The main thesis of the book

- Jan Hus was a Czech patriot and fighter against Catholic obscurantism;
- The feudal system was not equitable;
- Hussite wars were the peasant rebellion against feudal exploitation and foreign aggression;
- Hussite wars became international.

Briefly about the book itself

- It contains background of the Hussite movement in pre-hussite epoch, biography and ideas of Hus himself and the Hussite wars in general;
- The main description is finished by Lipan battle and Prague compacts (agreement) between the moderate part of hussites and the Catholic Europe.
