

3. CHANGES IN LEGISLATION BASED ON PROVISIONS ESTABLISHED BY THE EU

4. CHANGES IN THE SOCIAL ASSISTANCE PACKAGE FOR IMMIGRANTS

EFFECTS FOR THE EUROPEAN UNION

- 1. PARTIAL LOSS OF MARKETS IN THE UK IS POSSIBLE
- 2. PERHAPS THE DEVELOPMENT OF A NEW WAVE OF SEPARATISM AGAINST THE EU IN ALMOST ALL ITS STATES, BUT ESPECIALLY IN GREECE, SWEDEN AND FINLAND
- 3. THE GROWTH OF THE EURO AGAINST THE POUND
- 4. PARTIAL OR COMPLETE EXPULSION FROM ENGLAND OF LABOR MIGRANTS
- 5. CREATION OF A CHECKPOINT AT THE ENTRANCE TO THE TUNNEL UNDER THE CHANNEL, WHICH WILL GREATLY INCREASE THE TRAVEL TIME OF THE PARIS-LONDON TRAIN
