'Can I come, too?' asks Ben.




In the van, Grandpa says to Clunk, 'Let's go!'

Clunk starts the van and drives.







'My favorite fruit is the durian,' says Grandpa. 'We can find it in this rainforest.'

'Baby orangutans live with their mothers for years,' says Grandpa.




Two men walk out of the trees.

'No,' says Alice. 'You can't take him out of the rainforest. It's his home.'






Then a big durian falls from the tree! It hits the ground close to the men.

'I can smell it!' says his friend. 'It smells very bad!'







'But what about the baby orangutan?' asks Alice.






Rainforest Animals


