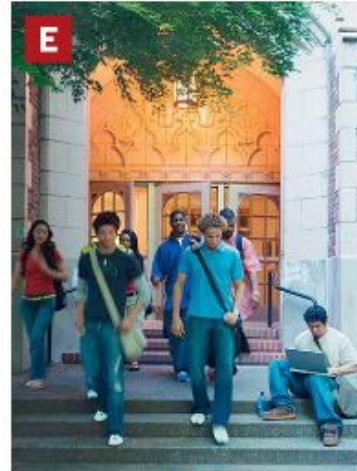



PRESENT SIMPLE

When we use the third person in Singular (he/she/it) in Present Simple, we add the ending –s to the verb.

EXAMPLE: He works on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.

PRESENT SIMPLE

Regular spelling		Singular	The third person singular
-s in most cases		work	s/he works s
		drive	s/he drives s
		play	s/he plays s
		run	s/he runs s

PRESENT SIMPLE

-es when a verb ends with:	-o	do	s/he does es
	-ss	miss	s/he misses es
	-x	mix	s/he mixes es
	-ch	catch	catch es
	-sh	push	push es

PRESENT SIMPLE

consonant + <i>-y</i> turns into	-ies	cry	s/he cries
		fly	s/he flies

vowel + - y takes -s	-s	buy	bu y s
