Present Continuous

UNFINISHED ACTIONS NOW

I'm working at the moment.

Use with: now, at the moment.

TEMPORARY SITUATIONS

I'm living in London.

Use with: at the moment, for a few weeks, for a couple of months.

TEMPORARY HABITS

He's eating a lot these days.

Use with: at the moment, these days.

ANNOYING HABITS

You're forever losing your keys!

Use with: always, forever, constantly.

DEFINITE FUTURE PLANS

I'm meeting my father tomorrow.

Use with: tomorrow, later, at 7pm tonight, on Tuesday.

PRESENT
CONTINUOUS

We use Present Continuous

1. to express things happening at the time of speaking.

It's raining now. Stay at home.

2. to express temporary situations.

We are working hard today.

3. to express irritation.

He is always arguing!

4. to show that something is changing.

The weather is getting colder and colder.

5. to express future planned actions.

We're leaving for New York this evening.

+

I **am working** now.

She **is working** now.

They **are working** now

-

She **isn't working** now.

?

Is she working now? Yes, she **is**.

Why are they working now?

Mind the spelling rules.

★ Remember:

It's raining.

BUT

We're getting wet.

The sun is shining.

get + **t** + **-ing** = getting

shine**e** – shining



➤ We usually add **-ing** to the verb to form the present participle.

wait – waiting; wear – wearing; read – reading

➤ When verbs end in one or more consonant + **e**, we omit the **y** and add **-ing**.

come – coming; take – taking; save – saving

➤ When a verb has only one syllable and finishes with one vowel + one consonant (except w, x, y), we **double** the consonant and add **-ing**.

put – putting; chat – chatting; shop – shopping
