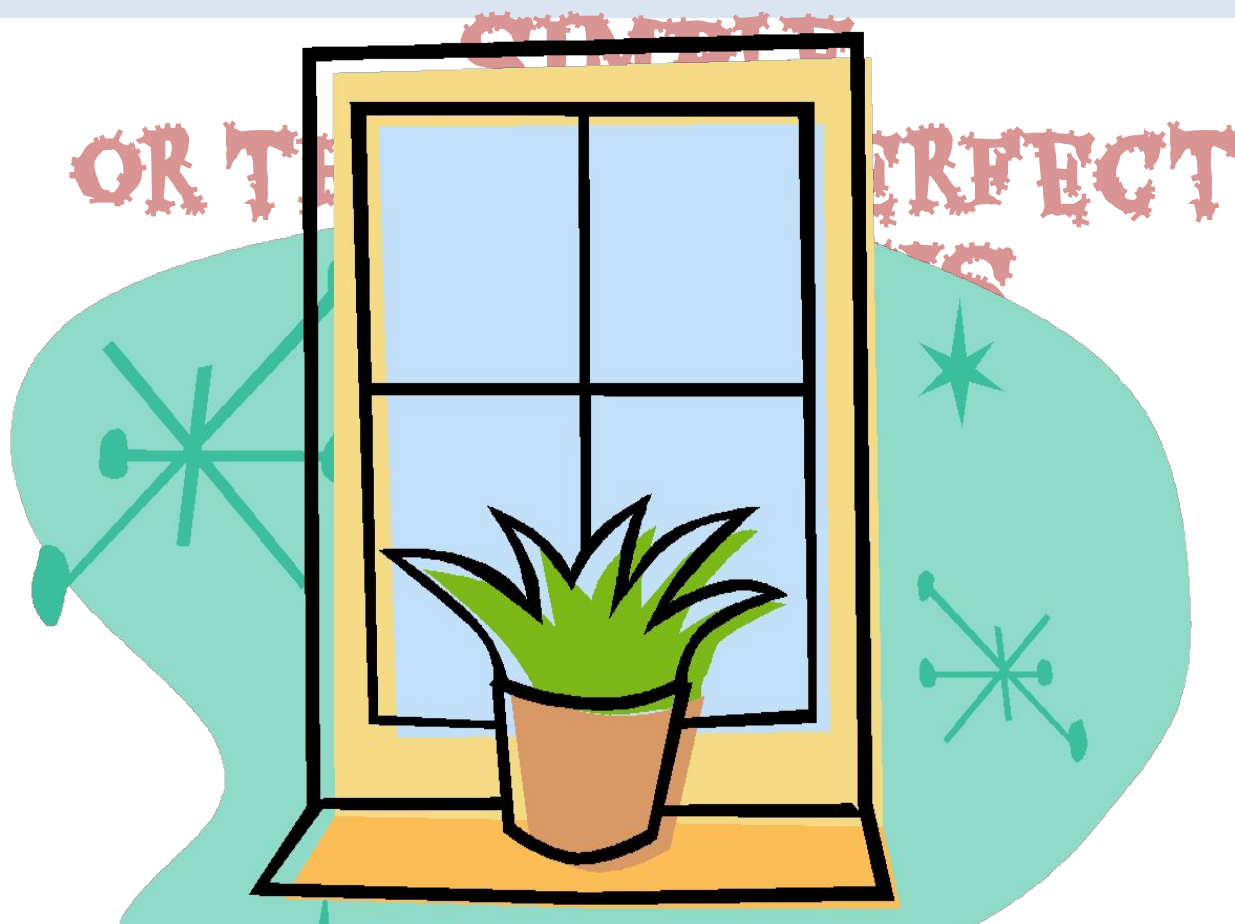

(never/see) him before.

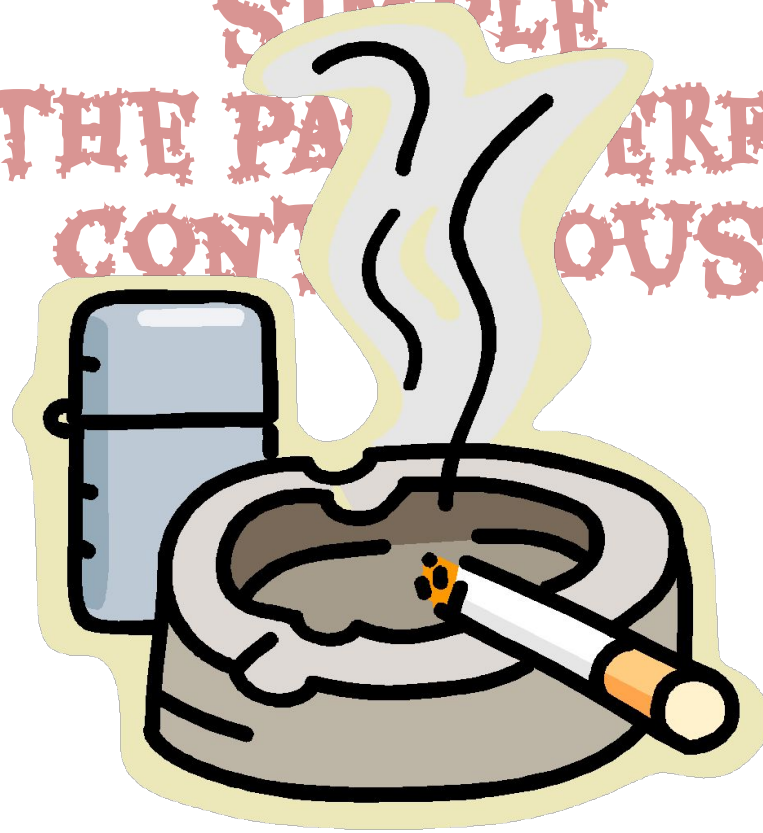






# COMPLETE THE SENTENCES WITH THE PAST PERFECT
