(A Bushman legend)



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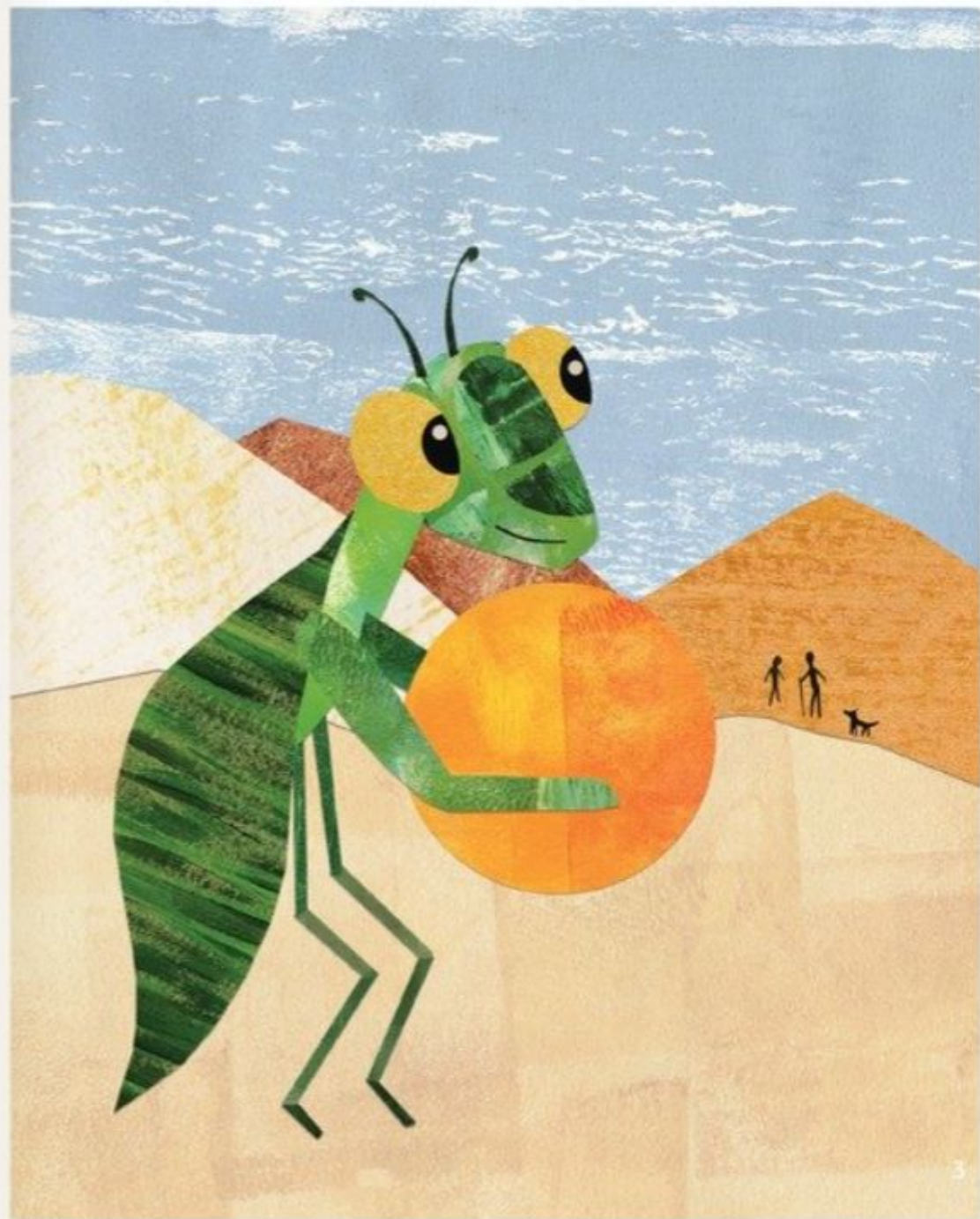


In the beginning, Mantis had fire.

Fire would just hurt them.

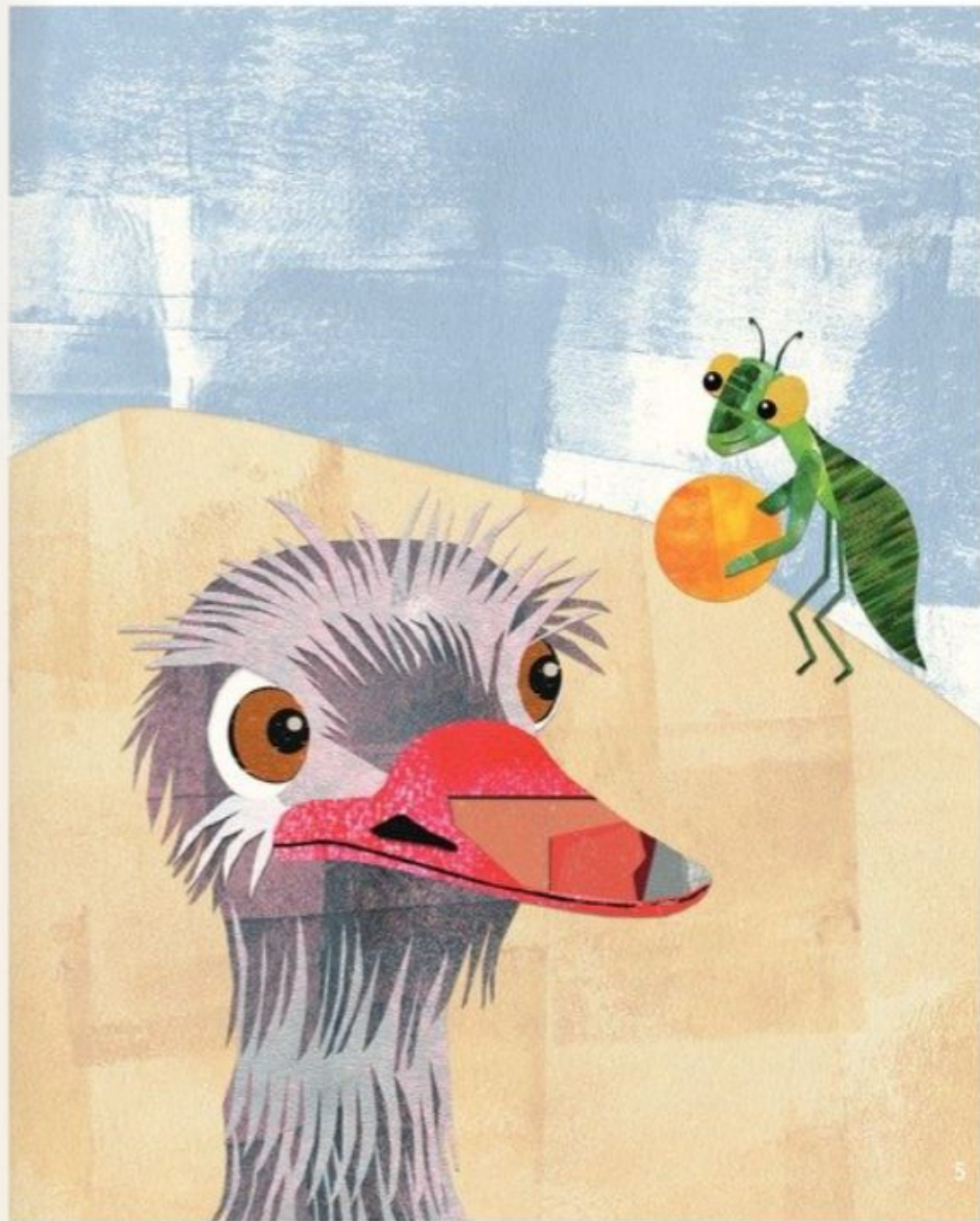




But Mantis knew that Ostrich was a clever and stubborn bird.

And if someone did take fire from clever Ostrich, then they would be worthy of having fire!





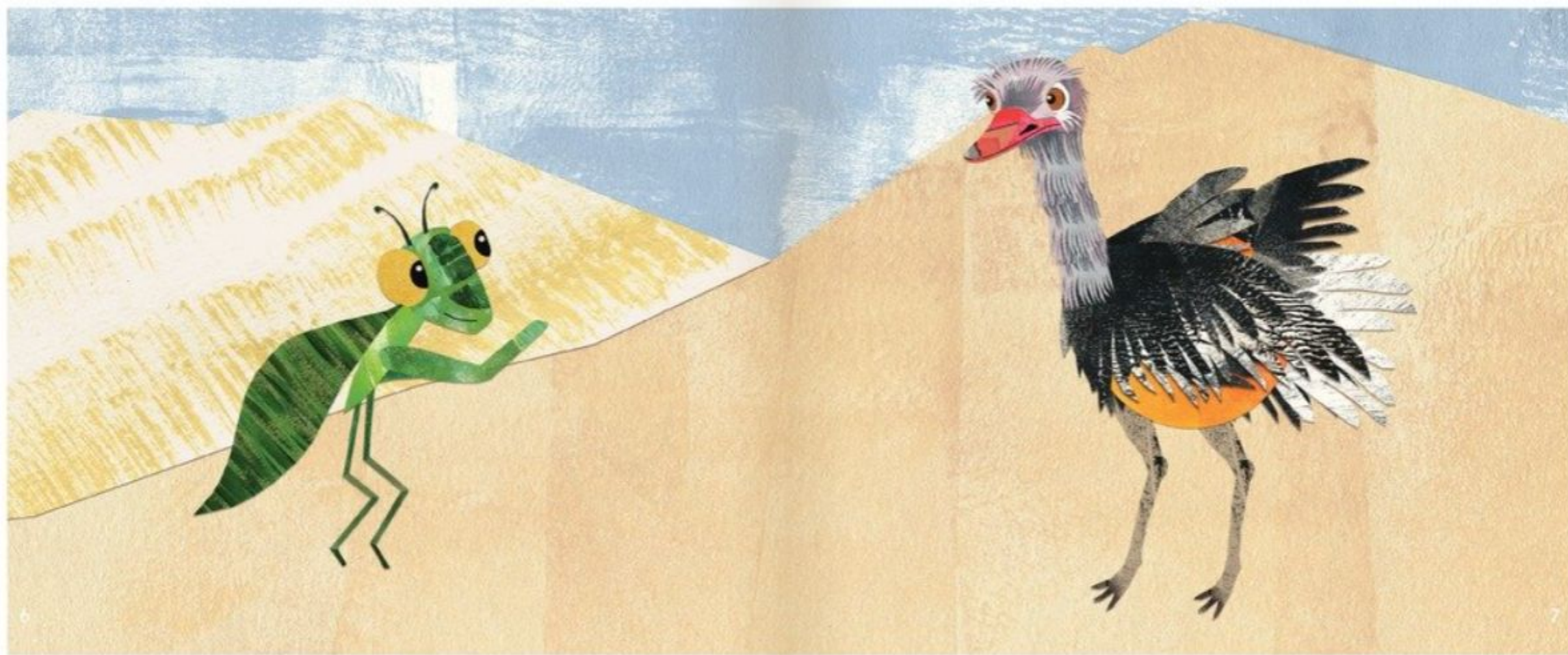
Mantis went down into the valley to visit Ostrich.

Then he left.





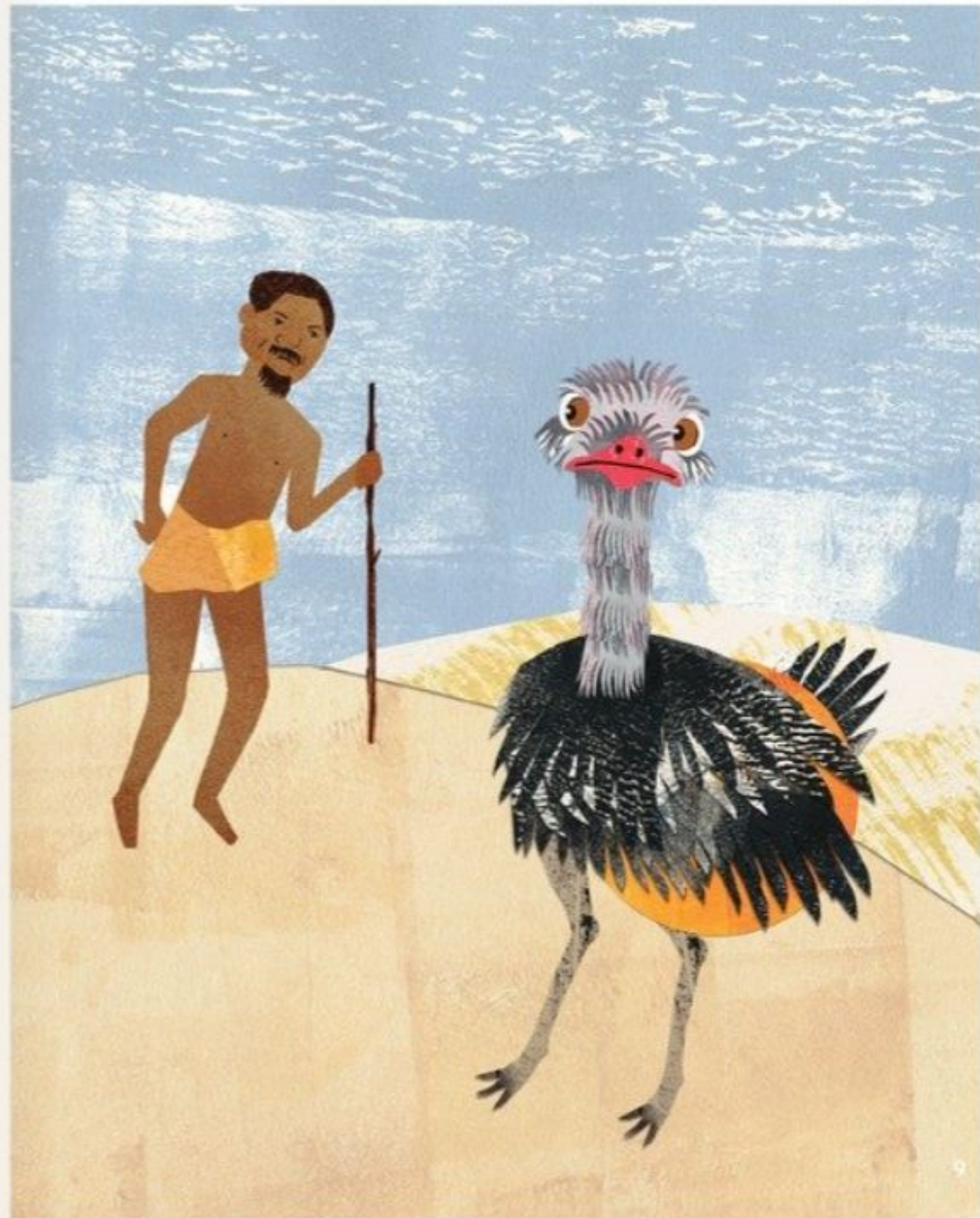
But soon the First Bushman saw the flickering flames.

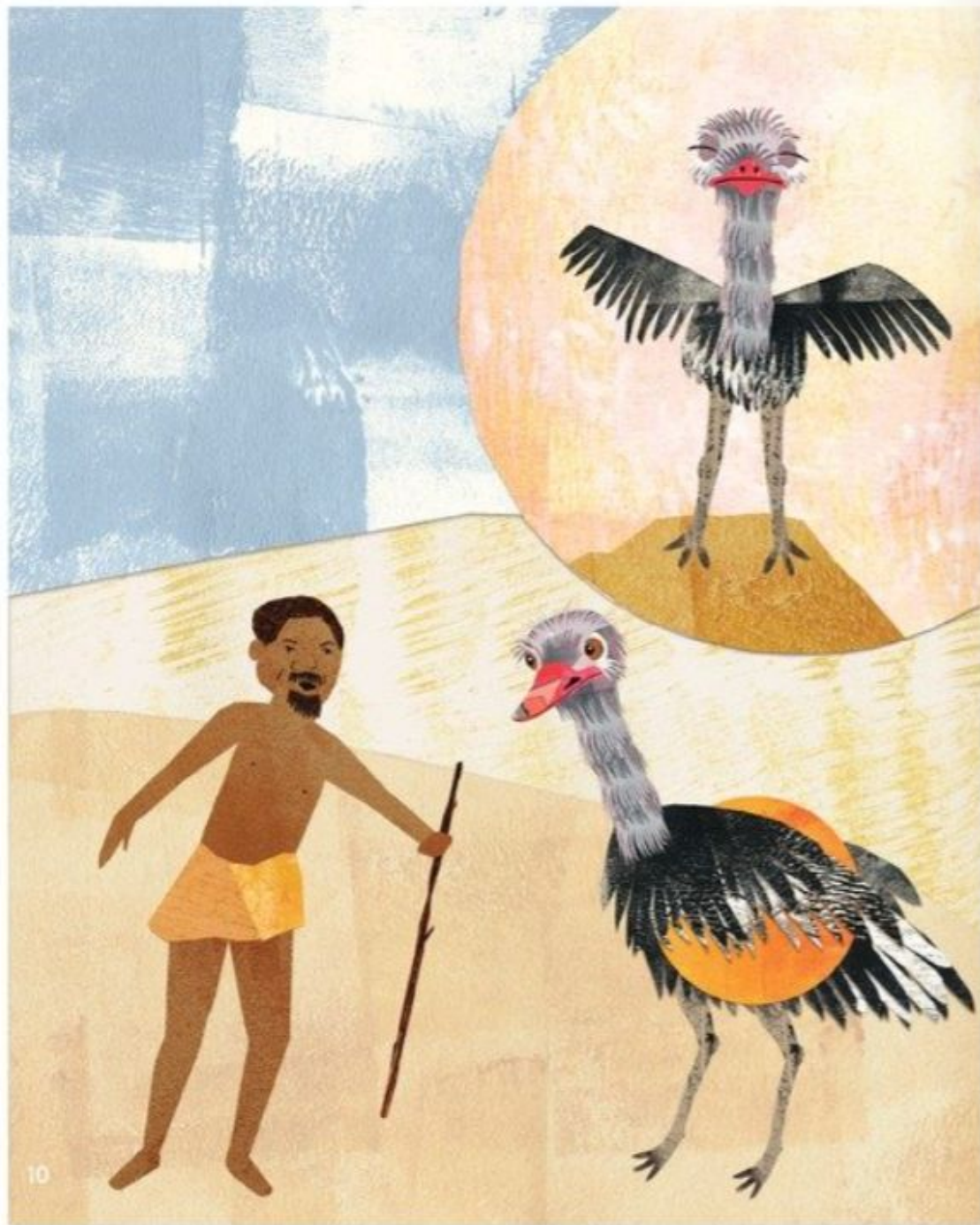
He knew that fire was hidden under Ostrich's wing!

But the First Bushman was waiting!



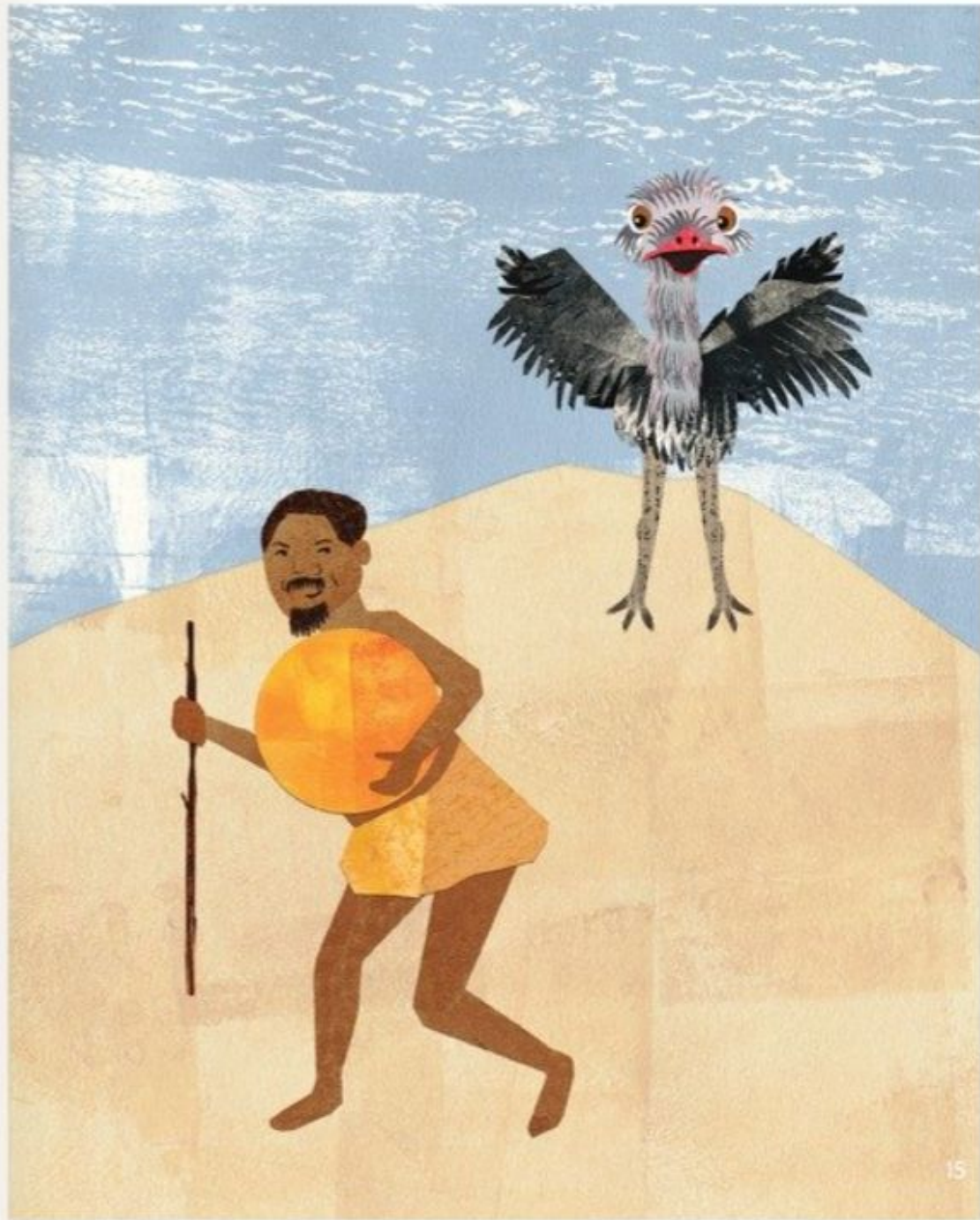
The First Bushman was well hidden and

wing.

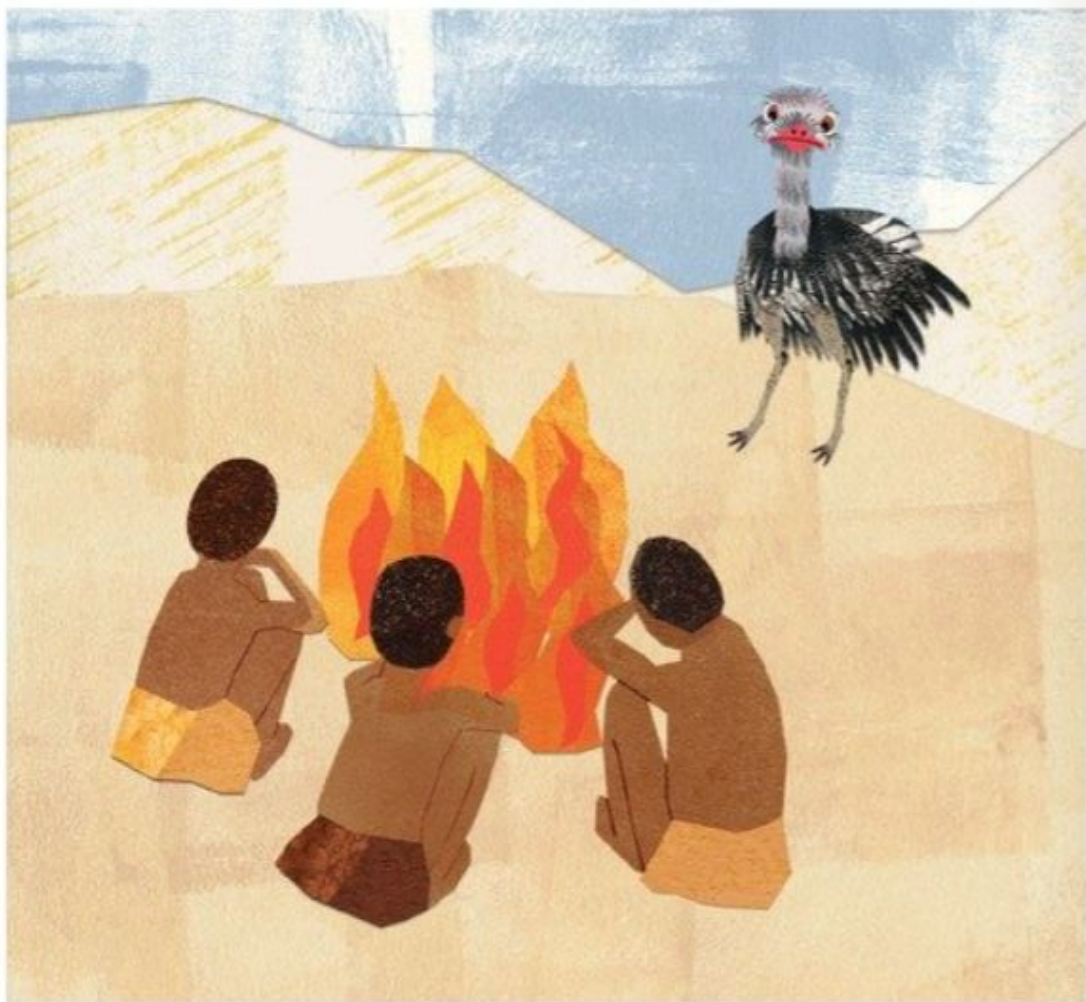
Then he ran off!
