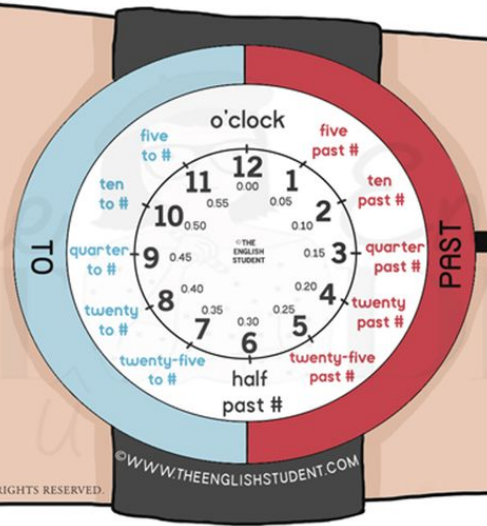

**12:50** = TEN TO ONE / TWELVE FIFTY

# Comparatives: Short adjectives

Short adjectives ...	Spelling rules	Examples
Usually	+ er	slow → slower fast → faster tall → taller
Ending in -e	+ r	large → larger nice → nicer
Some two-syllable adjectives, especially ending in -y	-y → -i + er	hungry → hungrier happy → happier funny → funnier
Ending in a vowel + a consonant	double the consonant + er	big → bigger fat → fatter fit → fitter

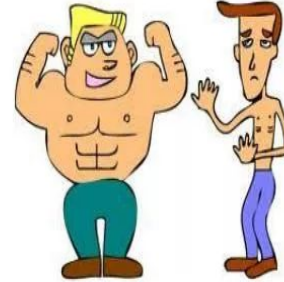
# COMPARATIVE ADJECTIVES

When comparing 2 things.

- *One syllable adjectives:* add -er

Cold → colder

High → higher



- *One syllable adjectives ending in one vowel + consonant:*  
double the consonant and add -er

Big → bigger

Hot → hotter

**NOUN 1 + verb + COMPARATIVE ADJECTIVE + THAN + NOUN 2**

Southern states are colder than northern states.



Positive	Comparative	Superlative
adjective	adjective + <b>-er</b>	(the)adjective+ <b>-est</b>
long	<b>longer</b>	<b>the longest</b>
tall	<b>taller</b>	<b>the tallest</b>
small	<b>smaller</b>	<b>the smallest</b>

Big	Bigger	The biggest
Hot	Hotter	The hottest
Wet	Wetter	The wettest
Sad	Sadder	The saddest
Thin	Thinner	The thinnest





Positive	Comparative	Superlative
4. simple  cruel	simpler/ <b>more</b> simple	the simplest/ the <b>most</b> simple
<b>friendly, clever, common, gentle, polite, handsome, narrow, pleasant, quiet</b>		
5. <b>good</b> <b>bad</b> <b>many/ much</b> <b>little</b> <b>far</b>  <b>old</b>	<b>better</b> <b>worse</b> <b>more</b> <b>less</b> <b>farther/ further</b>  <b>older/ elder</b>	<b>the best</b> <b>the worst</b> <b>the most</b> <b>the least</b> <b>the farthest/ furthest</b>  <b>the oldest/ eldest</b>

ADJECTIVE	COMPARATIVE ( <b>more</b> )	SUPERLATIVE ( <b>most</b> )
Comfortable	<b>More</b> comfortable	The <b>most</b> comfortable
Interesting	<b>More</b> interesting	The <b>most</b> interesting
Expensive	<b>More</b> expensive	The <b>most</b> expensive
Beautiful	<b>More</b> beautiful	The <b>most</b> beautiful
Difficult	<b>More</b> difficult	The <b>most</b> difficult
