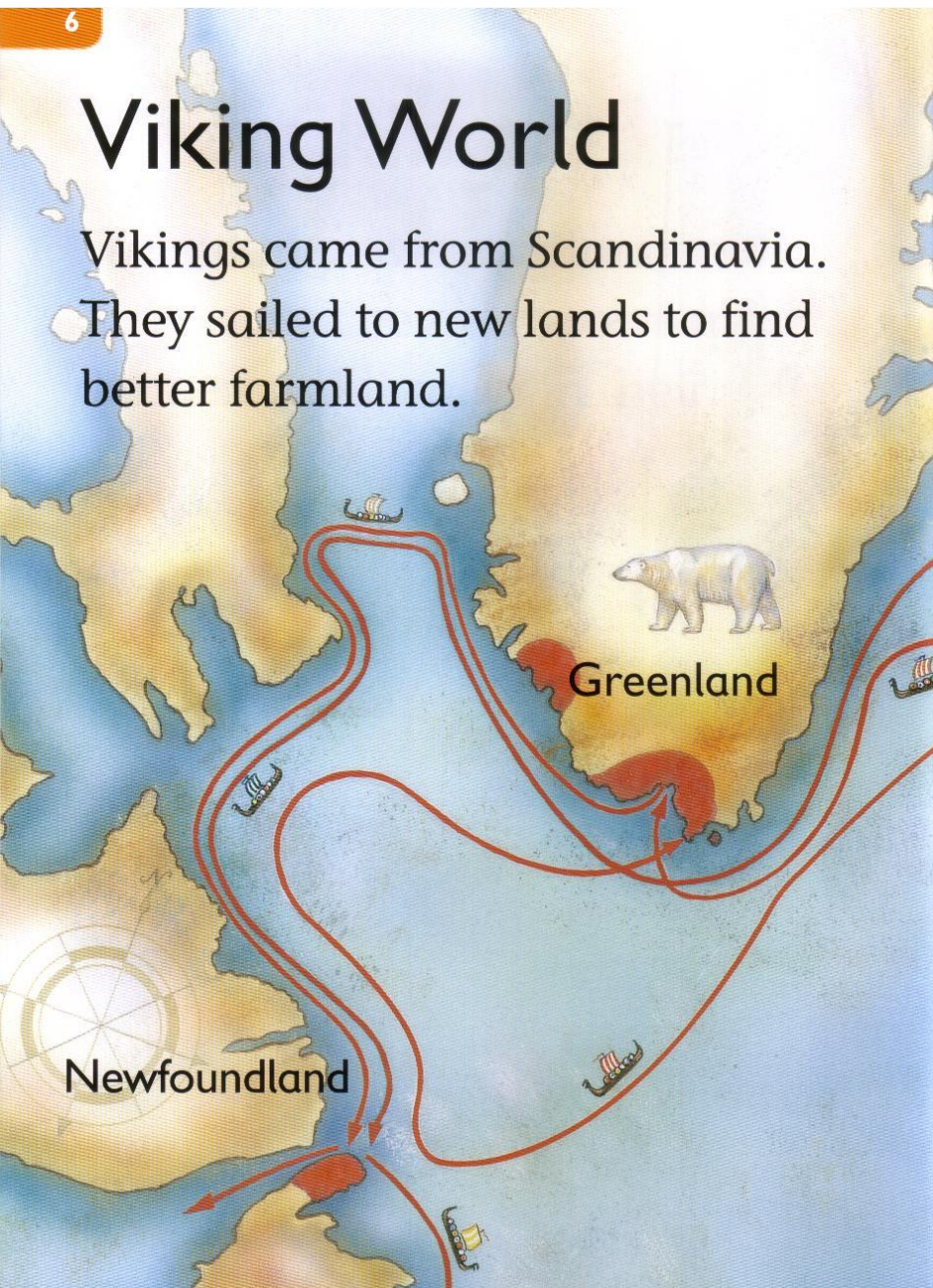
Viking ship

better farmland.



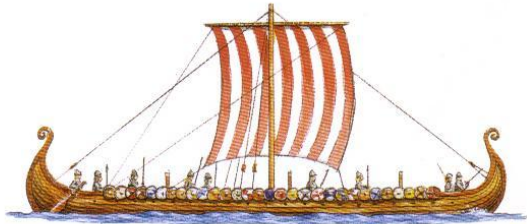
The red parts

traveled.



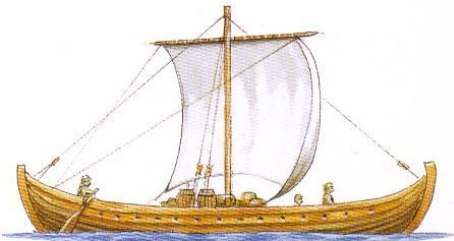


# Ships

Viking ships were strong and fast. Large ones had sails. Teams of people rowed some ships.

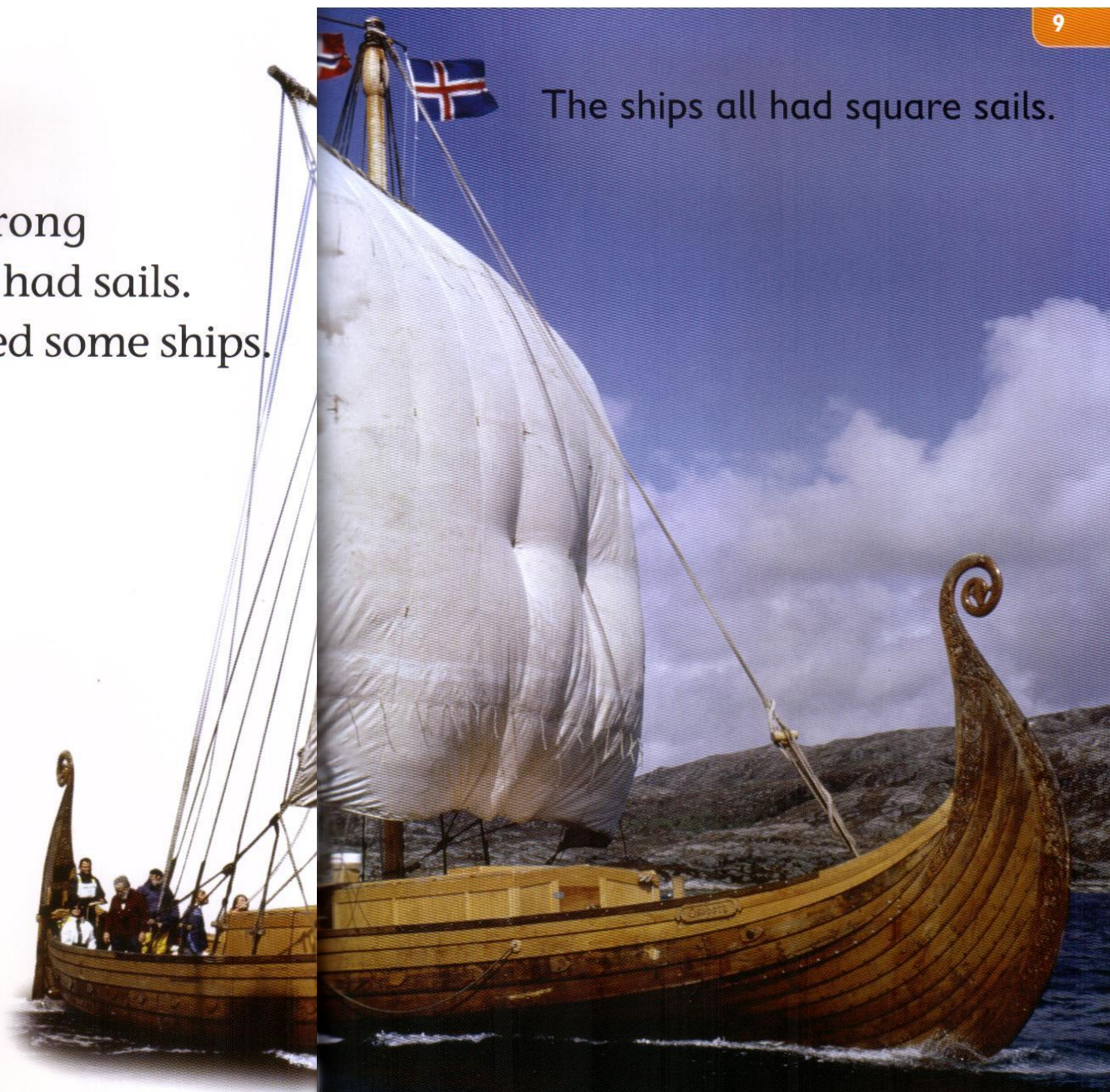


longship

The ships all had square sails.



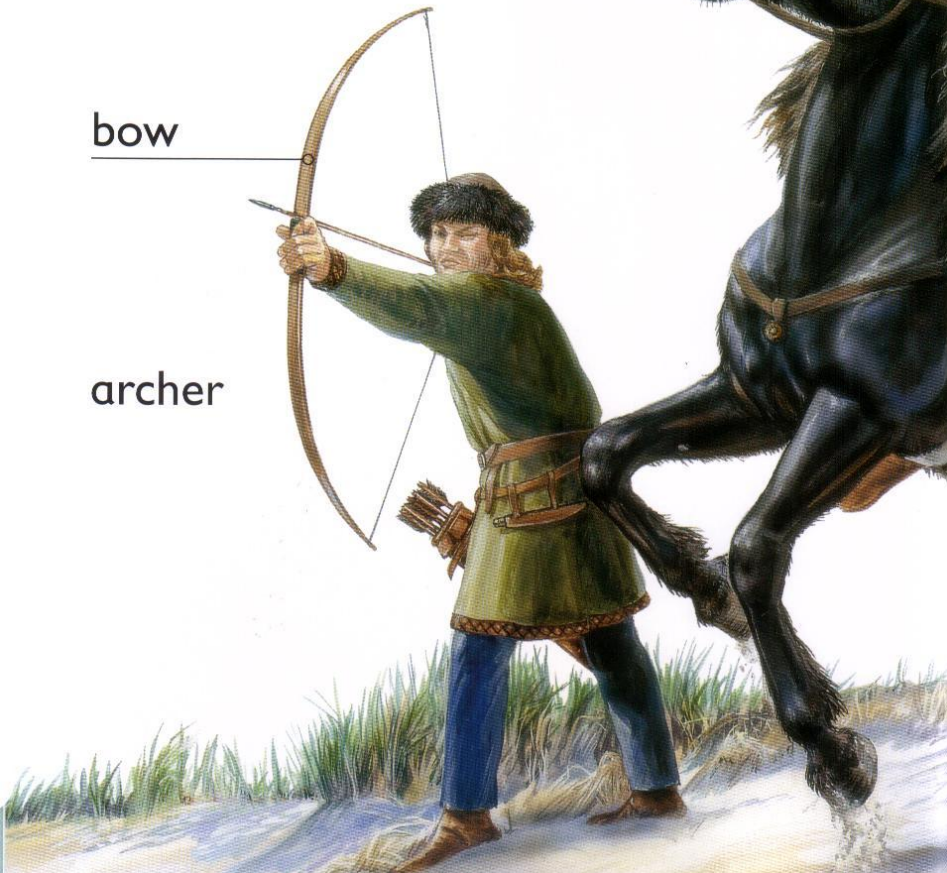


# Warriors

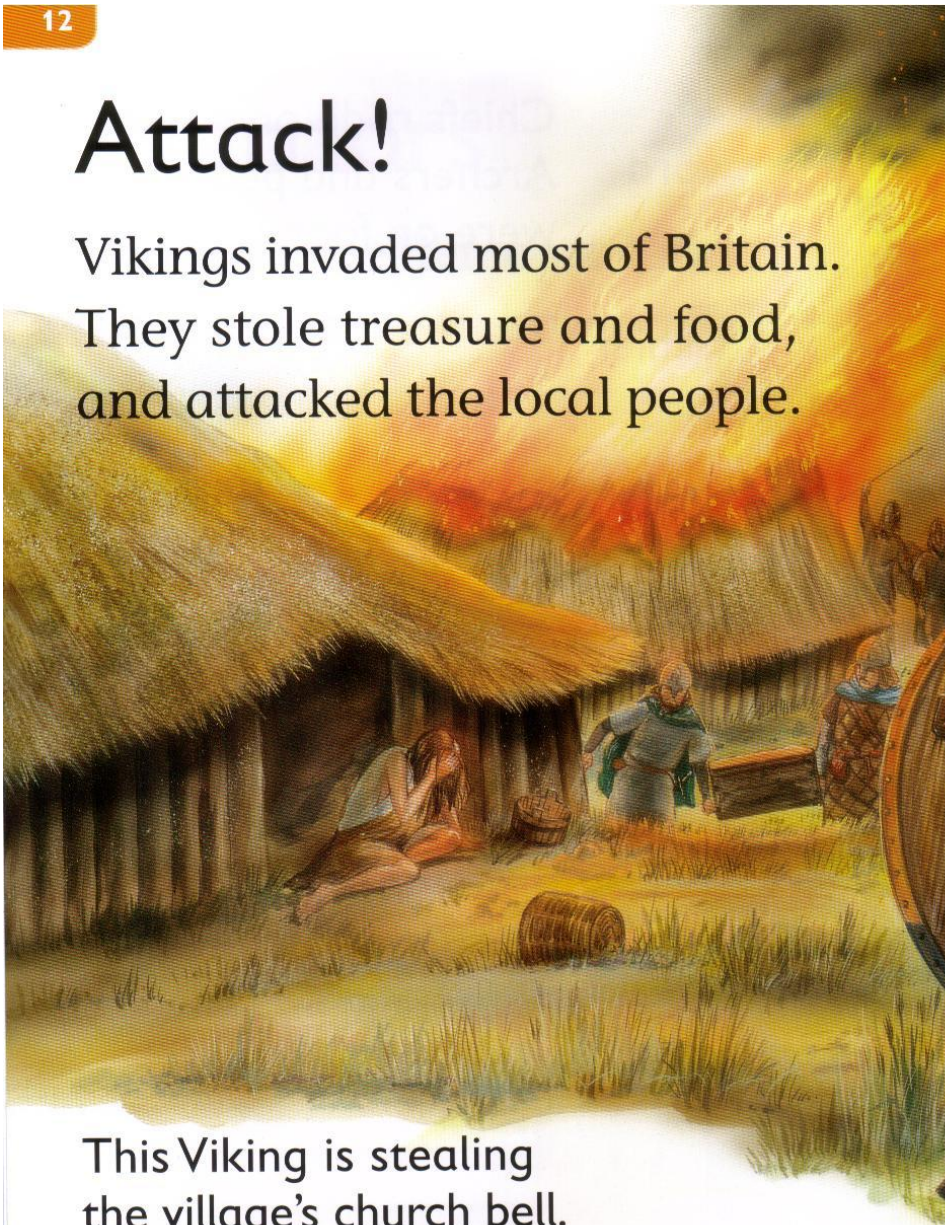




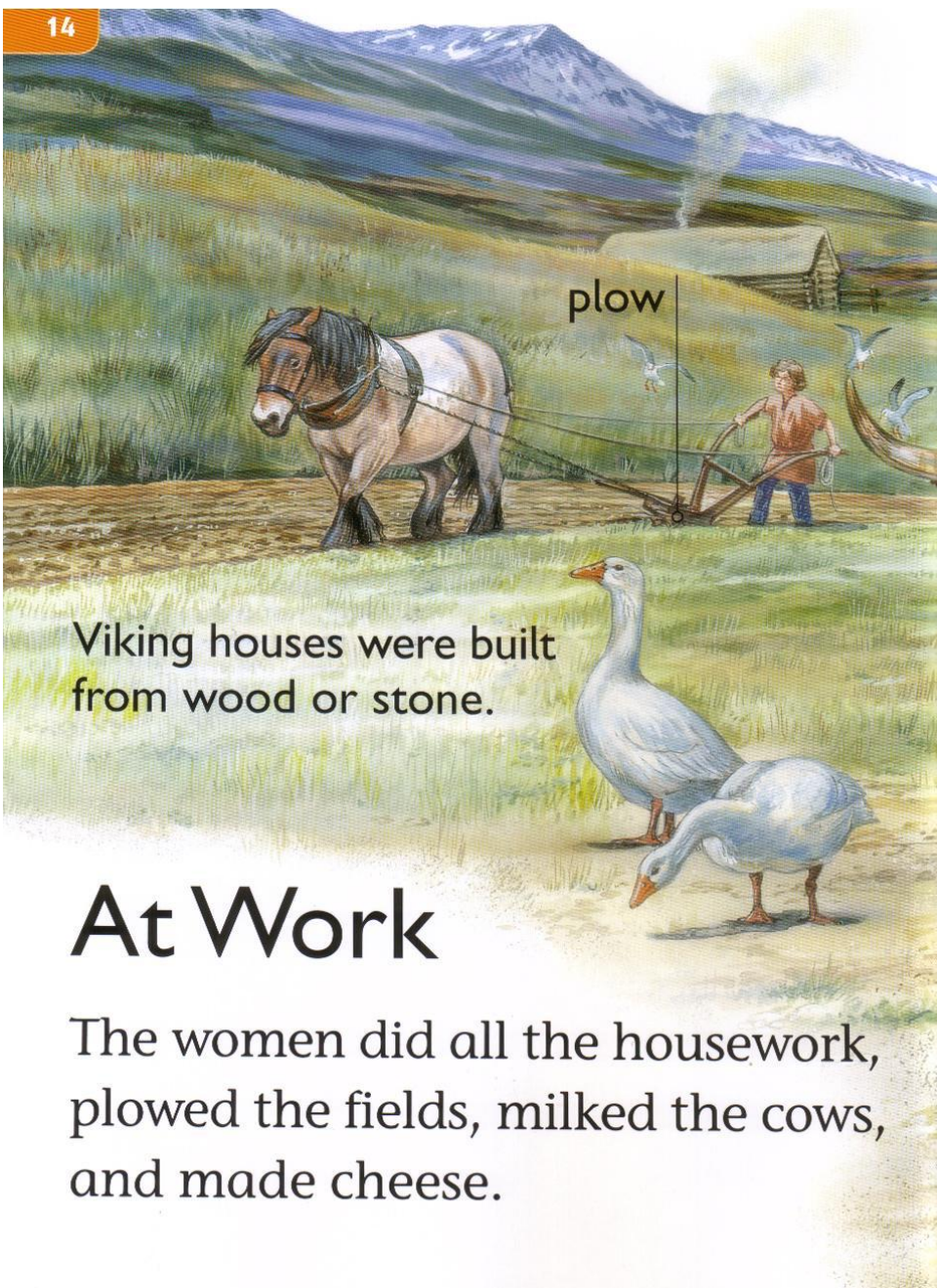
# Attack!

Food was served in wooden bowls and dishes.





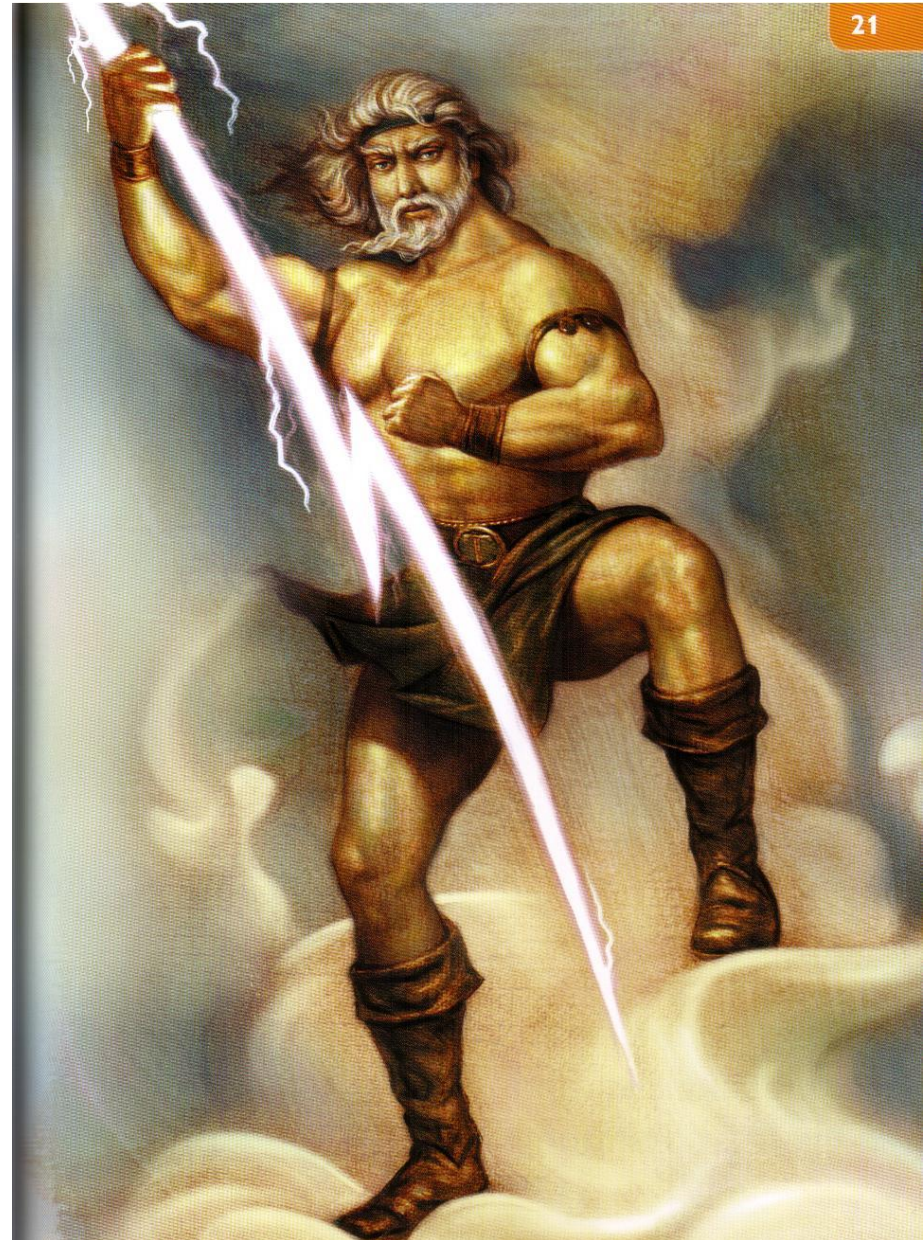
# Gods and Myths

Thor, the Viking god of thunder and rain, ruled the skies and protected people.

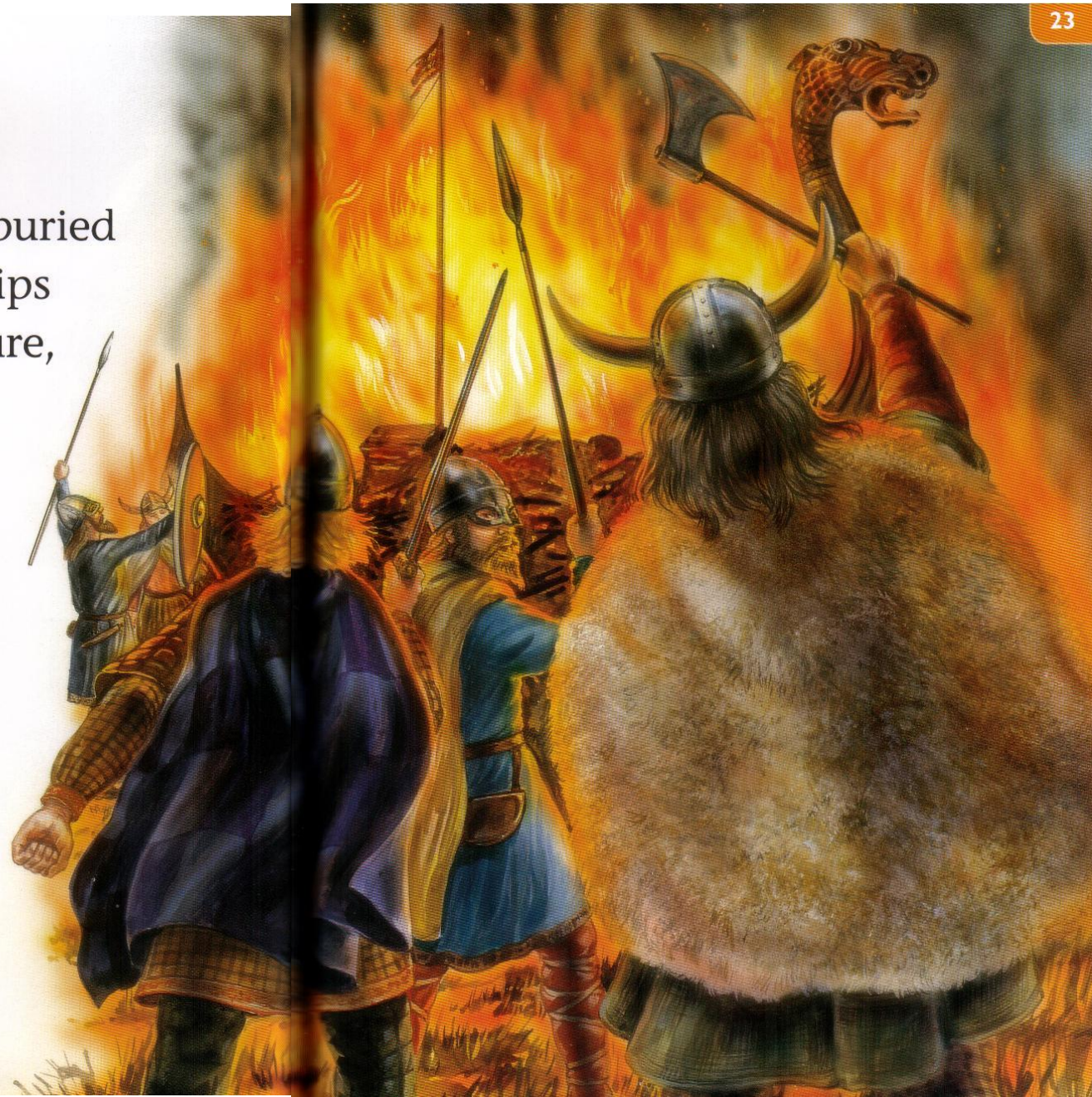




# Burials

## TopReaders

*How to share these books with your children*

Stage  
**1**

These books are designed for children who are beginning to read. Each book invites children to become excited about a topic. The words and pictures are closely matched to support the reader.

- ☆ **Look at the book together** so that your child gradually builds an understanding of how books and words work.
- ☆ **Discuss what the book is going to be about.** Look through the book, talking about the title, the pictures, and the words.
- ☆ **Read the book aloud**, occasionally pointing to the words and the pictures. Then, ask your child to find his or her favorite pages and read them together.
- ☆ **Ask your child what his or her favorite words were** and find them together. Point to them as you read them. Talk about the meaning of each word, the name of the letter that the word starts with, and what sound it makes.
- ☆ **Ask your child to tell you all about the book you have just read** and then ask "What shall we read next?" Encourage your child to choose another book and tell you what it is going to be about.
