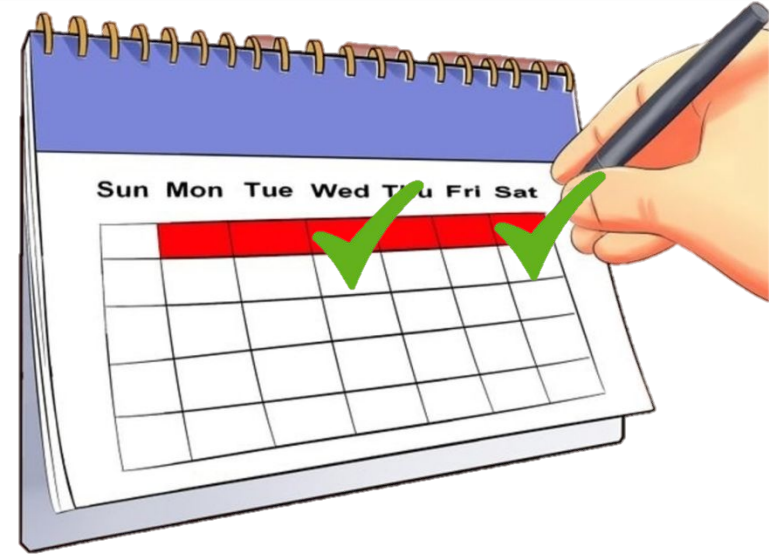

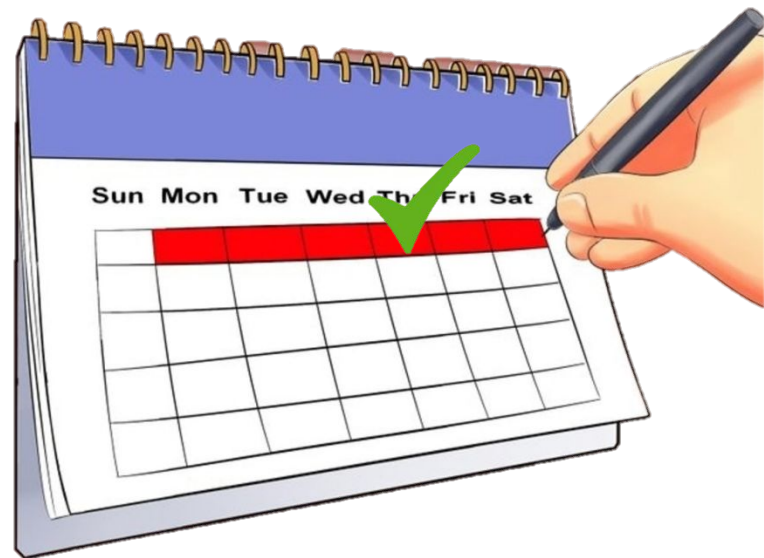

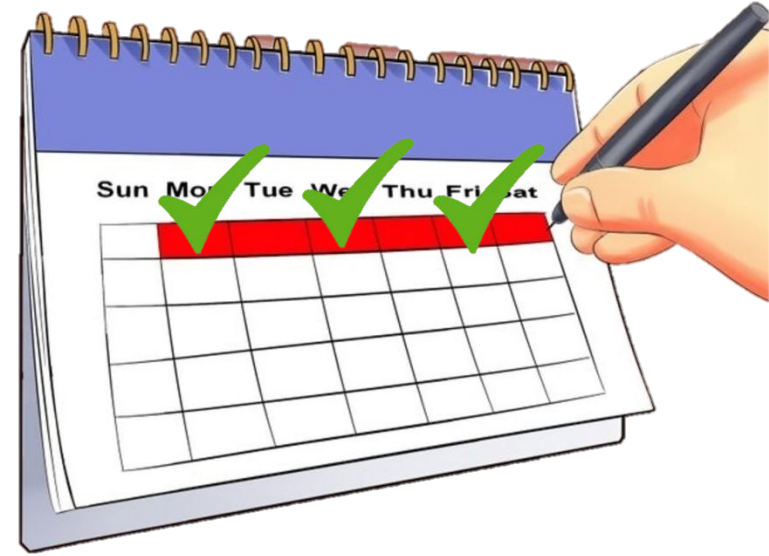


Tom and Lyn / study
