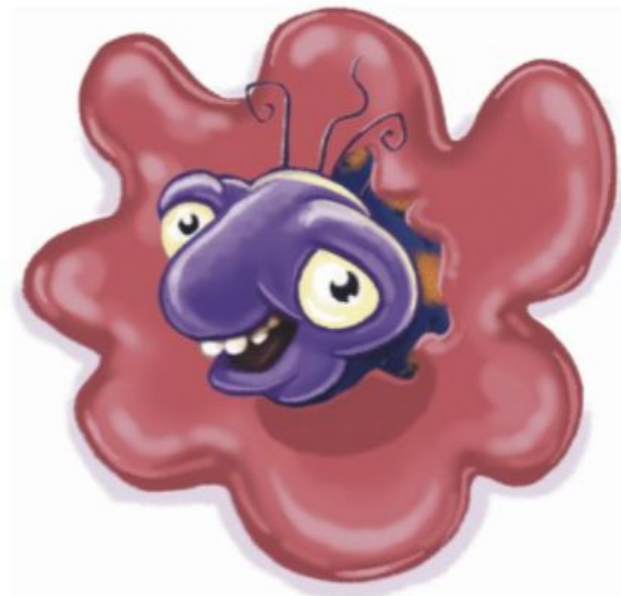

the net spun by a spider

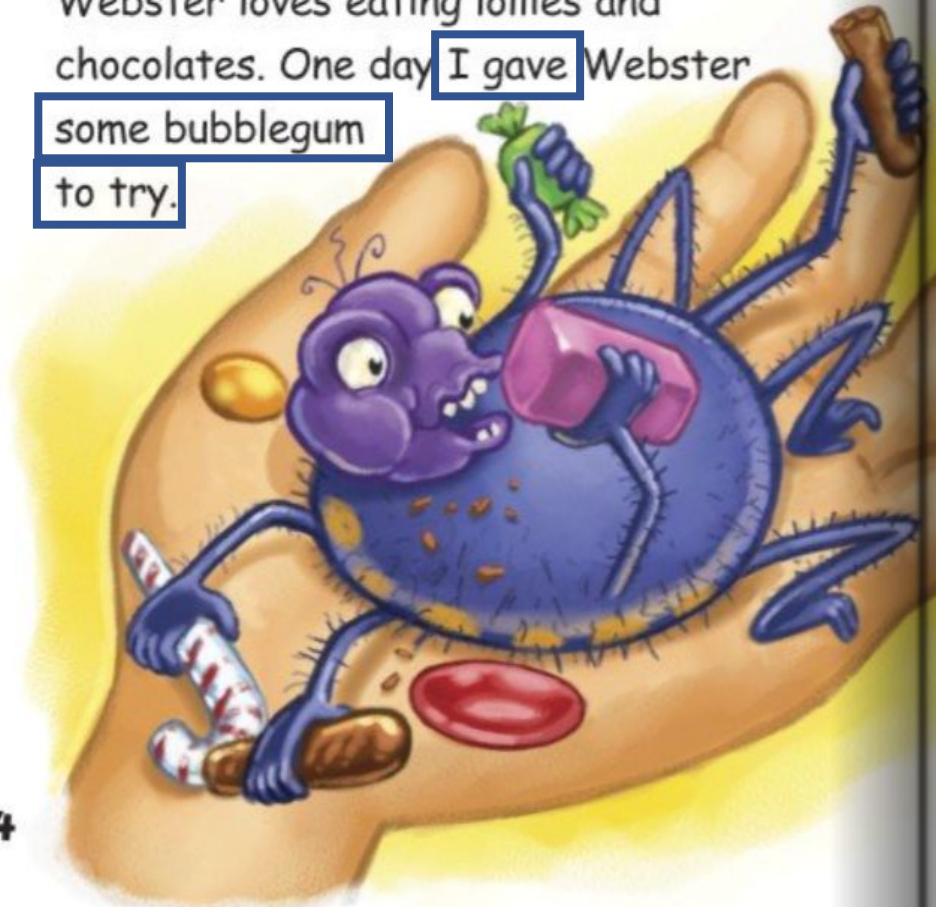


Webster and the Bubblegum

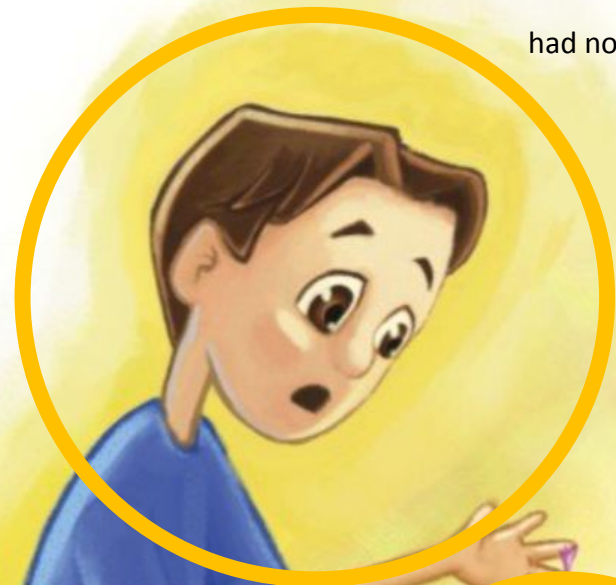
My pet spider's name is Webster. Webster loves eating lollies and chocolates. One day I gave Webster some bubblegum to try.



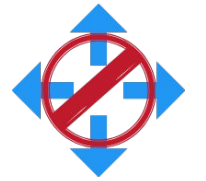

His legs got stuck together. He couldn't move. I didn't know what to do.



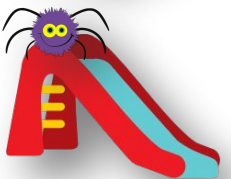

So I gave Webster a bath. I sat him on the soap and he slid into the water. He nearly drowned.

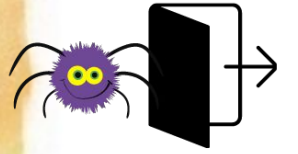




Then I used Mum's hair dryer.

anyone."

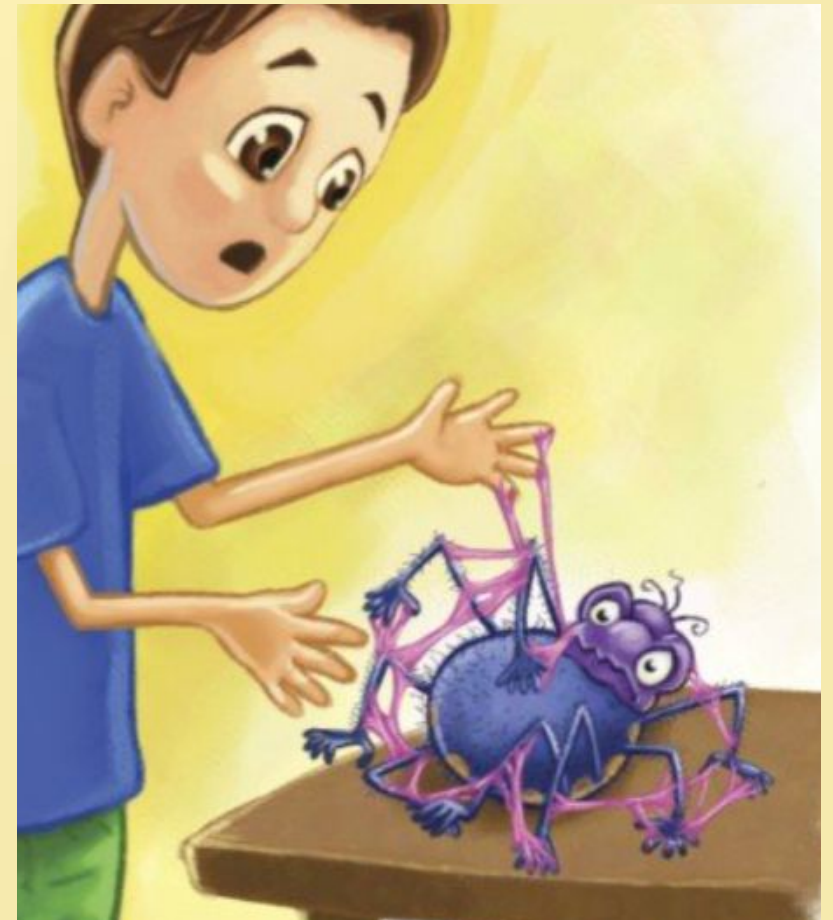
