HAVE TO

- We use **HAVE TO** to express obligation (when something is necessary) in the present or future.



Examples:

The boys **have to** study hard.



The boy **has to** wake up at 7 o'clock in the morning.



Affirmative Sentences



S + HAVE TO/ HAS TO + VERB + COMPLEMENT

□ **I / YOU / WE / THEY** → **HAVE TO**

You **HAVE TO** arrive on time to classes



□ **SHE / HE / IT** → **HAS TO**



She **HAS TO** brush her teeth everyday

DON'T HAVE TO

- We use **DON'T HAVE TO** to express absence of obligation (=when something is not necessary to do)



The children **don't have to** go to school today.
It's Saturday!



She **doesn't have to** eat all the fruits.



Negative Sentences

S + DON'T HAVE TO/ DOESN'T HAVE TO + VERB + COMPLEMENT

□ I / YOU / WE / THEY → D

We don't have to get up early on

□ SHE / HE / IT → DOES

He doesn't have to get up early



DO/ DOES + S + HAVE TO+ COMPLEMENT?

□ DO → I/ YOU/ WE/ THEY HAVE TO...?

□ DOES → HE/ SHE/ IT HAVE TO...?



QUESTIONS

□ Do you **have to** eat the vegetables?

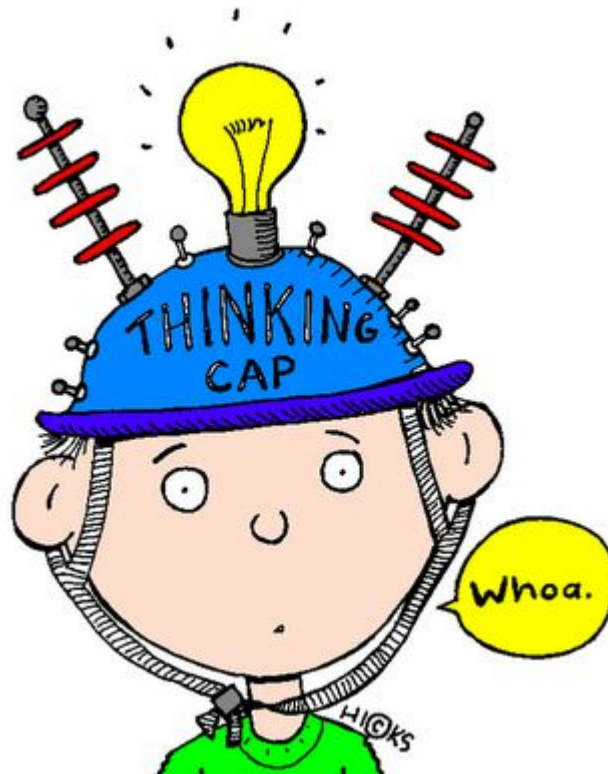
Yes, I do. / No, I don't

□ Does he **have to** eat the vegetables?

Yes, he does/ No, he doesn't
