# «To be» (Present Simple)

## Elementary

«Am», «is», «are» — only 3 forms to remember.

### Examples

I **am** from the USA.

New York **is not** the capital city.

New Yorkers **are** very friendly.

### Forms

<b>Positive forms</b>	I <b>am</b> from the USA. (I'm) Jack <b>is</b> married. (He's) She <b>is</b> an actress. (She's) It <b>is</b> my phone. (It's) You <b>are</b> a good parent. (You're) We <b>are</b> Chinese. (We're) My <b>parents are</b> at home. (They're)
<b>Negative forms</b>	I <b>am not</b> from the USA. (I'm not) Jack <b>is not</b> married. (He isn't) She <b>is not</b> an actress. (She isn't) It <b>is not</b> my phone. (It isn't) You <b>are not</b> a bad parent. (You aren't) We <b>are not</b> Chinese. (We aren't) My <b>parents are not</b> at home. (They aren't)

<b>Yes/No questions</b>	Am I right? — Yes, you are. / No, you are not. Is Jack married? — Yes, he is. / No, he is not. Is she an actress? — Yes, she is. / No, she is not. Is it your phone? — Yes, it is. / No, it is not. Are you single? — Yes, I am. / No, I am not. Are we late? — Yes, we are. / No, we are not. Are your parents at home? — Yes, they are. / No, they are not.
<b>Wh-questions</b>	How are you? How old is your dog? Where is Jack from? Who is that girl? What is your phone number?
<b>Remember</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>o "I" is usually capitalised, e.g. Am I late again? NOT <del>Am i</del> late again?</li><li>o Use <b>full forms</b> in short "yes" answers, e.g. "Yes, he is. / Yes, we are." NOT <del>Yes, he's. / Yes, we're.</del></li></ul>

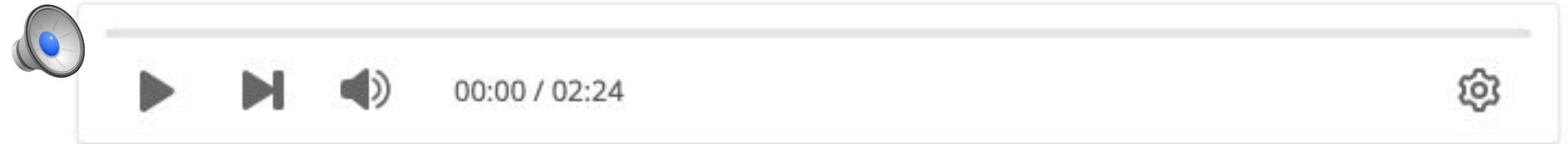
