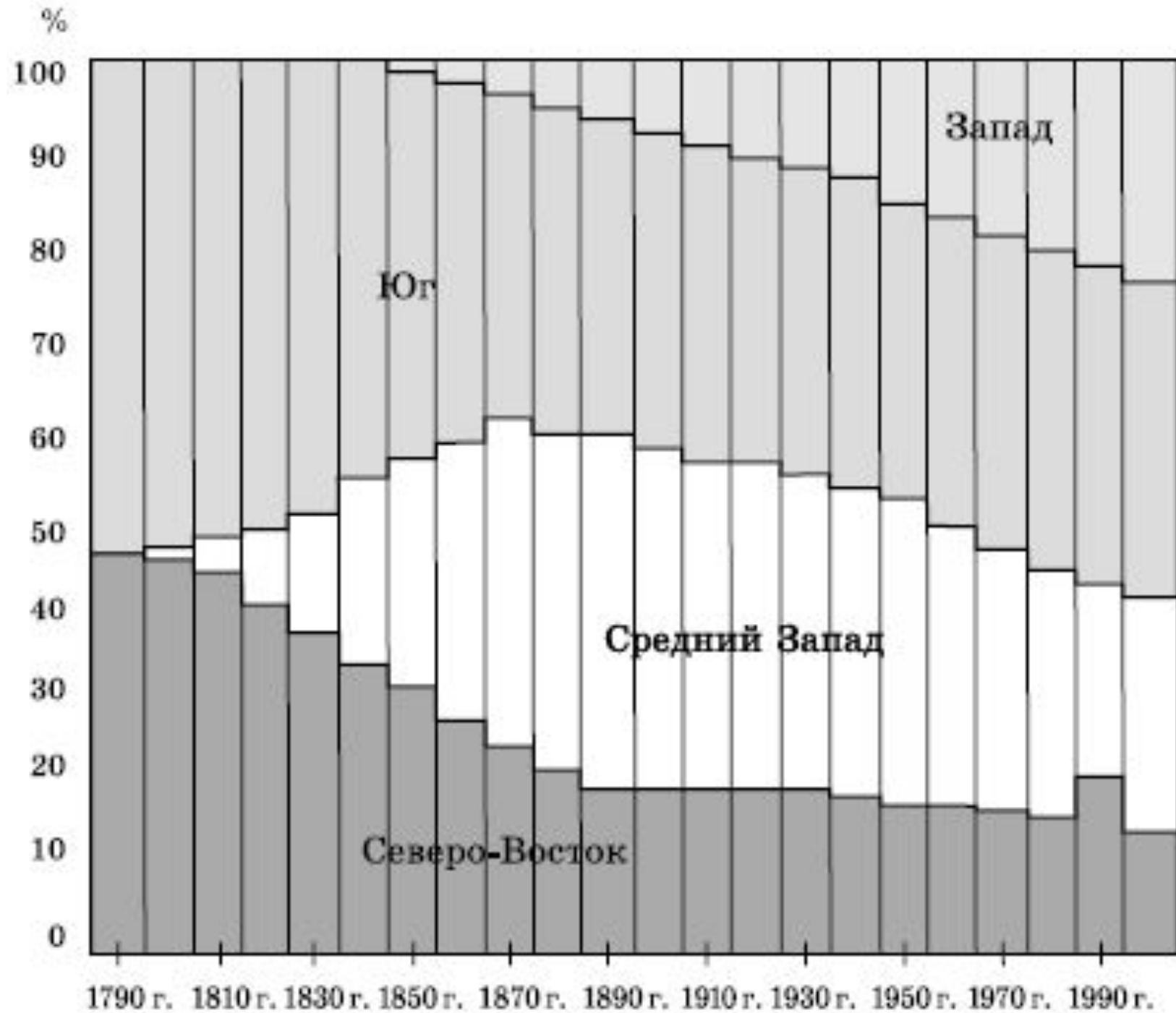






Mean Center of Population for the United States: 1790 to 2010

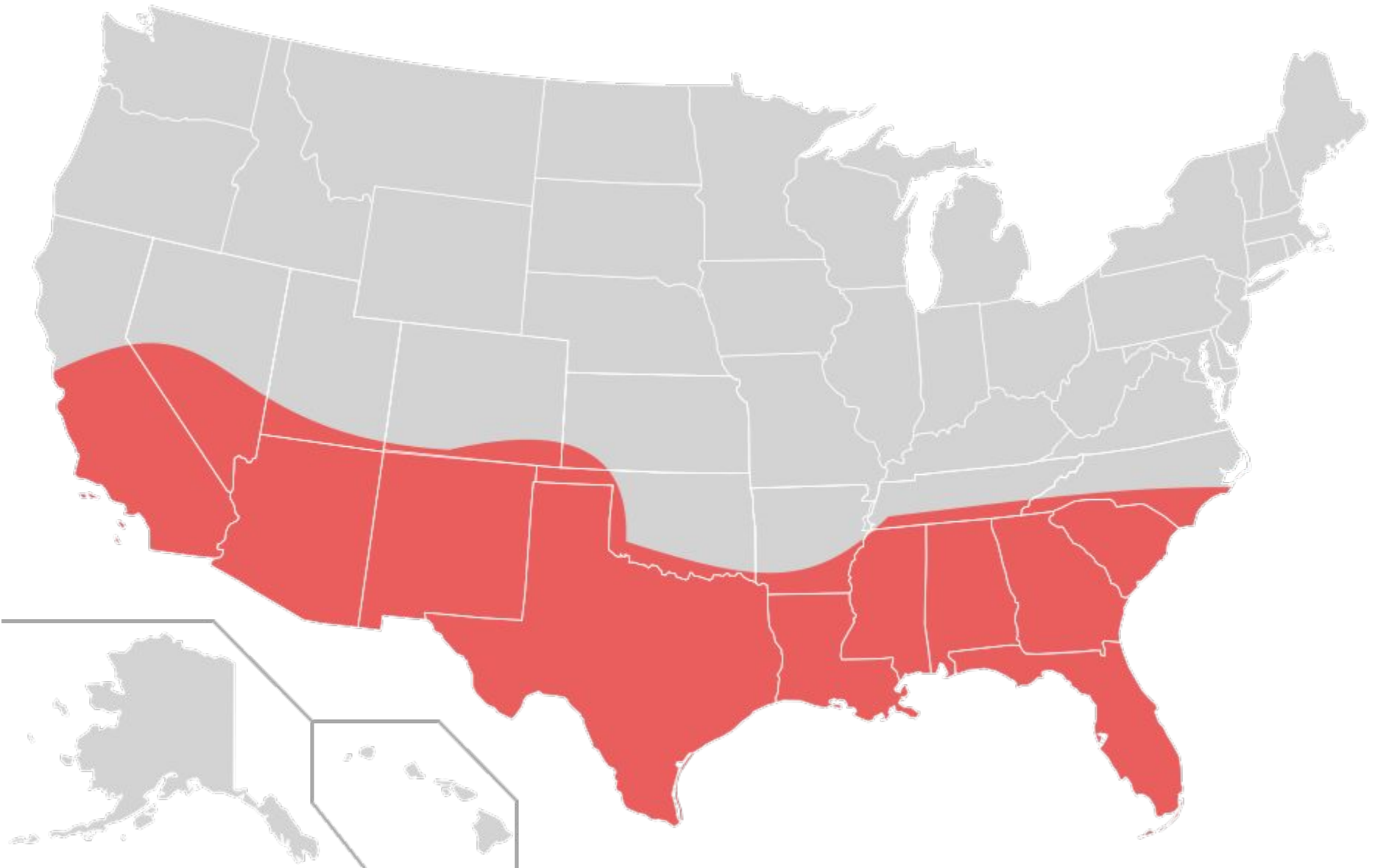

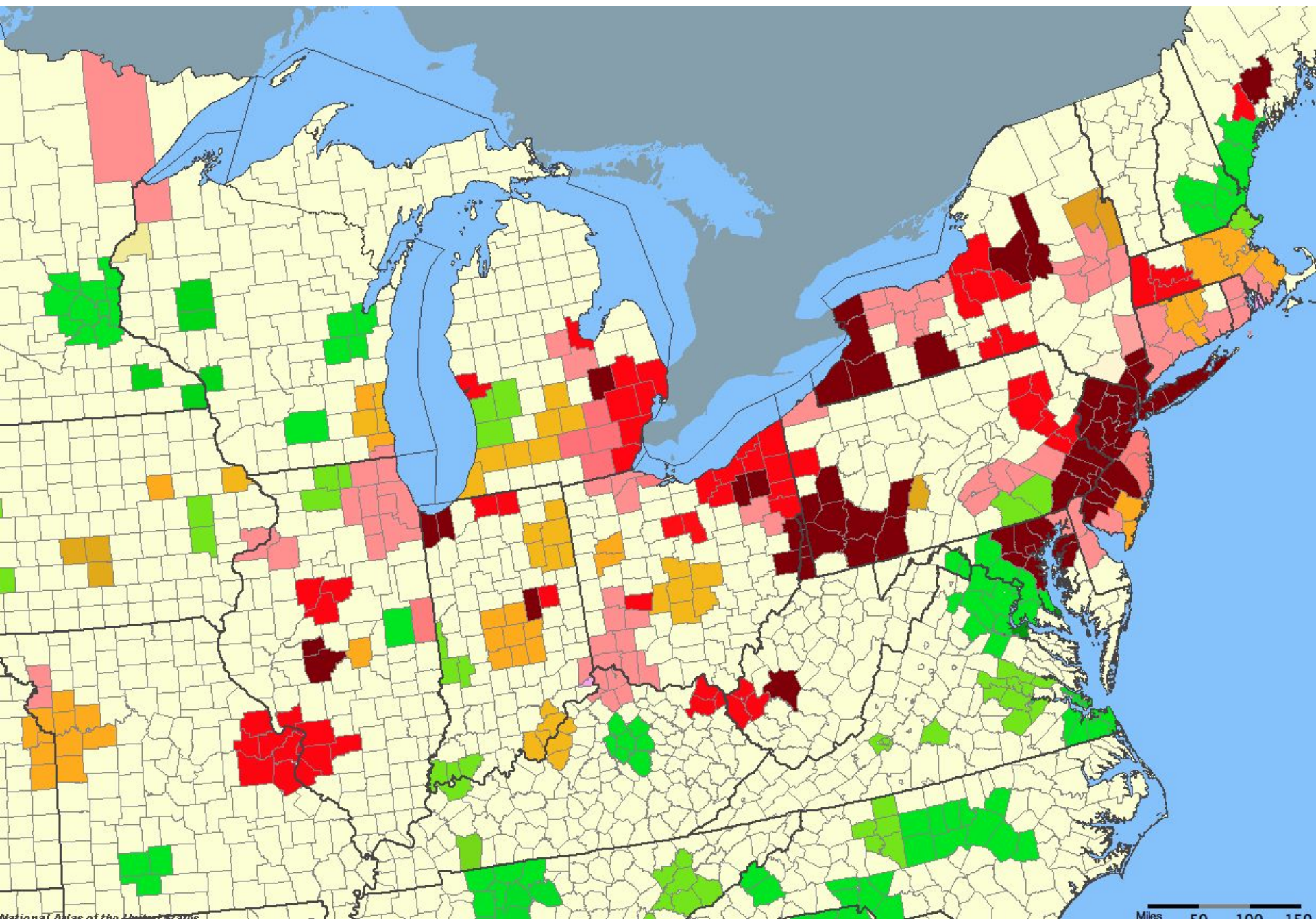

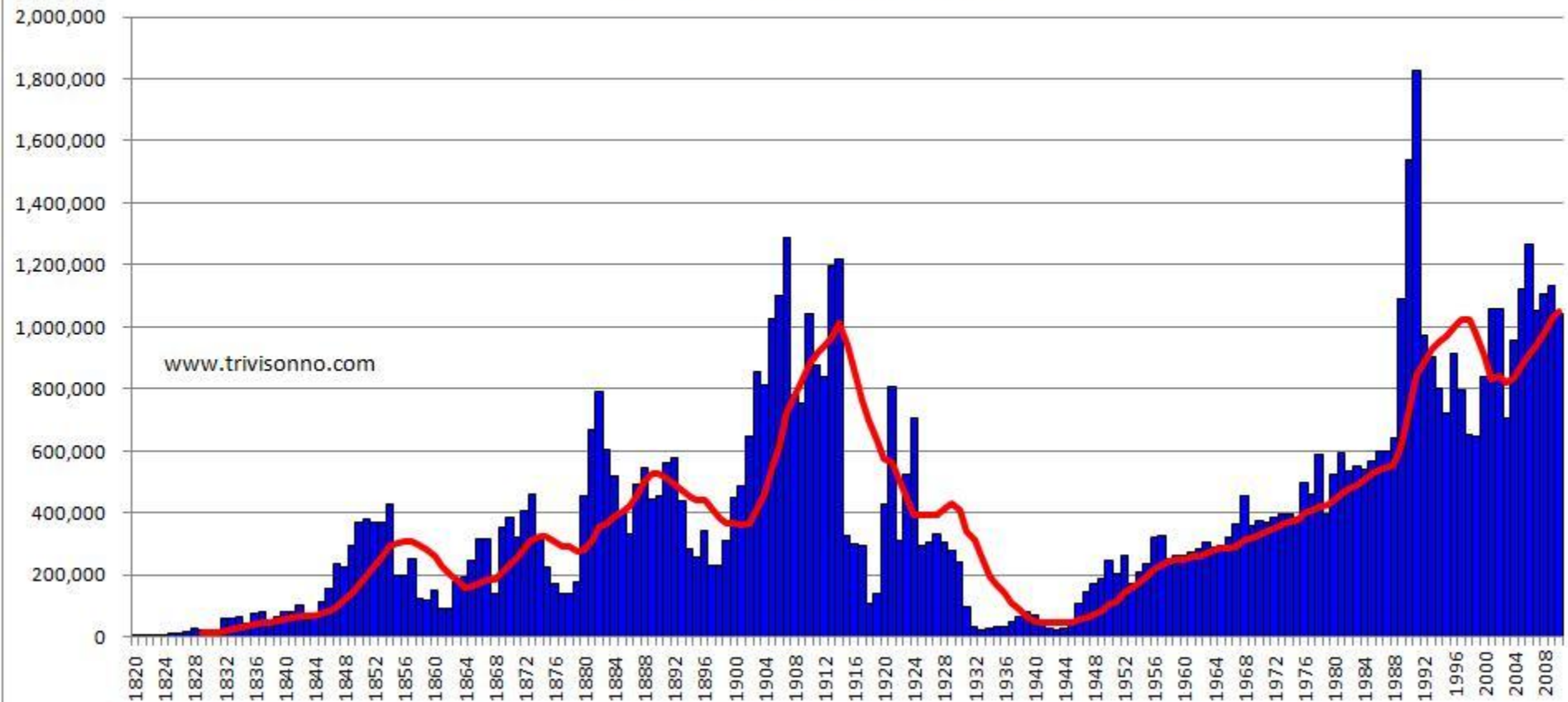

Annual Legal Immigration to the USA - 1820-2010

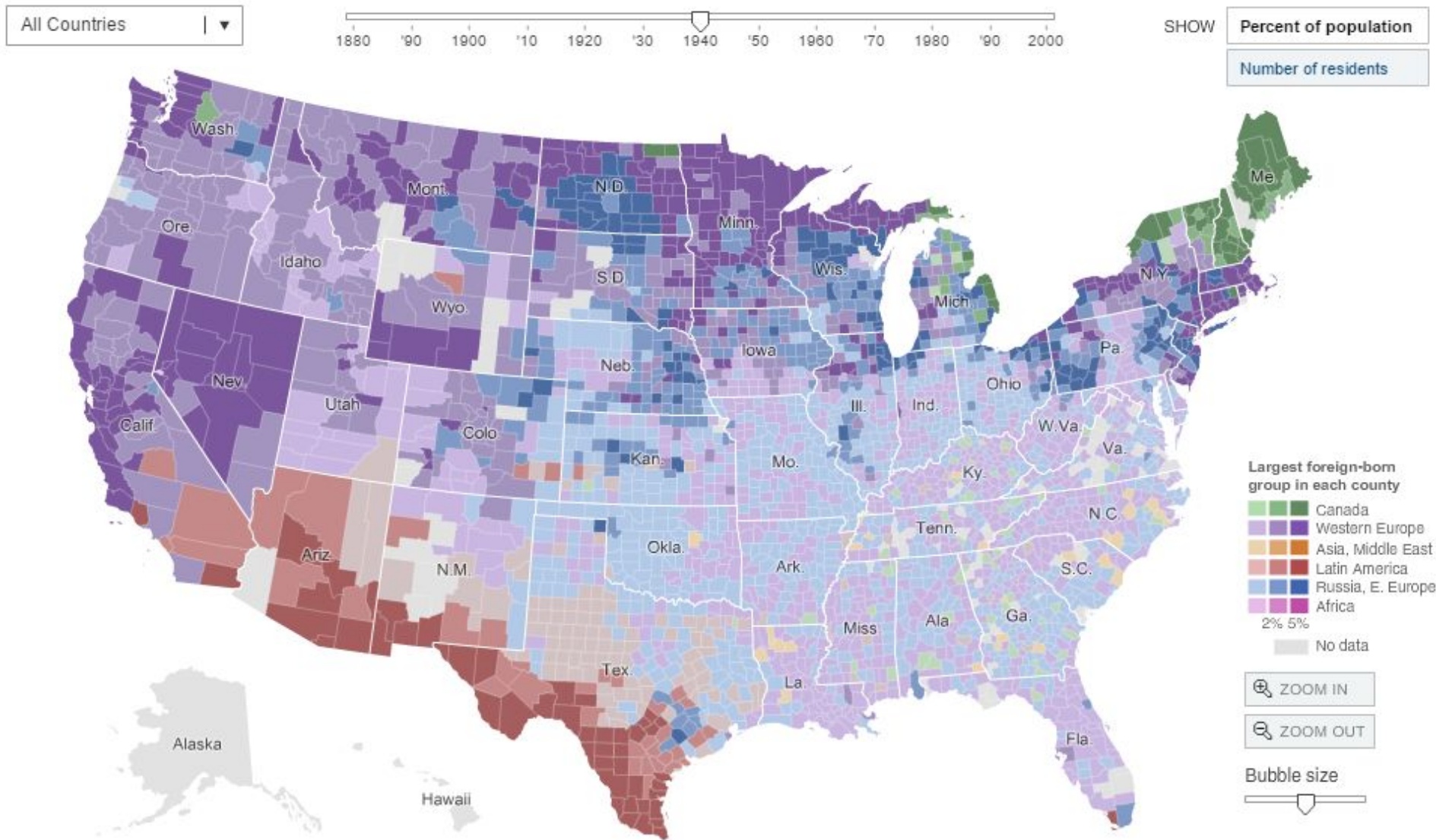
With 10-year moving average (red line)

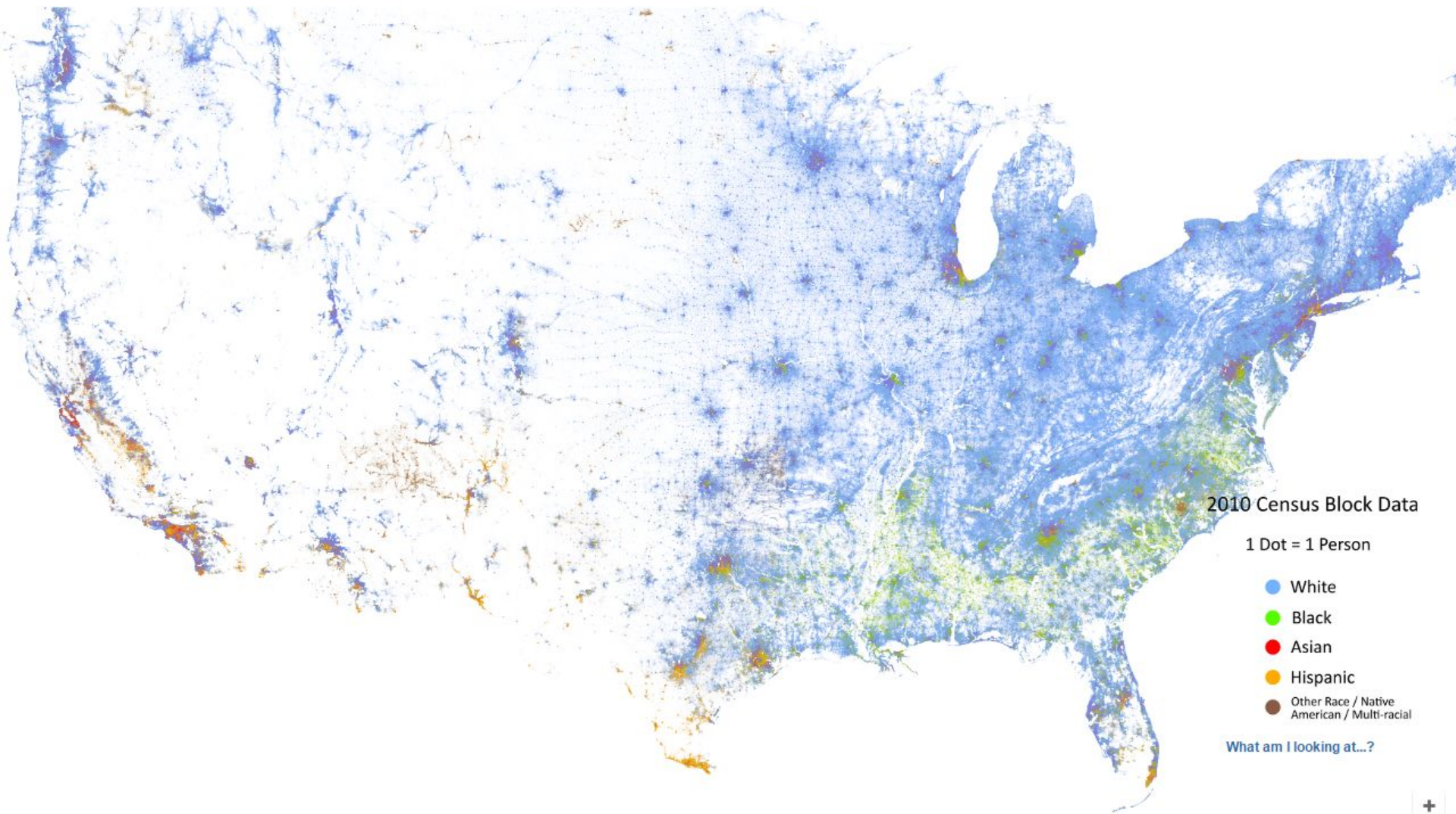

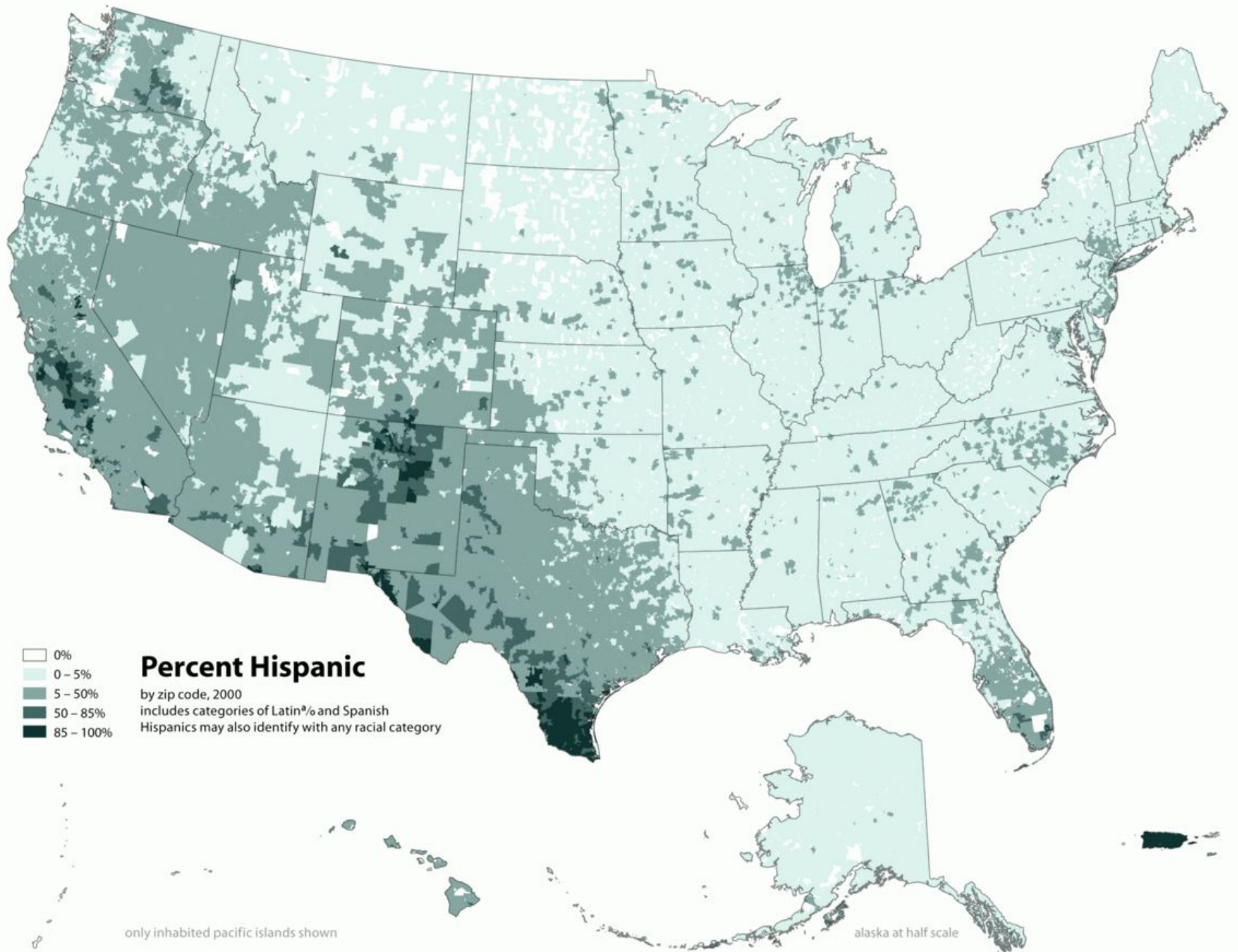

Percentage of African American population living in the American South

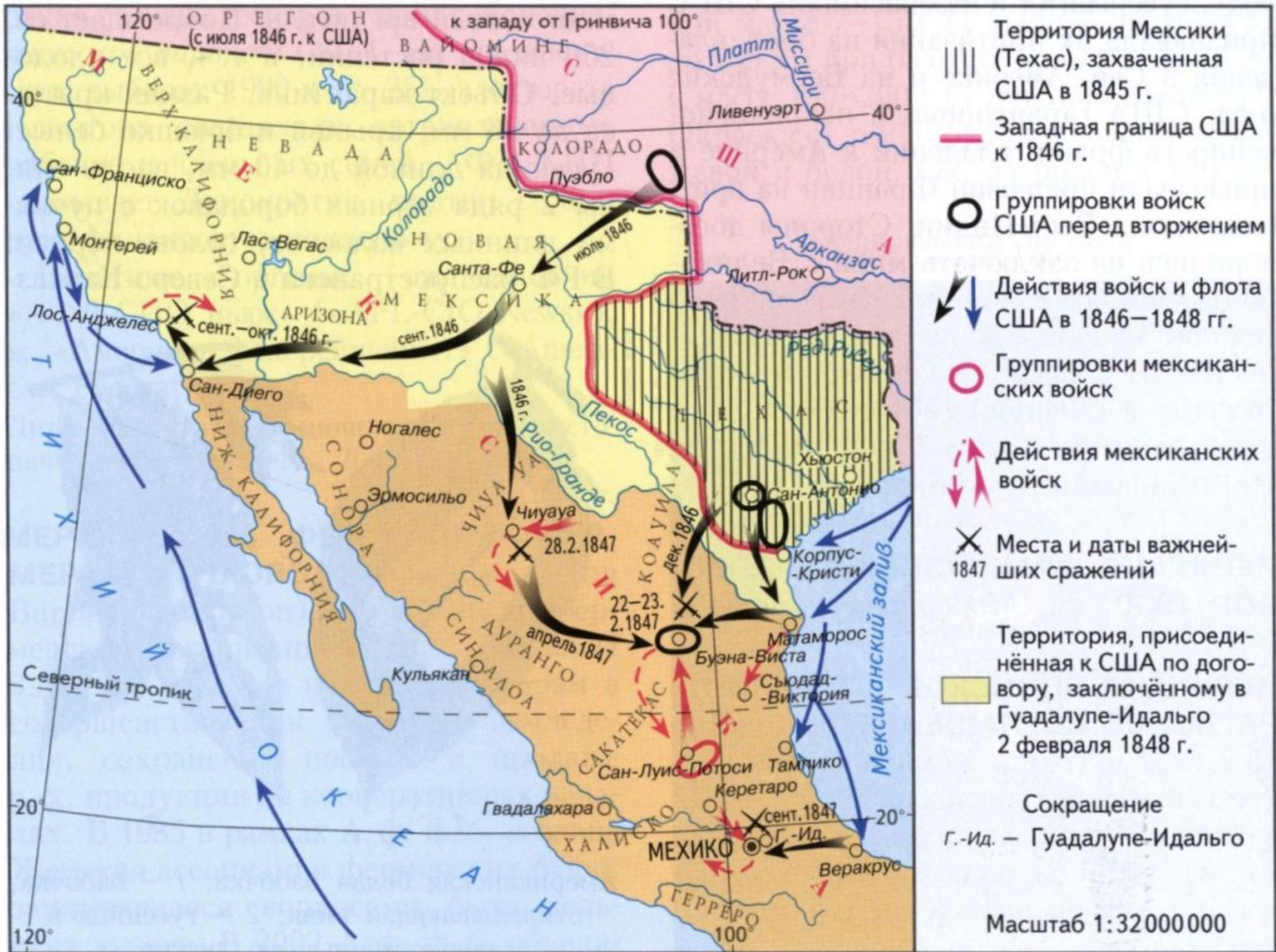


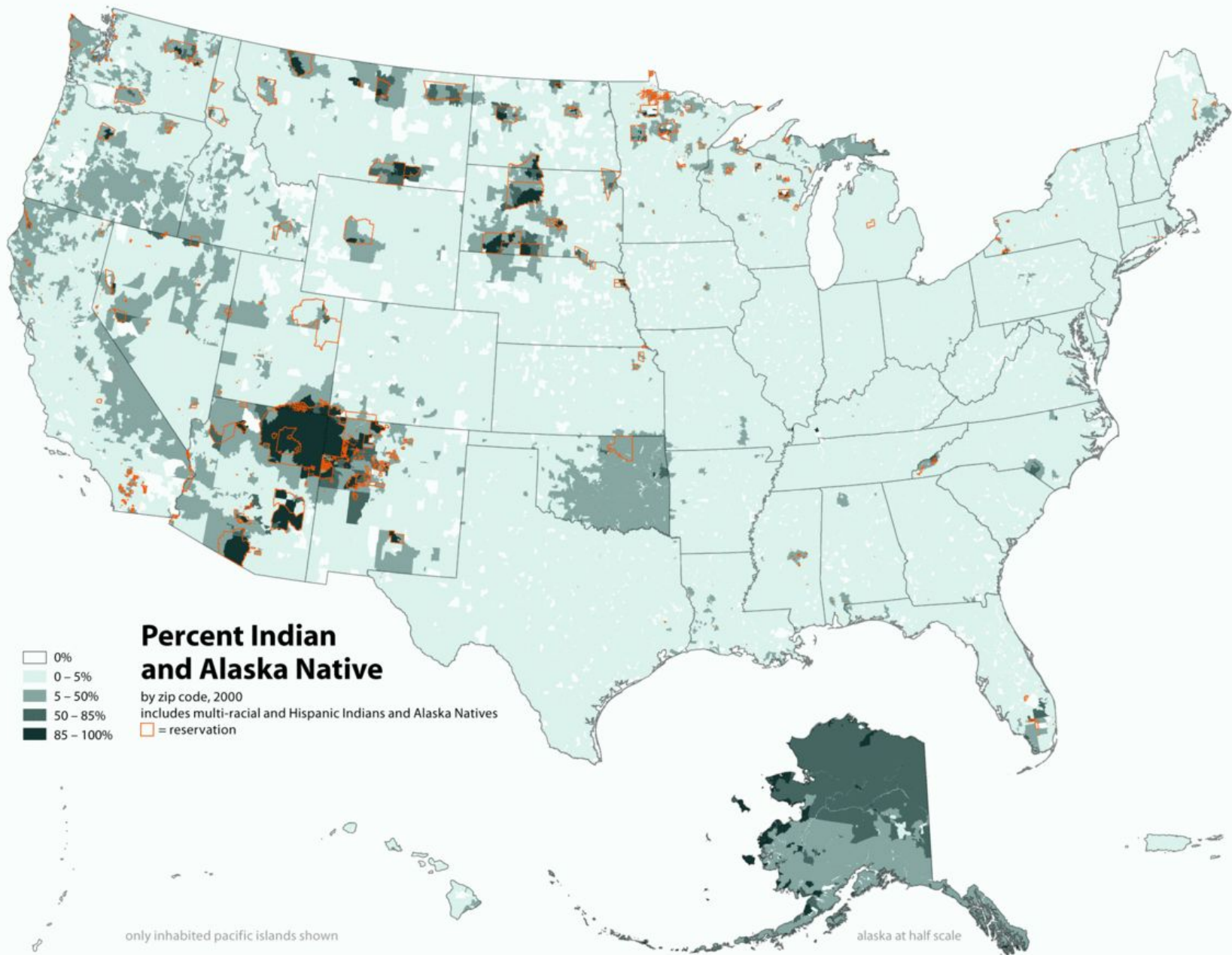

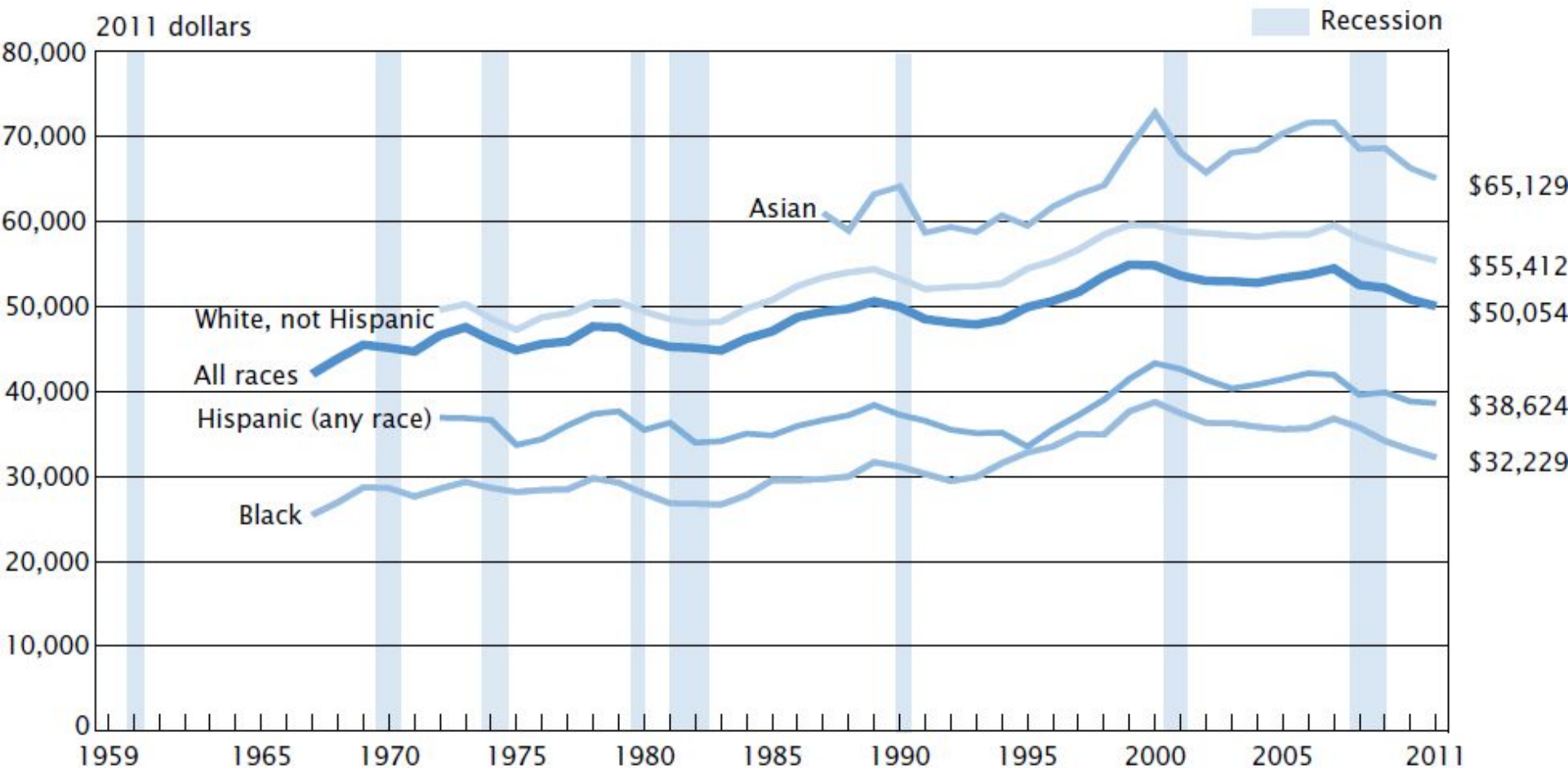

Real Median Household Income by Race and Hispanic Origin: 1967 to 2011



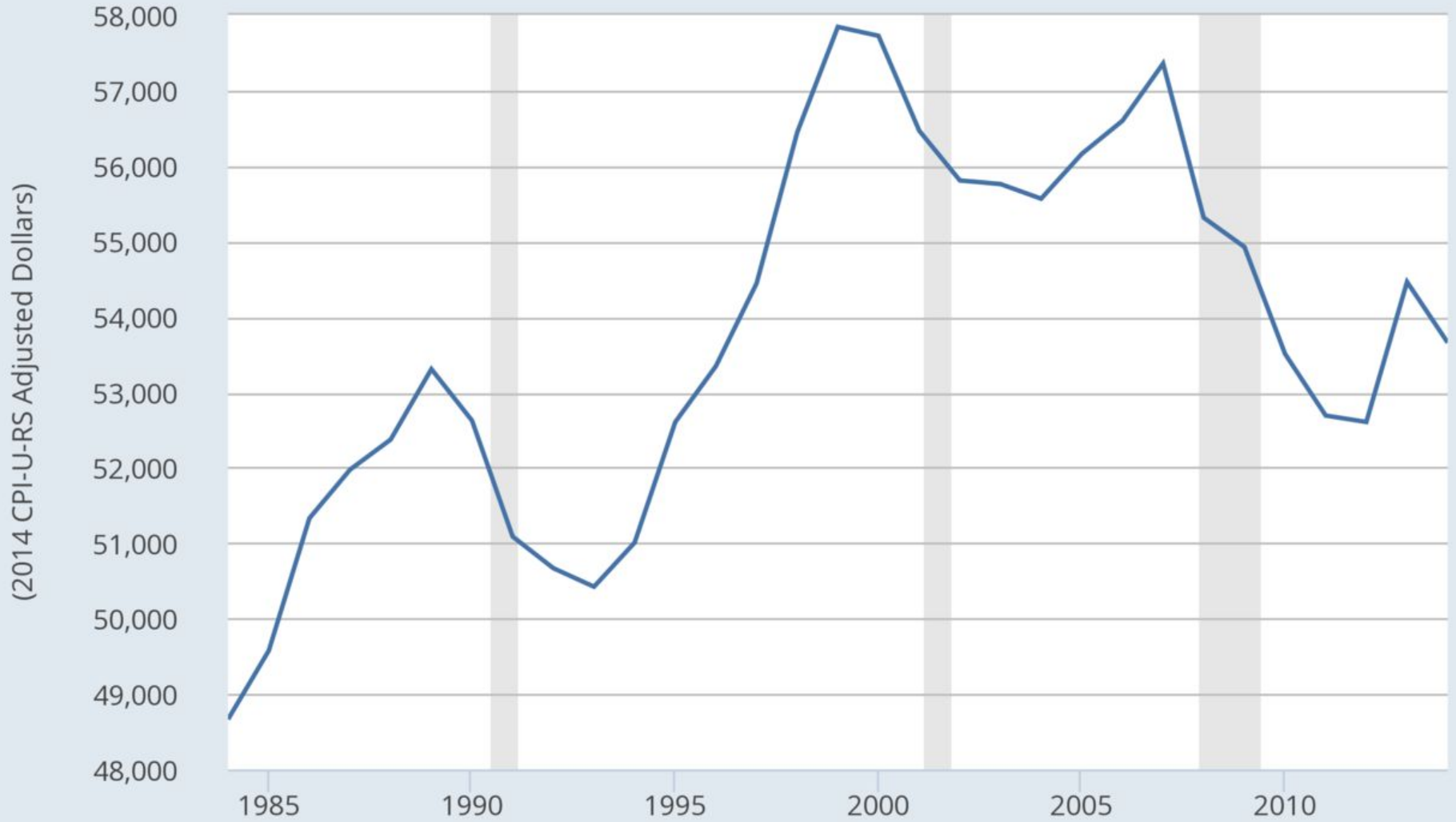

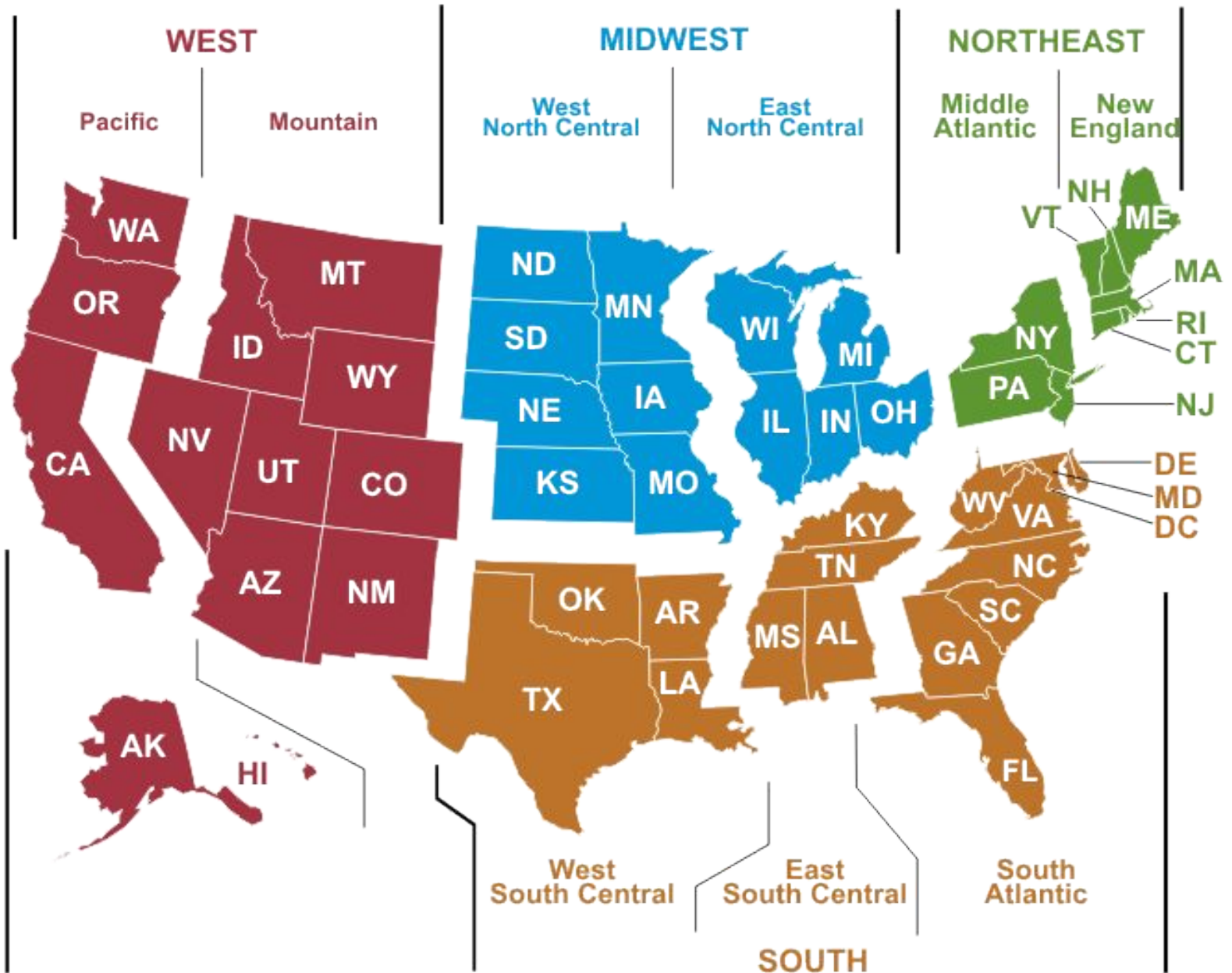

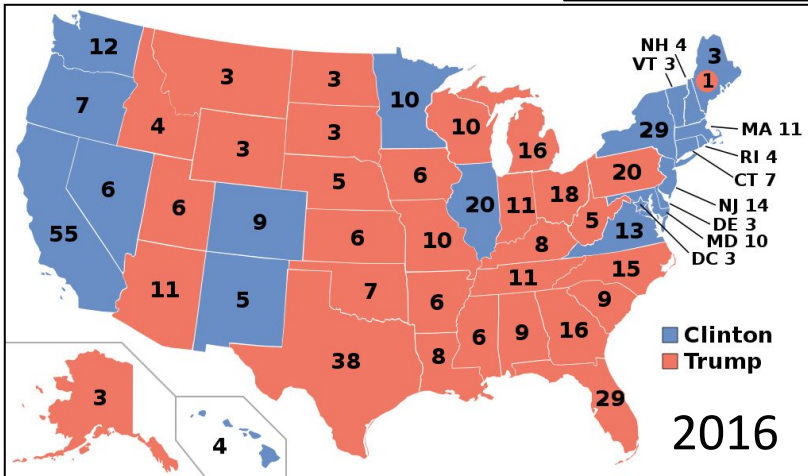
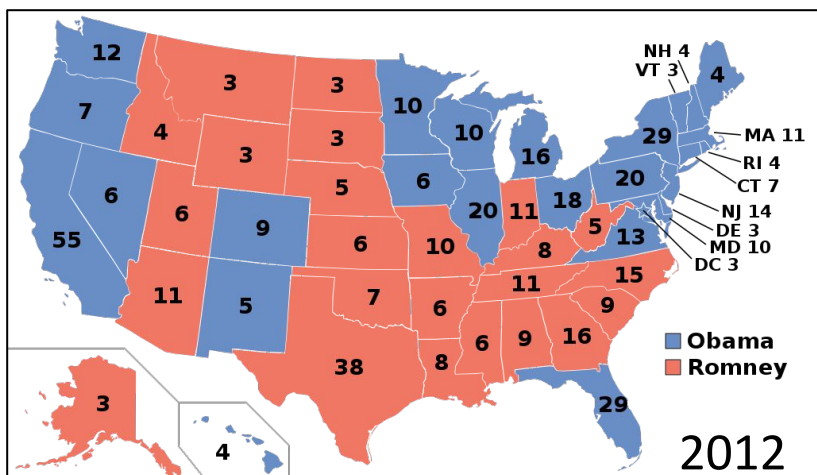
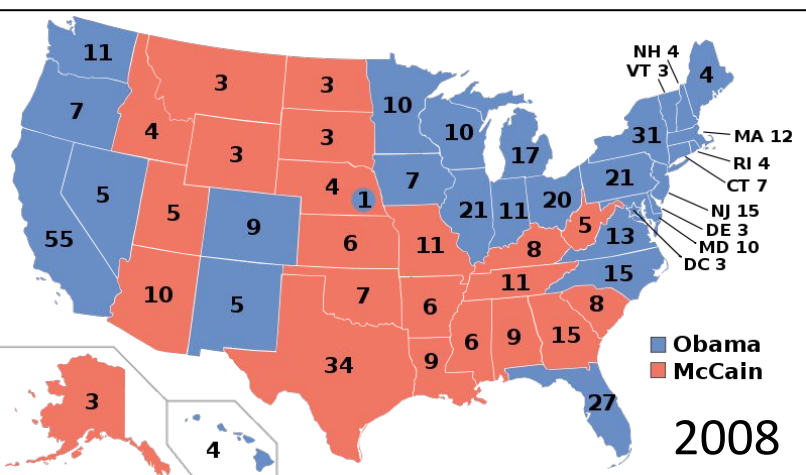
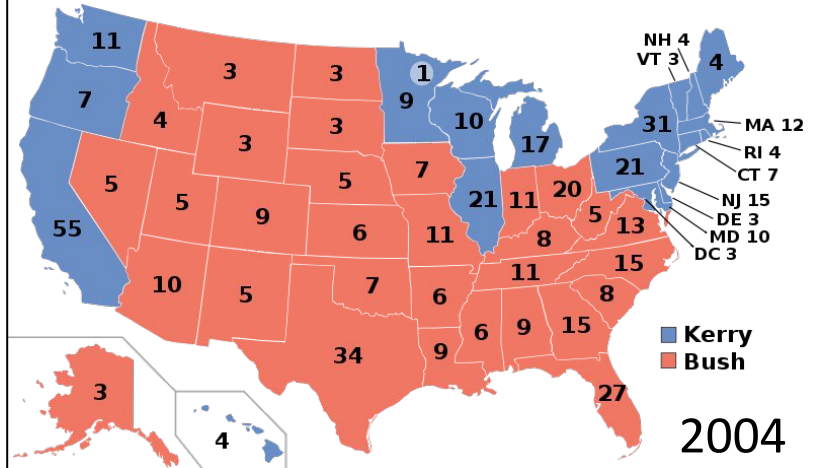
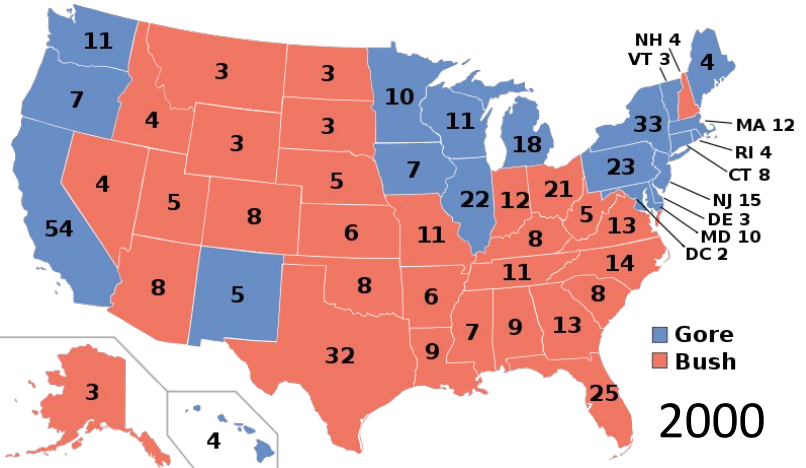
Share of Total U.S. Income, 1913-2014



— Real Median Household Income in the United States







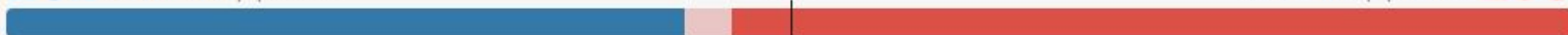

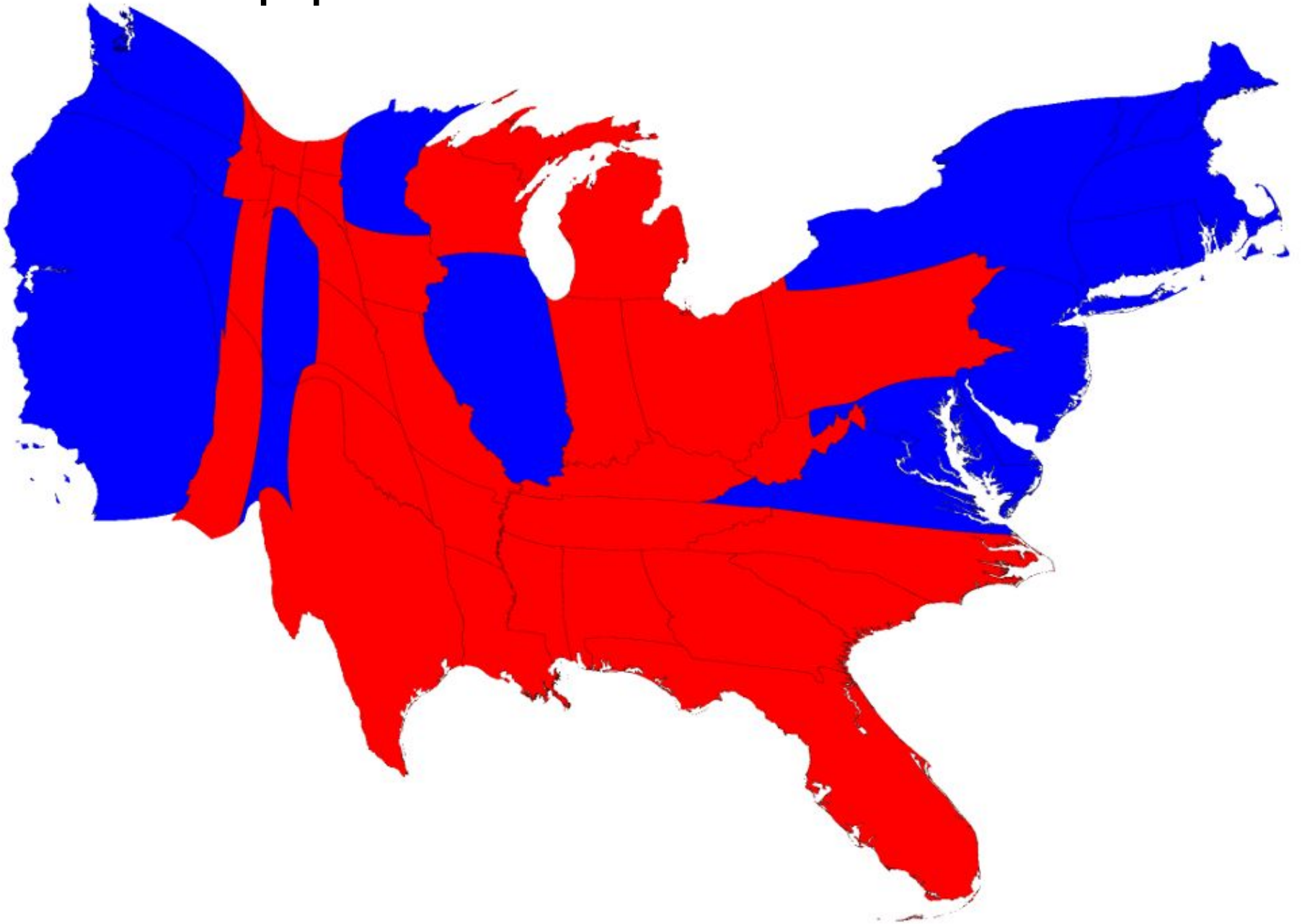

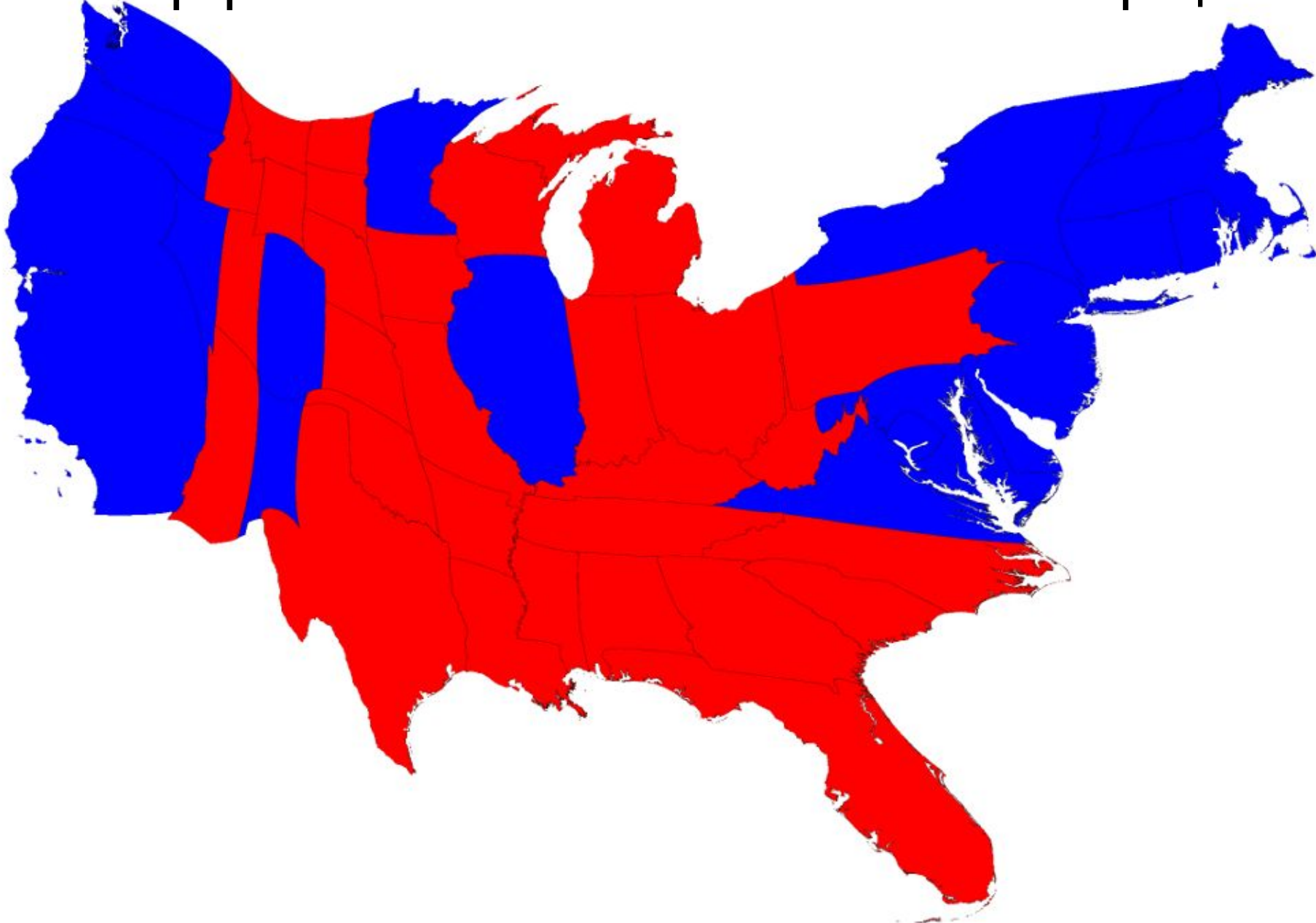

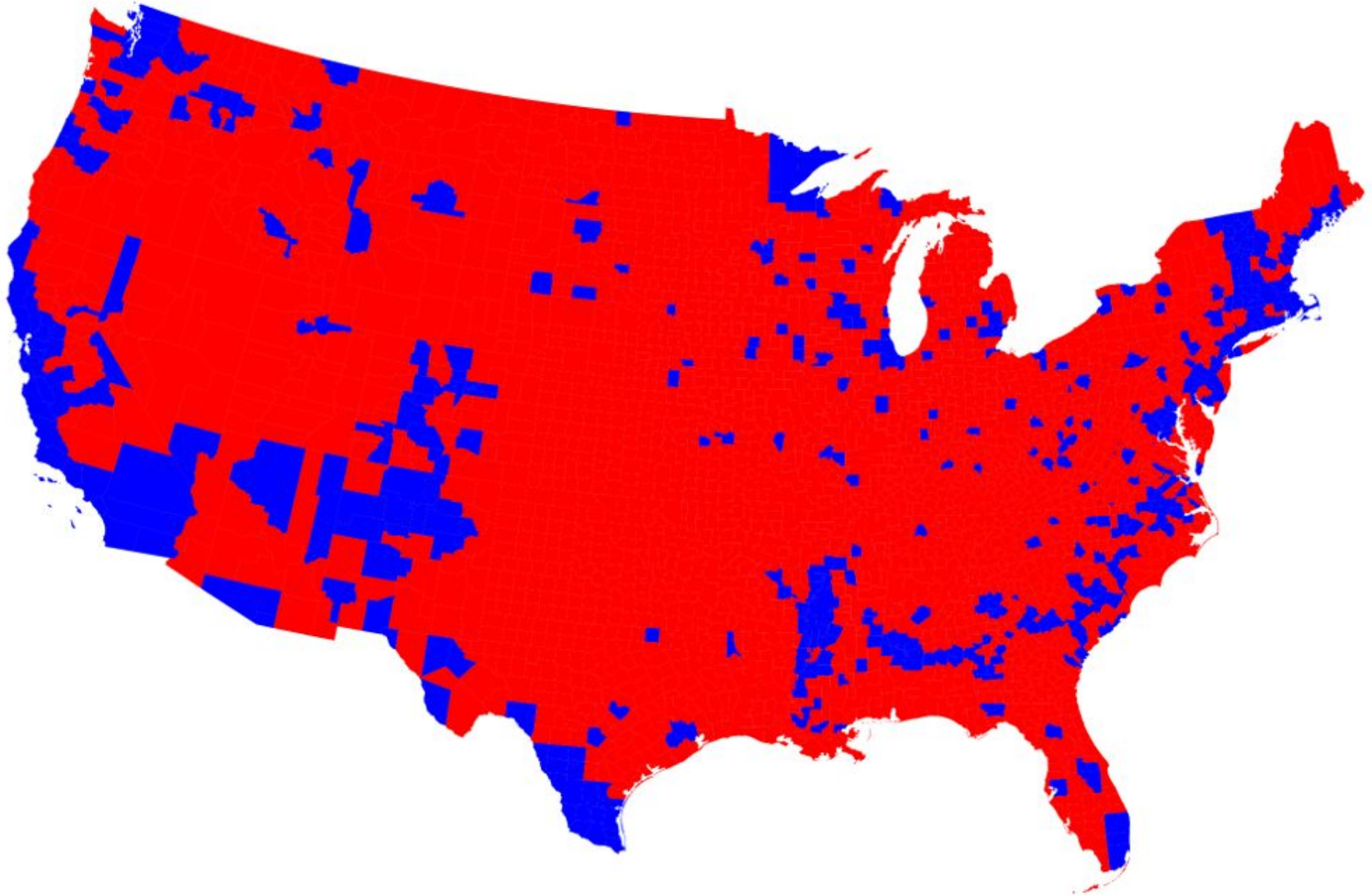

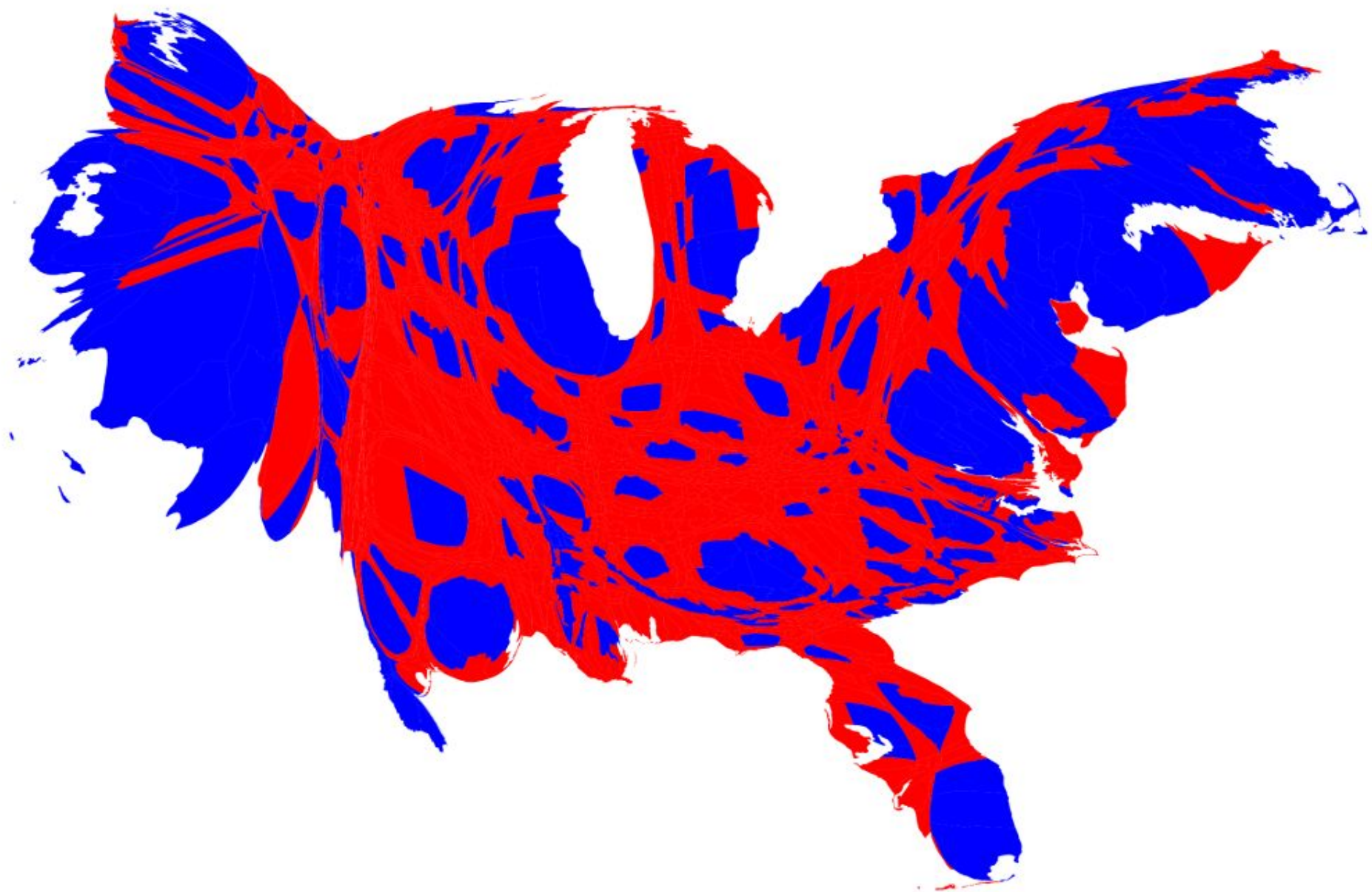


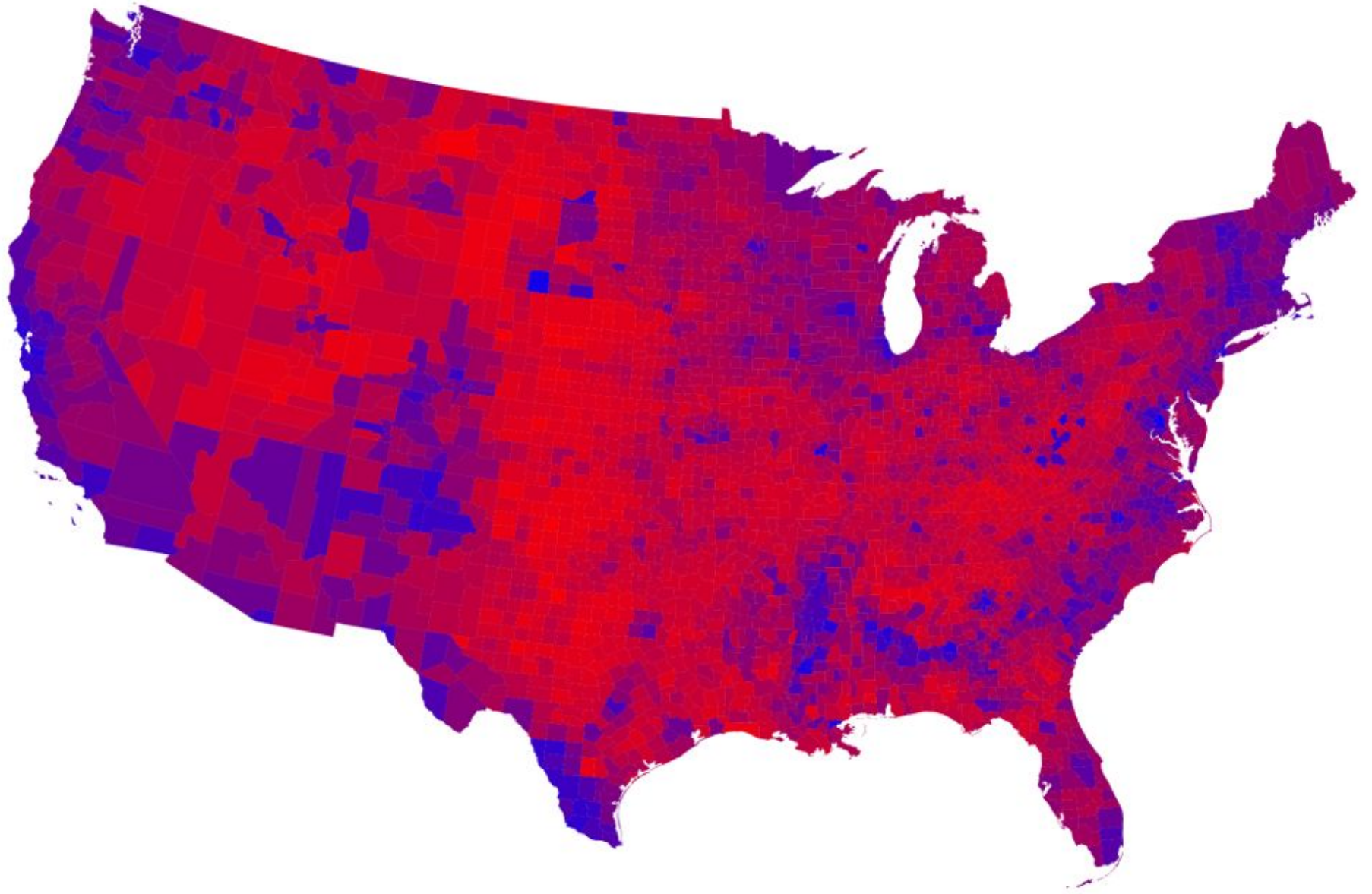
Анаморфоза по голосам коллегии выборщиков

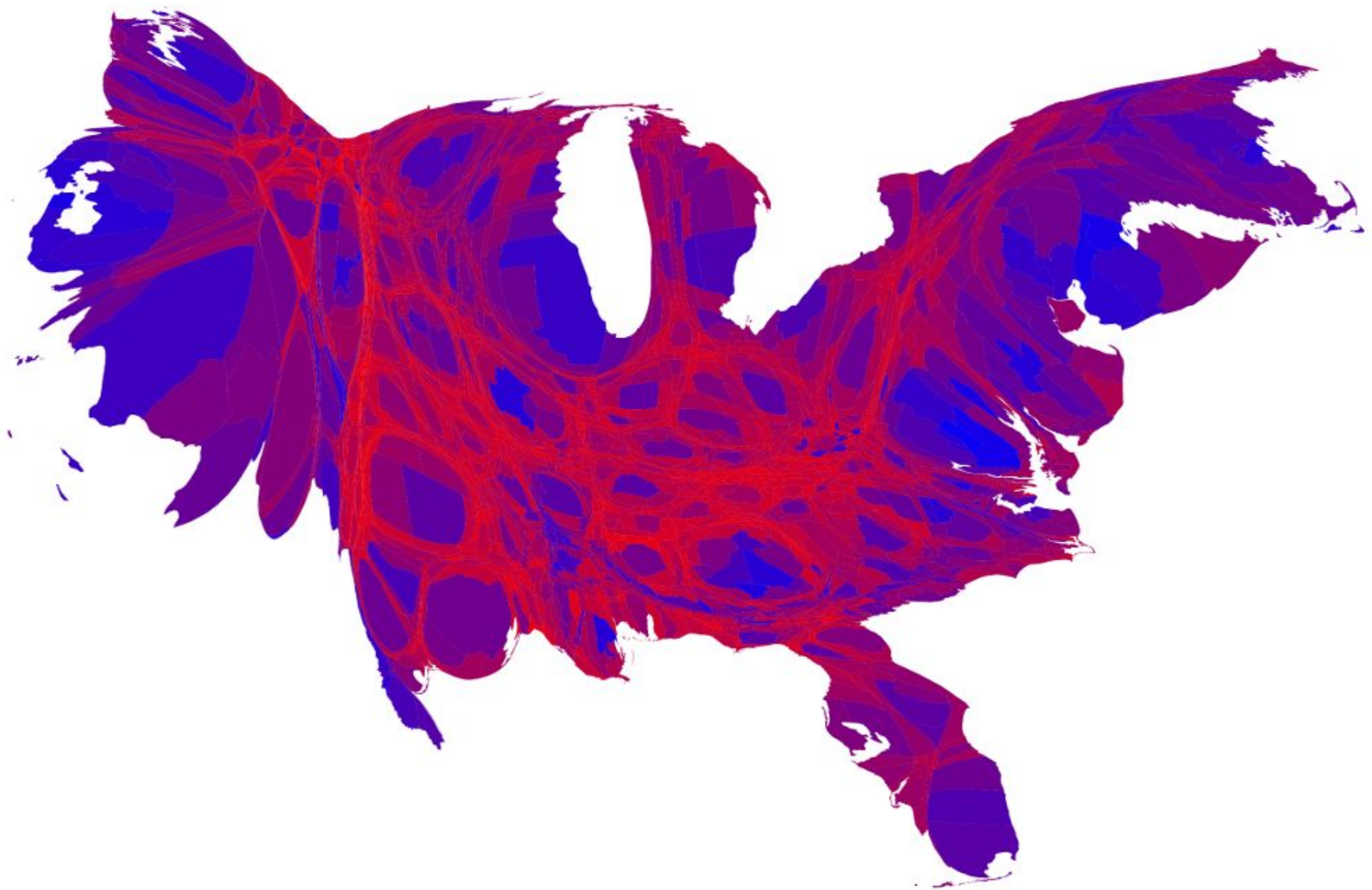


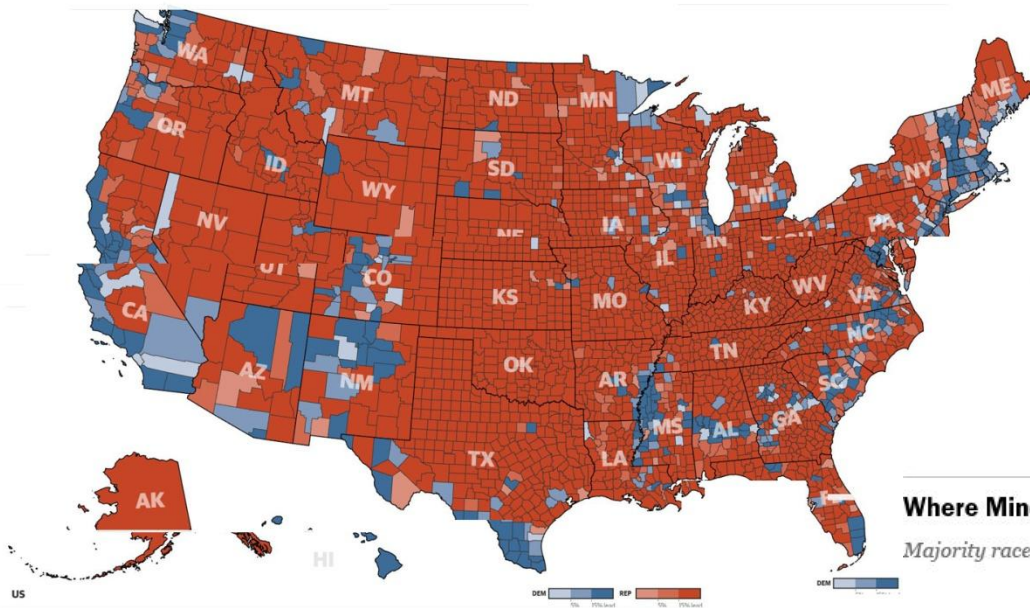
Траммп vs Клинтон: победители по графствам





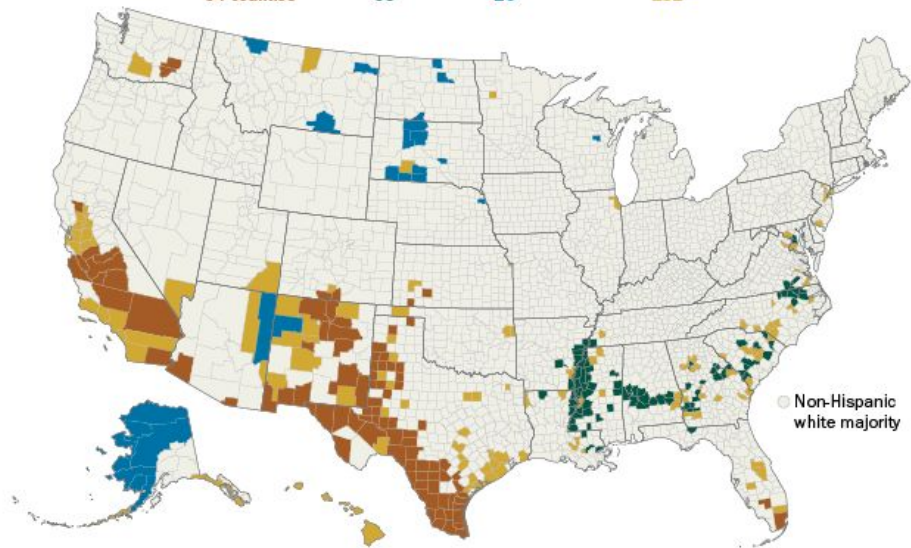






Where Minorities are the Majority
