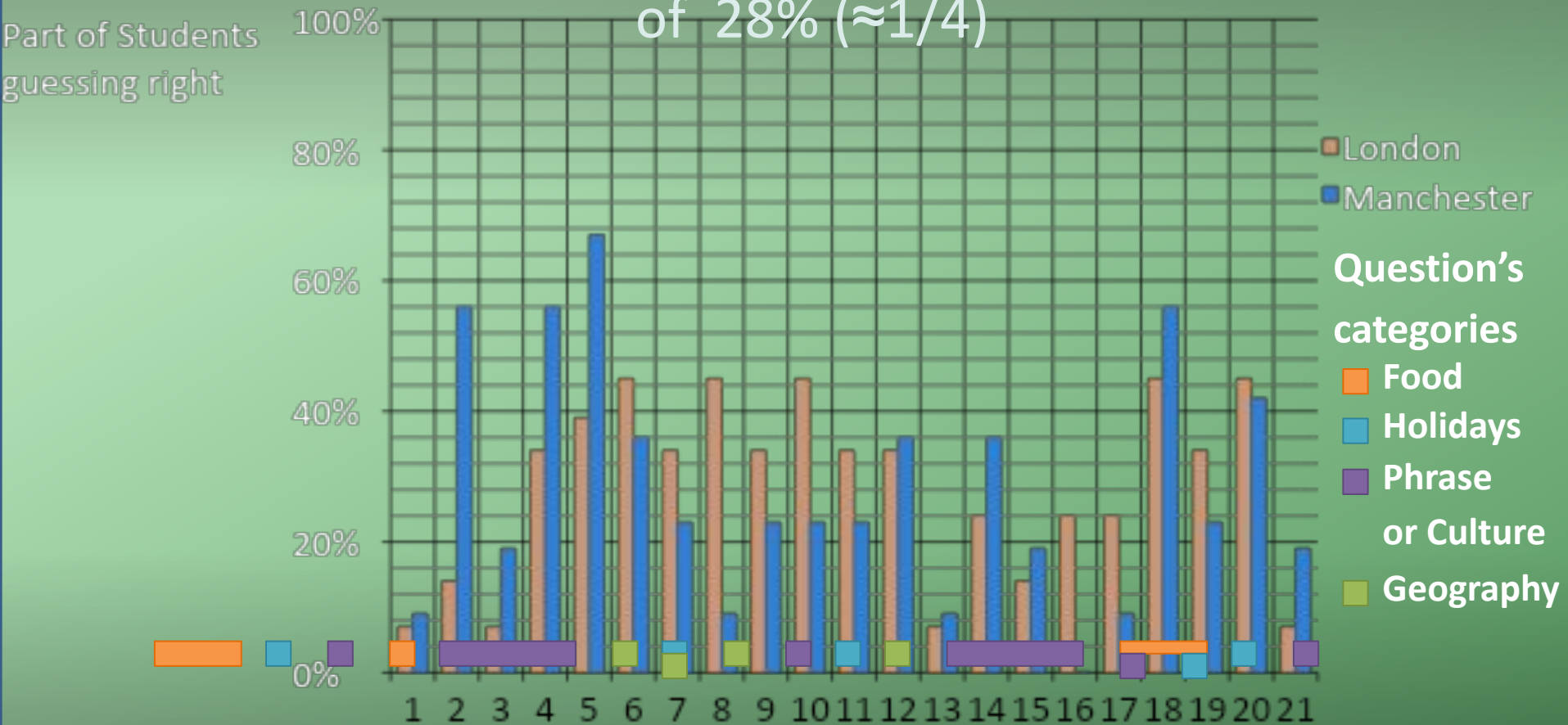
Last year's events

London and Manchester students who have been learning Russian language for a year visited our school last year.

We presented a quiz we made to our guests,
who were quite active at participating!

How well did they do?

London and Manchester students have a shared average of 28% ($\approx 1/4$)

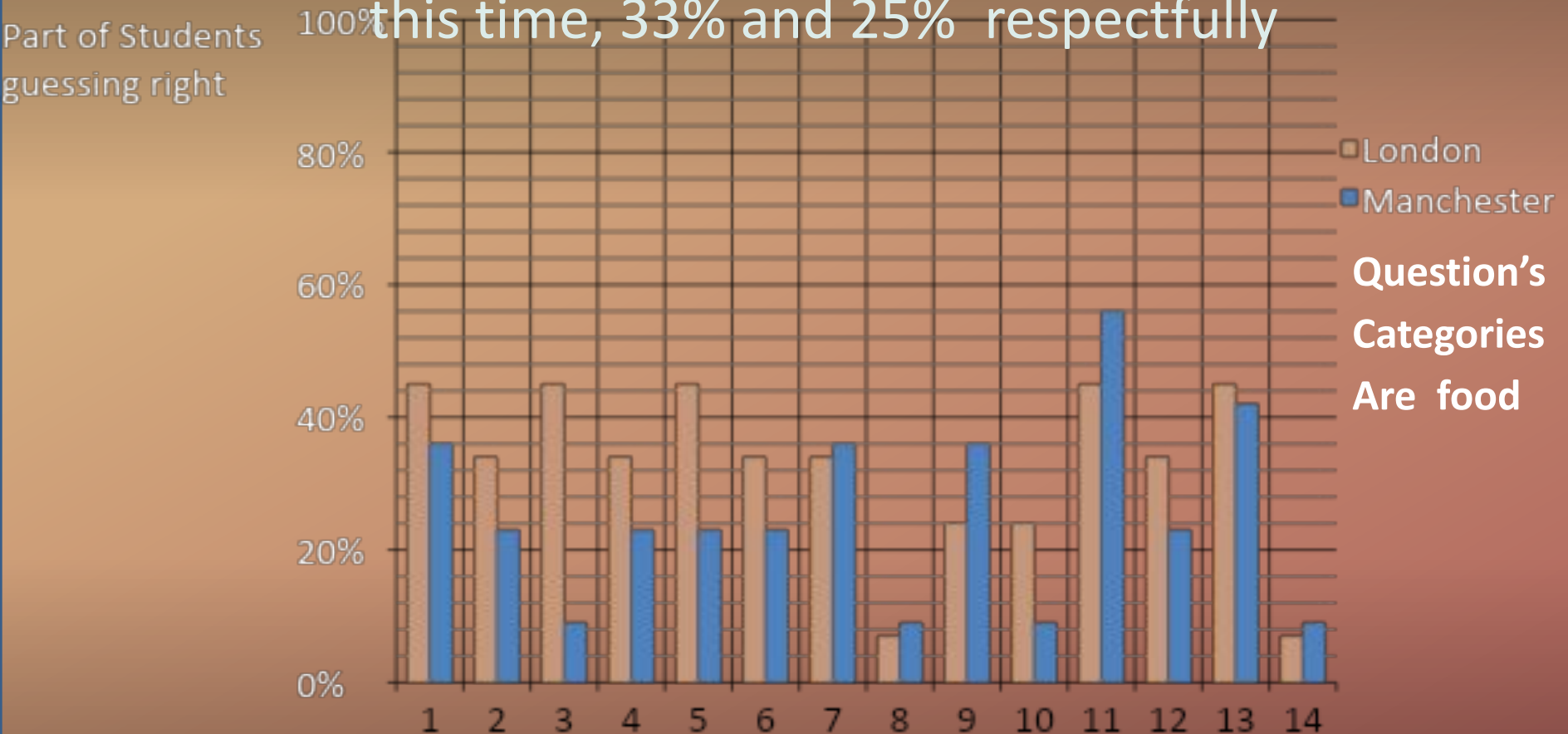


London got more consistency, mostly $\approx 34\%$

And Manchester is all over the place, having up to 67%, but having mostly $\approx 23\%$

And what about sweets?

London and Manchester students have a different average this time, 33% and 25% respectively
