if clause	main clause
Present Simple	Future Simple



If Mary **invites** me to her birthday party, I **will give** her a nice present.

Using a Comma (,) in Conditional Sentences

If it doesn't rain, we will go for a walk.

We will go for a walk **if** it doesn't rain.

and put the verb
in the correct form.**

I **will have** a nice dinner
if I **find** some cheese.

the cat **will wake** up.

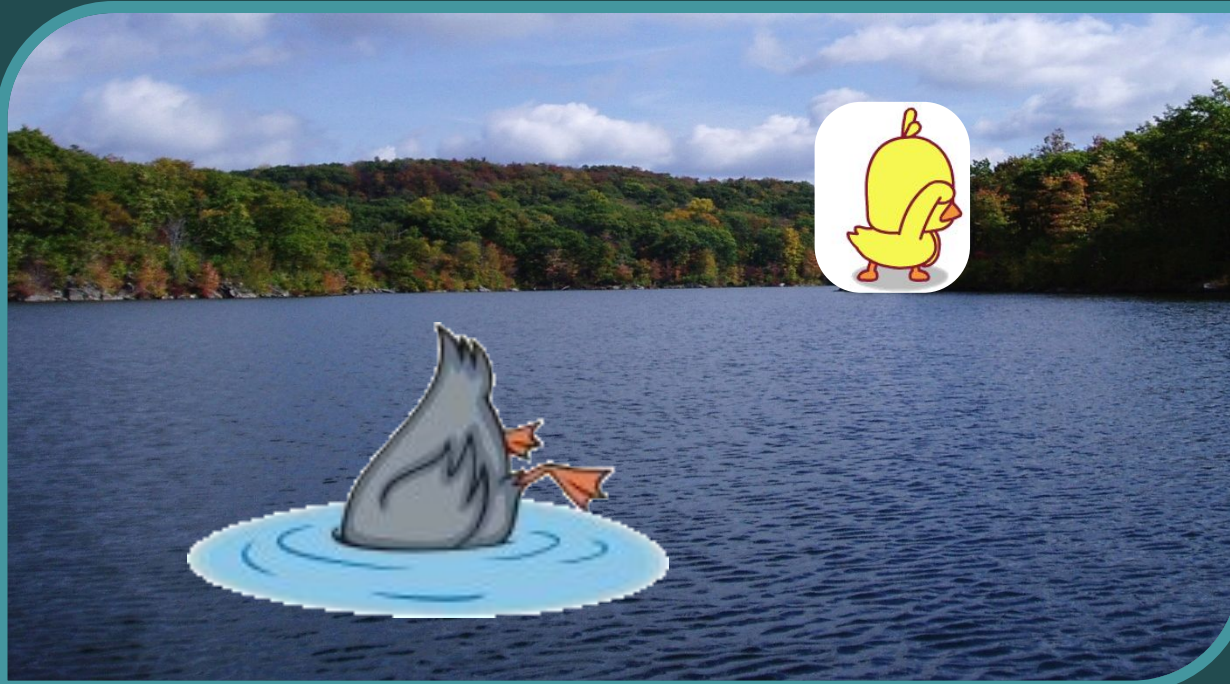

you **will be** always hungry.

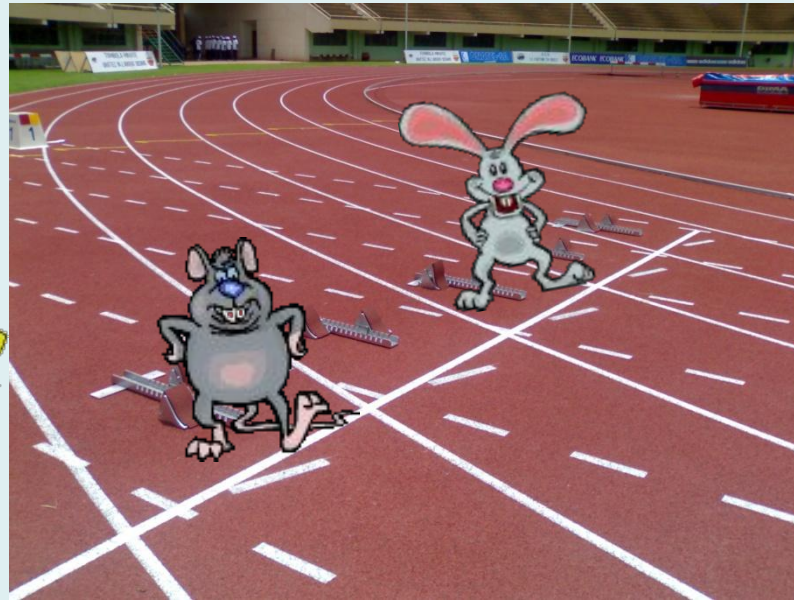

It's a Milkweed Tussock moth **caterpillar.**



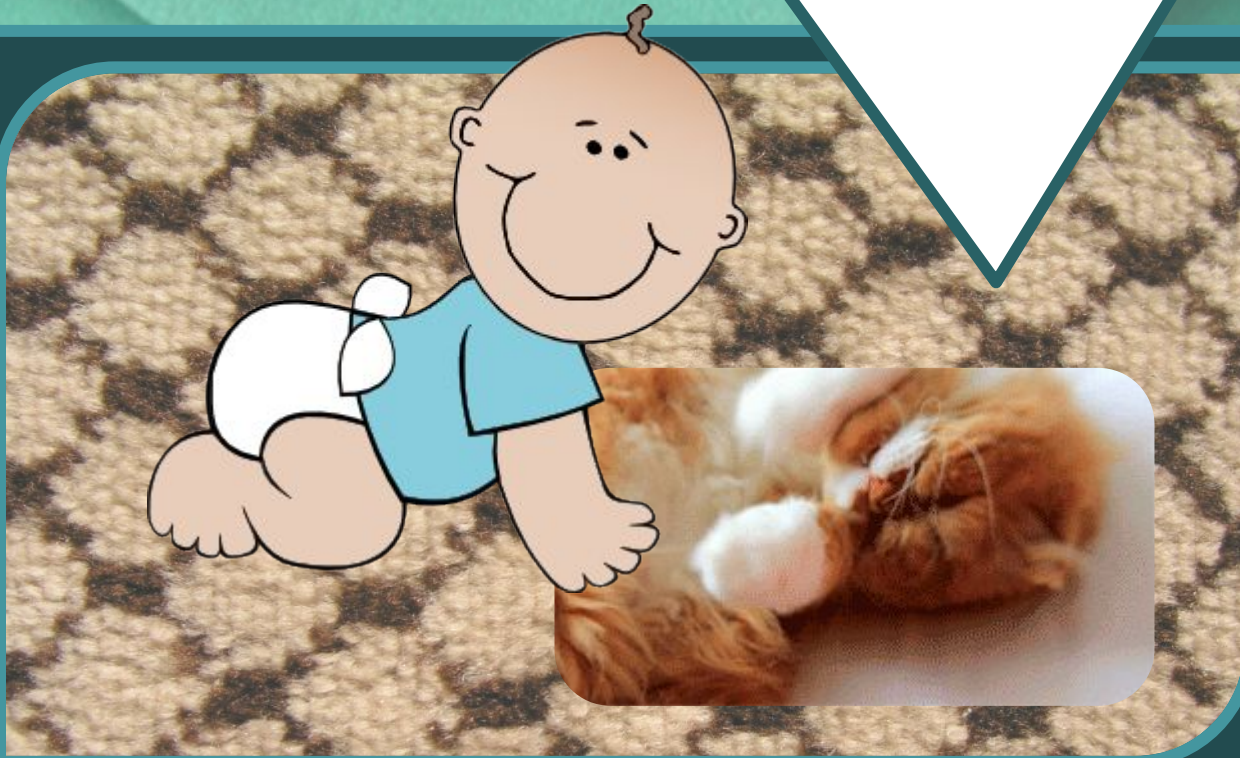

If the owner **lets** us go, we **will have** a happy life in the wilderness.

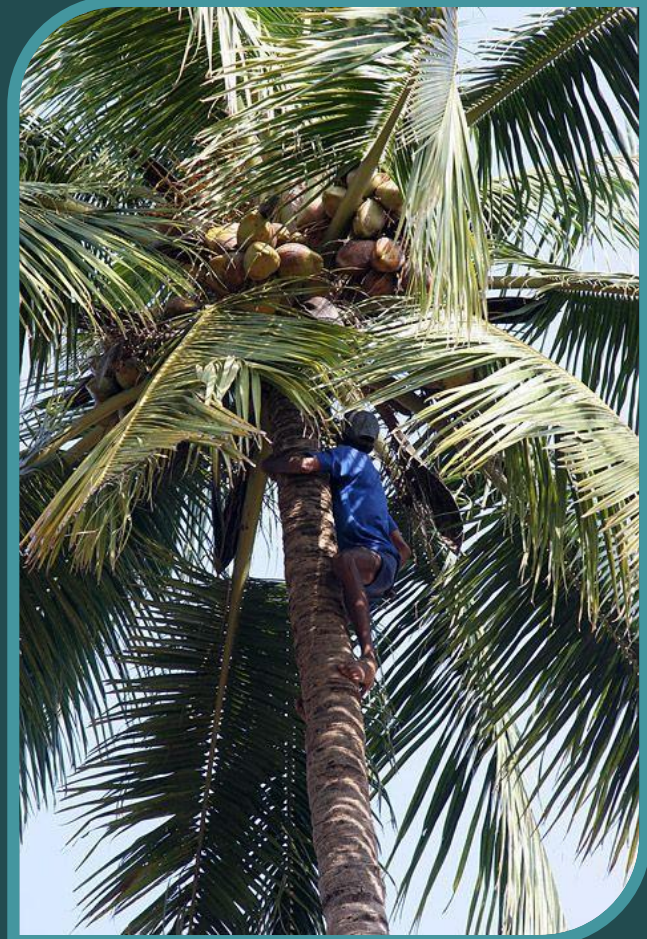
