1706 seventeen hundred and six (or 'seventeen oh six')

1900 nineteen hundred

There are two ways of saying years ending in "01" to "09" before 2000.

1901 nineteen oh one or nineteen hundred and one

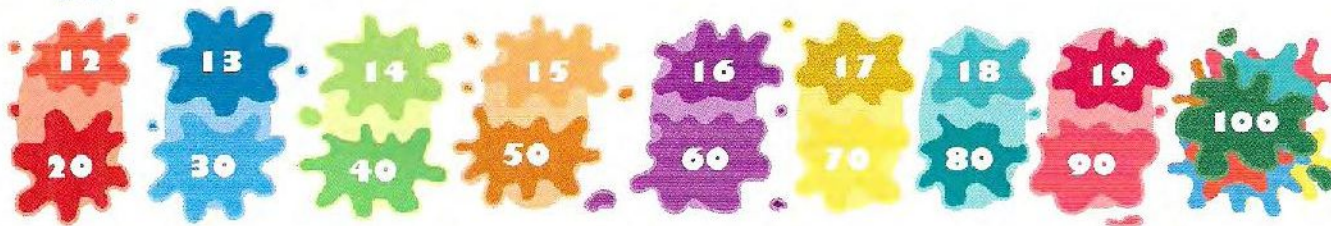
2000 two thousand

2010 would be twenty ten

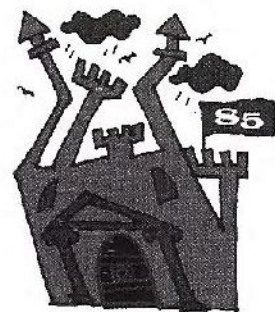
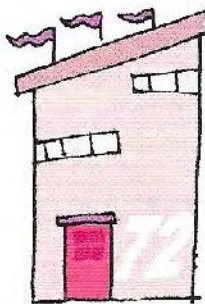
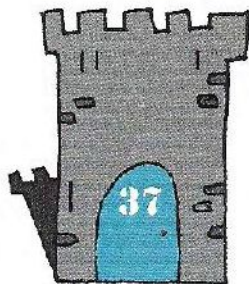
