Whose?

This is **my** identity card.

Is this **your** sport?

That is **his** driving licence.

Is this **her** telephone?

These are **its** toys.

Our flat is on the 3rd floor.

Where is **your** car?

Those are **their** snowboards.

Yes, it's **mine**.
