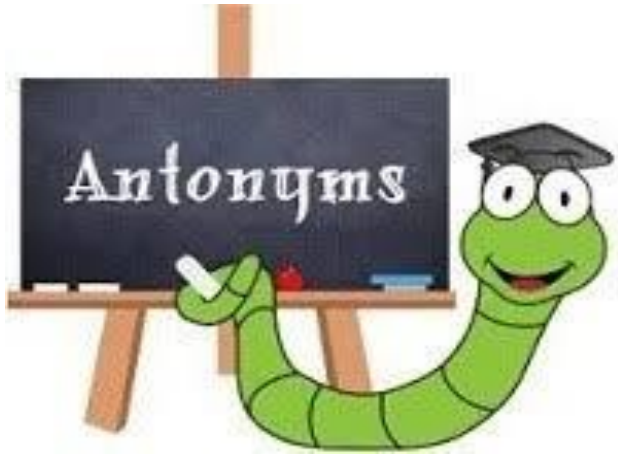

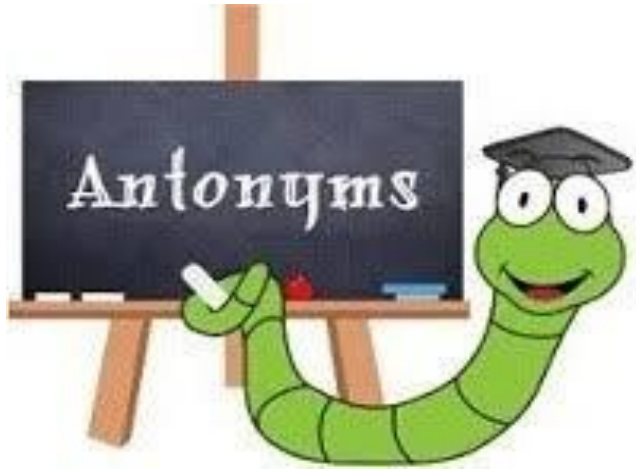


- ❑ Unmoved

Enhancement-improvement-enrichment

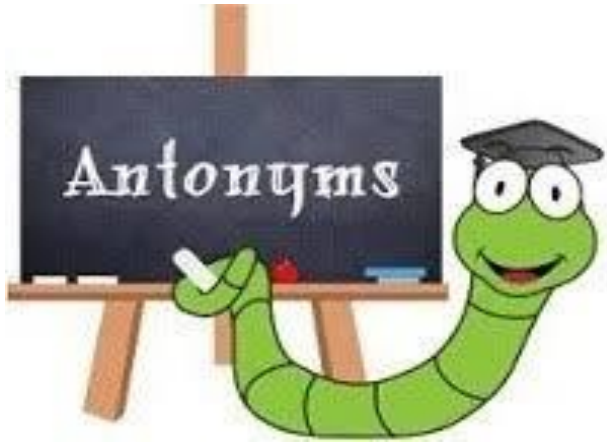


- ❑ Injury
