- SUBJECT

PREDICATE

- VERB

SIMPLE SENTENCES

COMPOUND SUBJECT:

Two or more people, places, or things with the same predicate

Examples:

John and Sussy like ice cream.

Madrid and Paris are two beautiful cities.

These tables and chairs are painted white.

SIMPLE SENTENCES

COMPOUND PREDICATE:

One subject doing two or more things

Examples:

Pablo **danced and sang** all night.

The pretty blue bird **drank and ate** fast.

Simple sentence definition

- A sentence containing only one independent clause and no dependent clauses : “He went home after class.” (*Compare complex sentence, compound sentence, and compound-complex sentence.*.)
