SUBJECT

- NOUN

PREDICATE

- VERB

SIMPLE SENTENCES

COMPOUND SUBJECT:

Two or more people, places, or things with the same predicate

Examples:

John and Sussy like ice cream.

Madrid and Paris are two beautiful cities.

These tables and chairs are painted white.

SIMPLE SENTENCES

COMPOUND PREDICATE:

One subject doing two or more things

Examples:

Pablo danced and sang all night.

The pretty blue bird drank and ate fast.

Simple sentence definition

A sentence containing only one <u>independent</u>
<u>clause</u> and no <u>dependent</u>
<u>clauses</u>: "He went home after class." (*Compar* <u>e complex sentence, compound</u>
<u>sentence</u>, and <u>compound-complex sentence</u>.)
