EXAMPLE: "He's a pain in the neck."



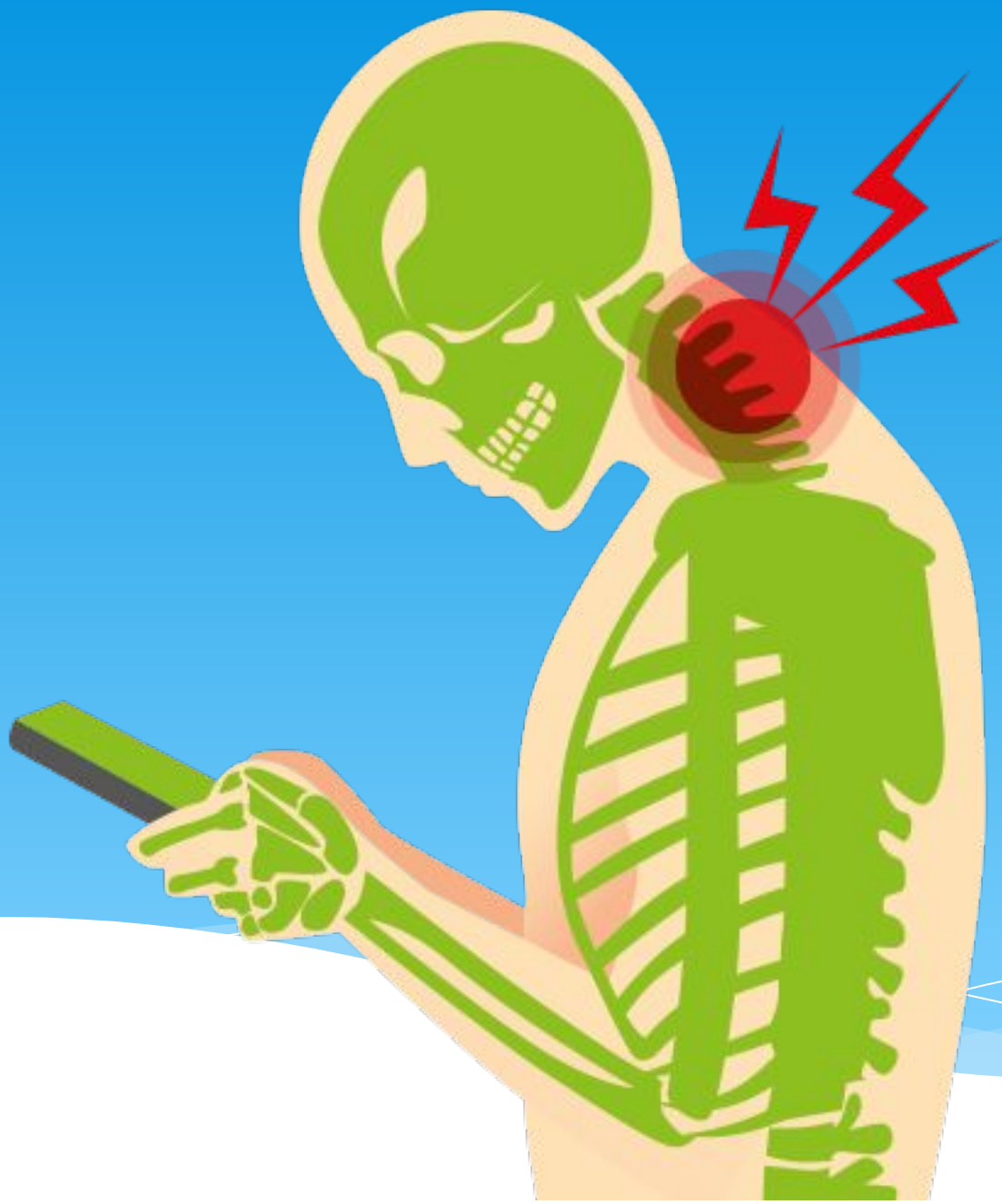

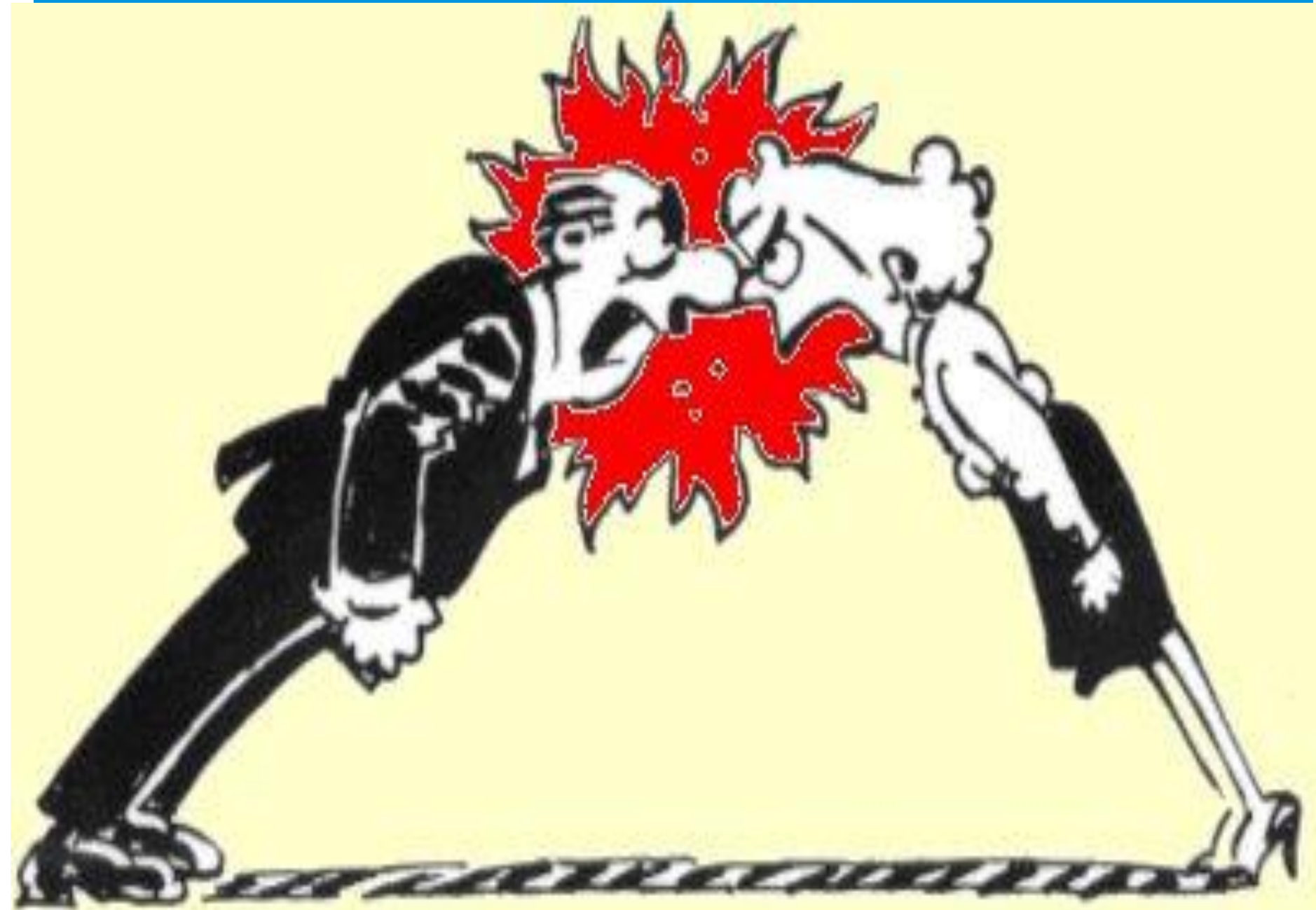
