We use Present Continuous to talk about something that is happening at the moment of speaking/now.

We are having a lesson.

To form the Present Continuous, we use the verb 'to be' (Present tense)+verb with —ING ending.

I'm reading a book. He is swimming now.

PRESENT CONTINUOUS Present Continuous questions:

Are you reading a book? Is he swimming now?

NOTE: Answers can be contracted that way:

Yes, I am.

No, he isn't.


NEGATIVE Present Continuous SENTENCES

There are two ways of contracting a

negative sentence in Present Continuous:

He isn't swimming. He's not swimming.
