

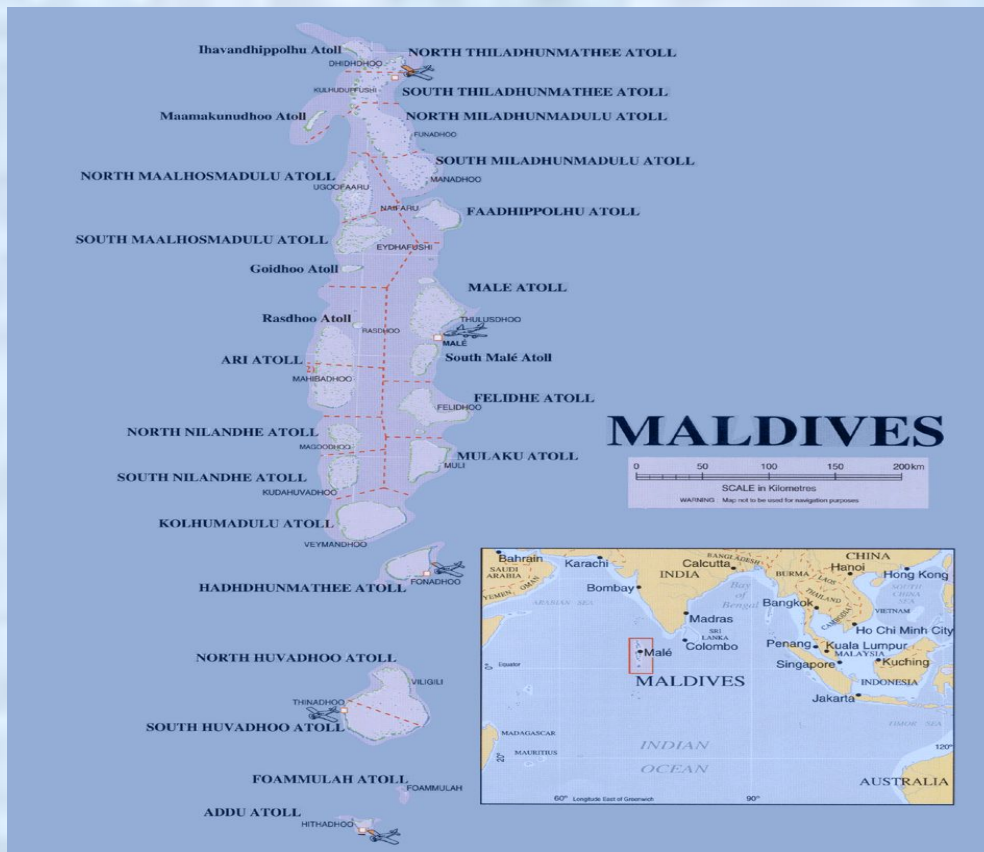

Blue Lagoon

The Blue Lagoon is a unique source, the most visited sights of Iceland. Warm waters of blue and azure shades are rich in minerals and have medicinal properties. The water temperature in the basin is + 37-40 ° C, even in cold winters it does not drop below.

In the distance, in clouds of white vapor, the station Svartsengi is viewed. It was there, at the station, drilled wells, through which natural boiling water and steam, from a depth of several hundred meters, rise to the surface of the earth and are used to generate electricity. Then the boiling water, which has given its energy, is mixed with cold water to a temperature of 37-39 degrees and merges into the natural bowl of the lava field, forming the Blue Lagoon.
