Independence Day

People began to</u> <u>speak about the land as "The new World". In 1620 on the ship</u> <u>"Mayflower" they landed in the north-east of America. They set up a</u> <u>colony and called that part of the country "New England". This</u> <u>holiday is celebrated on 12th of October.</u>
