

THE PRESENT SIMPLE 1

THE PRESENT SIMPLE: AFFIRMATIVE

We form the present simple with the infinitive of the verb:

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1) S + infinitive 2) S + infinitive + s/es
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I work He works

You work She works

We work It works

You work

They work

RULES FOR THE 3RD PERSON SINGULAR

- In general: infinitive + s
 I read → he reads
 - 2) Verbs ending in -yI play \rightarrow he plays * I study \rightarrow he studies
 - 3) Verbs ending in -0, sh, tch, x, ss + es
 - I go \rightarrow he goes I wash \rightarrow he washes
 - I watch \rightarrow he watches I fix \rightarrow he fixes
 - I kiss \rightarrow he kisses

USES

To talk about activities we usually do:

I go to school every day

Time references:

Every day, week, month, year...

On Sundays, at weekend, in summer...

She studies French in the afternoon

Adverbs of frequency are often used:

Always, usually, often, sometimes, never...

He never watches TV after lunch

Make affirmative sentences 1 (he/go)



He goes to school

Make affirmative sentences 2 (They/eat)



They eat a lot

Make affirmative sentences 3 (She/surf)



She surfs the Internet

Make affirmative sentences 4 (I/play)



I play the flute

Make affirmative sentences 5 (She/cry)



She cries

Negative form

For the negative form: S+ auxiliary verb (do, does) + not+ infinitive (contracted forms: don't/ doesn't)

I don't play He doesn't read You don't dance She doesn't study We don't eat It doesn't sleep They don't like

Make negative sentences 1 (They/read)



They don't read

Make negative sentences 2 (She/love)



She doesn't love him

Make negative sentences 3 (He/drive)



He doesn't drive

Make negative sentences 4 (He/work)



He doesn't work

Make negative sentences 5 (They/sing)



They don't sing
